Dear whom it may concern,

I would like to be considered for reappointment to the Breathitt County Water District.

My background is as follows and a resume along with reference letters are attached.

I have been a member of the Breathitt County Water District for 14 years serving under and being reappointed by three administrations. While serving my terms, I have been Chairman for 10 years.

During the terms I've served, the water board has obtained over 45 million dollars in funding for water projects, laid nearly 300 miles of water lines, constructed 19 water storage tanks, 16 pump stations and made it possible for over 3300 homes to have access to county water service. Currently, the district has a 61% sign up rate or 2011 customers. When I became a board member, we had under a 48% sign up rate. As a board member, I along with other board members promoted the water service and provided education on why county water service was more feasible and safer that other water services in the area such as drilled wells. Currently, the district has approximately 300 miles of waterlines laid and has approximately 450 miles of county roads in the county road system.

33. Currently awaiting funding: KY Hwy. 542, Stray Branch, Fire Trail, Keck Lane, Johnson Fork, Puncheon Creek Road, Highland Road, Snake Branch, Bryants Creek,

Chester Bailey Road, Little Leatherwood Road, Cedar Rd. and Mill Creek Lawson Road. I have met with many officials and attended many meetings to obtain funding for water projects. Even though I am exempt from training under the KRS due to being a member since 2008, I have still attended training to stay up to date on subjects dealing with various water districts across the state. I also met with the Mayor of the Village of Buckhorn last year and an agreement was worked out to provide their area with water in case of emergency outages. I have a great working relationship with state and federal officials.

Since being on the board, all audits have had a great rating and our finances have always been in the black when it comes to monthly operating and maintenance balances. In fact, the district received a statewide award a few years ago at the Rural Water Conference.

The current board has also put together a great staff over the years.

As for attendance, I have attended ALL meetings since being on the board 12 years with the exception of three in which I was recuperating from surgery due to cancer and kidney stones and once with COVID.

I would also ask to be reappointed to the board for another term. We currently have applications in for funding totaling over \$6.5 million dollars with \$4 million already approved and I will continue to work hard along with other board members to make those projects a reality.

I realize that the PCS wants the district to have a depreciation fund and the board did have a rate study completed in 2021 and the PSC has asked for a new study to be done in which RCAP is working on at this time. Once the rate study is completed, the board will act accordingly.

I also realize that the catastrophic flooding in our county damaged much of the infrastructure and during this time, I have seen other county water district staff members and even water board members in Breathitt County including myself out in the creeks tapping broken service lines, reconnecting lines and rebuilding lines. It makes me proud to see everyone working as a team to accomplish helping people.
