ORDER

On January 19, 2022, Louisville Gas & Electric Company (LG&E) filed its application with the Commission seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) to authorize it to bid on a franchise offered by the city of Vine Grove, Kentucky, for electric and natural gas transmission and distribution service. Under the provisions of KRS 278.020(5), no utility may apply for a franchise from any governmental agency until it has obtained a CPCN from this Commission based on our finding that there is a need and demand for the service sought to be rendered.

In light of the city of Vine Grove's ordinance creating a franchise for electric and natural gas transmission and distribution service, the Commission determines that there is evidence of a need and demand for electric and natural gas transmission and distribution service in the above-mentioned city. Since the Commission's authority in such matters is limited by statute to finding only whether there is a need and demand for

the service sought to be rendered, no finding or determination is made as to the qualifications of the bidder, the validity of any of the provisions of the franchises offered by said city, or the manner in which any franchise fees are to be treated for rate purposes.

The Commission directs to the Commission's July 22, 2021 Order in Case No. 2020-00085² regarding filings with the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- LG&E is granted a CPCN that authorizes it to bid on a franchise offered by the city of Vine Grove, Kentucky, for electric and natural gas transmission and distribution service.
- 2. If LG&E is not the successful bidder, LG&E shall file with the Commission, within ten days of the award of the franchise at issue, a written notice stating that LG&E was not the successful bidder.
- 3. If LG&E is the successful bidder, LG&E shall file with the Commission, within ten days of the award of the franchise at issue, a copy of the executed franchise agreement and a statement disclosing the amount of the initial franchise fee.
- 4. If LG&E is the successful bidder, LG&E shall file with the Commission, within ten days of an increase or decrease in the amount of the initial franchise fee set forth in the franchise agreement, documentation setting forth the revised fee.
- 5. Any documents filed pursuant to ordering paragraphs 2, 3, or 4 of this Order shall reference the number of this case and shall be electronically submitted via the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System.
