I am a concerned neighbor of the proposed solar project in Harrison Co. I would like to ask that this matter is taken into consideration in a very objective manner. I do not feel that our local board listened to the concerns of the citizens. Yes, a meeting was held and landowners were given an opportunity to voice their concerns, however it didn't take but 15 minutes or so for the local board to say that they agreed with the Blue Moon project. I don't disagree with these types of projects, however I do feel there is a place tucked away in parts of the county that would not effect the beauty of the farm lands. I live in a subdivision that adjoins the land and we have 15 or so homes that will have to look at this monstrosity for the rest of our lives. I just retired and built a beautiful sunroom to enjoy the scenery for the remainder of my life and my neighbors purchased and built homes to enjoy the country life. Not only will we have to look at panels but I am certain my property value will go down. I would never purchase a home next to a solar farm and no matter how many times these solar companies tell me my value will not decrease, they are lying.

I feel, as do many of my neighbors, that this has been handled pretty much under the table. If it were such a money making project for our county I feel it would be making headlines every week saying what an awesome project is coming to our community. The only way we were informed was a letter from the solar company (and the only ones to receive the letter is if you backed up to the property. If you were across the street and would still see the monstrosity you were not included for that mailing). I do not think our county will get rich from the project or help to make Harrison Co a better place to live.

I would like to ask that you come visit this area and see if you would like to live next door to a solar project. I extend the invitation, but I have very little confidence that anyone will visit. Solar Projects may be a very good thing for our world, but please make restrictions where folks do not have to walk out everyday and watch the sunrise over solar panels. My neighbors and I get to watch geese fly over and land on the pond, see cattle on the hill side and birds of kinds enjoy this habitat and it is being taken away if this project is approved.

I have attached my view with cattle grazing on the land and another showing panels, tell me what you would prefer? It is also very depressing that I have worked all my life, purchased my forever home, and the value will decrease. I am not alone in my concerns nor do I not have empathy for the farmers. However if they don't want to farm the land, I suggest they sell the property and let other farmers work the land and produce food for our county. Their children and grandchildren will not return to this property in 40 years to start farming .

I would appreciate an update and any information that would help with my concerns about this solar project.
