## **INTRA-AGENCY MEMORANDUM**

### **KENTUCKY PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION**

**RE:** Informal Conference of September 11, 2025

Pursuant to an Order issued on September 2, 2025, an informal conference was conducted on September 11, 2025. Attached is a copy of the attendance roster.

The purpose of the informal conference was to discuss various topics, which were set out in an agenda attached to the September 2 Order for the IC.

The first topic discussed was eligible customer lists. Columbia Kentucky stated that no states provide email addresses as part of the lists of customers provided to marketers, and that they have no plans to provide them. XOOM expressed that Kentucky is a hard market to be in with the prospect of program termination, but would love to see the market improved.

The next topic discussed was contract portability. Columbia Kentucky explained when a customer moves or transfers the account number changes, which is why the contract is not automatically transferred. Columbia Kentucky stated there was no way to connect the two through the billing software, and to do so would require new engineering and programming, which Columbia Kentucky does not plan to do. Columbia Kentucky stated a customer who transferred could request for the contract to be entered at the new service address, but there may be a delay in enrollment.

The third topic related to autopay. Columbia Kentucky stated there around 54,278 customers on autopay of which 4,000 participate in CHOICE. Columbia Kentucky stated that customers receive the same bill which has information on the CHOICE programs. Columbia Kentucky stated that the information is on its website and home pages. XOOM expressed that it would like to see marketing more developed on the Columbia Kentucky website.

The next topic was updates on Cost-Tracking, with Columbia Kentucky providing similar updates as in the last IC. Fees and cost structures of different jurisdictions were discussed, with Columbia Kentucky stating that there is no well-known structure as it varies by jurisdiction. Columbia Kentucky provided a brief overview of its 2025 Annual Report. Potential topics for the next IC were also discussed.

There being no further discussion, the informal conference was then adjourned.
