ELECTRONIC APPLICATION OF WOOD CREEKCASE NO.WATER DISTRICT FOR A RATE ADJUSTMENT2021-00427PURSUANT TO 807 KAR 5:076)

<u>O R D E R</u>

On November 30, 2021, Wood Creek Water District (Wood Creek District) filed a motion requesting deviation from Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:076, Section 2(1), to permit its filing of an application for an alternative rate adjustment (ARF) using the procedure set forth in 807 KAR 5:076 that is available to small utilities. The ARF is available to small utilities that had gross annual revenue in the immediate past calendar year of \$5,000,000 or less.¹ Wood Creek District states as a basis for its motion that although the district had operating revenue in excess of \$5,000,000, the expense of a general rate adjustment filing would be excessive, and it is in fact a "small" utility within the meaning of the regulation. Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:076, Section 17, provides that upon a showing of good cause, the Commission may permit deviations from the requirements of 807 KAR 5:076.

Based upon the motion and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds Wood Creek District has not established good cause to grant the motion for a deviation of the requirement set forth in 807 KAR 5:076, Section 2(1), that a utility have "an annual gross revenue in the immediate past calendar year of \$5,000,000.00 or less."

The Commission has granted deviations of this nature in the past.² However, each request must be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. The Commission does not appear to have granted a deviation from the requirement in 807 KAR 5:076, Section 2(1), since the regulation was amended in 2011 from a "\$300,000 or less" threshold to "\$5,000,000 or less" threshold. The regulation was amended from "\$200,000 or less" to "\$300,000 or "\$300,000

Several of the utilities granted deviations by the Commission were operating at a loss although the revenue itself exceeded the regulation threshold. Black Mountain District operated mainly using grant money and had expenses exceeding revenue almost every year of its existence prior to the rate case in 2004.⁴ In 2002, Black Mountain District had a net loss of \$172,920.⁵ The Garrison-Quincy-Ky-O-Heights District also operated at

a loss, having had a revenue of \$328,855,⁶ exceeding the regulation threshold at the time, but the utility had expenses of \$379,176 that same year.⁷

The timing of the rate filing in relation to the timing of the effective date of proposed amendments to the regulation is also relevant to consider. Bluegrass Gas Sales would not have needed a deviation had the amendment to 807 KAR 5:076, Section 2, which became effective November 4, 2011, had been in effect at the time of their filing on September 26, 2011.⁸ Valley Gas, Inc. (Valley Gas) has had an extensive history with deviations from the requirement of 807 KAR 5:076 Section 2(1). In 1992⁹ and 1995,¹⁰ Valley Gas requested deviations because its amount of revenue was over \$200,000. The Commission granted those requests, but on January 3, 1996, amendments to 807 KAR 5:076, Section 2, went into effect¹¹ and under those changes Valley Gas would not have needed a deviation in neither 1992 nor 1995. In 2006, the Commission ordered that Valley Gas did not require a deviation even though it had asked for one.¹² This is because

even though Valley Gas had customers in excess of 500 and gross annual revenue in excess of \$300,000 at the end of its test year, by the time it filed its application its number of customers had decreased to 492. By 2011, Valley Gas had reduced so much in size that the utility did not and has not needed a deviation again.¹³

Ledbetter Water District was granted a deviation of 1 percent over the threshold in 2003. Kentucky American Water received a deviation with regard to its sewer service rates but withdrew the Notice to File an Application.¹⁴ The Hendron Water District asked for a deviation of 807 KAR 5:006 Section 14, not of 807 KAR 5:076.¹⁵ The East Knox County Water District was granted a deviation but it withdrew its application.¹⁶

Good cause is shown by explaining sufficient reason for the Commission to make an exception for the utility. In this case, the utility is not operating at a loss. The utility is almost a million dollars over the threshold set out in the regulation. The utility has multiple employees¹⁷ and shares the employees with two other districts.¹⁸ The statistics provided in the motion for deviation raise a question of whether wholesale and retail purchasers are being charged a fair amount for water. In 2011, Wood Creek District filed for a general

rate adjustment when the revenue and customer base exceeded the regulation threshold.¹⁹ In 2015, the Wood Creek District filed an ARF with total operating revenue of \$4,980,440,²⁰ a mere \$19,560.00 away from the threshold and water revenue of \$4,826,293, \$173,707 shy of the threshold.²¹ Wood Creek District offered no evidence of good cause for a deviation. Wood Creek District has filed a general rate case in the past, and it has been on notice since 2015, that absent a change in the regulation, it would be required to do so again. Wood Creek District chose to prepare an ARF filing in lieu of a general rate case in response to the Commission's Order in Case No. 2020-00352.

However, *sua sponte*, the Commission finds that there is good cause to extend the deadline set out in Case No. 2020-00352²² for the utility to file a rate case. A general rate case requires more information, a cost of service study, preparation, and as a result, the utility will need more time.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The Wood Creek District motion seeking a deviation from the requirements set forth in 807 KAR 5:076 Section 2(1) is denied.

2. Based on the rejection of the filing for failure to meet the regulatory requirements set out in 807 KAR 5:076, the Commission extends the deadline set out in Case No. 2020-00352 to allow Wood Creek District to file a general rate adjustment

pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 16. Wood Creek District shall file an application for a general rate adjustment within six months of the date of this Order.

3. Wood Creek District shall include a Cost of Service Study with its rate adjustment filing.

4. This case shall be closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
