We moved into Persimmon Ridge in Shelby Co back in 2021 and the monthly sewer rate was a little over \$35. It was recently increased to a little over \$85 dollars in 2022. We just received a letter from the company proposing to raise the rate to \$99 per month.

Bluegrass Water originally stated that they were making improvement to the systems. To my knowledge, our system here in Persimmon Ridge is the exact same as is was back when we were paying \$35 per month, still the same as it was when we have been paying \$85 per month.
