I am not opposed the actual increase, I understand we have some of the lowest electric rates in the country and the increase is probably needed. My objection is to the structure of the proposed increase. And I am extremely frustrated that this proposal sounds so similar to the one they proposed a couple of years ago when I wrote to you and Mayor Armstrong who used to be on the PSC to express the same concerns. Why are residents being burdened with having to write again with the same concerns.

First, given the extreme challenges that our community is facing right now, particularly low-income individuals, the reconnection fee should not be raised. Second, if there is going to be an increase, it should be an increase in the per kWh used, not the fixed fees, and third, they should be making it more attractive for customers to install and/or buy solar.

I encourage the PSC to vote down this proposed rate change. LGE/KU could achieve the needed revenue increase by increasing the per kWh rate, allowing customers to pay more when they use more. This is more fair to low income individuals who can choose to use less electricity if they need to in order to manage their budget. Case No. 2020-00350 is a PSC rate case by LG&E that includes proposing changing solar energy credits from the current 1 to 1 net metering to a much lower and more complicated reimbursement rate. In addition, LG&E is asking for 12% increases in both the fixed monthly fee and the residential consumption rates.

• 1:1 Net Metering is simple and fair.

I am the owner of a roof-top solar array. The proposed Time of Use provision and reimbursement system are unfair and complicated. I think that the current 1:1 net metering should not be changed. 1 to 1 net metering is simple and fair and allows more people to afford solar arrays. The current 1:1 net metering is fair since excess power is sent to the grid during times of summertime peak demand when electricity is more expensive to produce. Treating residential solar like wholesale power generators is not fair. Power plants require costly transmission lines across long distances to get their power to LG&E, whereas LG&E incurs little to no cost when my excess solar power is used by my very nearby neighbor.

1:1 net metering helps foster solar installations. This is needed to reduce the health and severe climate change impacts of fossil fuel generated electricity.

LG&E is proposing a complicated and unfair solar reimbursement system because they want to maintain a monopoly on solar generation. Accepting their proposal would unfairly restrict customers from choices to better control their electricity costs and work to make electricity generation and distribution more efficient and less costly.

• The proposed rate increases are too high.

LG&E is proposing a 12% increase for the flat monthly fee, and consumption fee increase of 12% for residential and 17% for commercial customers. These proposed increases are too high. The proposed increase in the flat monthly fee is especially problematic since a customer would have less control over their energy costs. Customers would have less incentive to invest in energy efficiency improvements and to decrease energy usage.
