ORDER

On May 10, 2022, New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC d/b/a AT&T Mobility (AT&T Mobility) and Tillman Infrastructure LLC (Tillman Infrastructure) filed a motion, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, and KRS 61.878, requesting that the Commission grant confidential treatment for an indefinite period or, at a minimum, ten years for an affidavit in support of AT&T Mobility and Tillman Infrastructure’s application.

In support of its motion, AT&T Mobility and Tillman Infrastructure argue that the affidavit includes discussion of inherently proprietary or confidential information, and that if disclosed, the material would permit unfair commercial advantage to competitors under 807 K.A.R. 5:001, Section 13 and KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1).

Having considered the motion and the material at issue, the Commission finds that the affidavit in support of the application is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary. The affidavit contains a description of the several rental terms, including specific information, between SBA Towers and AT&T Mobility as well as Tillman Infrastructure and AT&T Mobility. More particularly, the financial benefits AT&T Mobility

foresees in re-locating to a Tillman Infrastructure tower. In addition, similar affidavits have recently been granted confidential treatment by Commission.¹ It therefore meets the criteria for confidential treatment and is exempted from public disclosure pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, and KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1) is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:


1. AT&T Mobility and Tillman Infrastructure's motion for confidential treatment is granted.
2. The designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for a period of ten years or until further Order of this Commission.
3. Use of the designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order in any Commission proceeding shall comply with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13(9).
4. AT&T Mobility and Tillman Infrastructure shall inform the Commission if the designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order becomes publicly available or no longer qualifies for confidential treatment.

If a nonparty to this proceeding requests to inspect the material granted confidential treatment by this Order and the period during which the material has been granted confidential treatment has not expired, AT&T Mobility and Tillman Infrastructure shall have 30 days from receipt of written notice of the request to demonstrate that the material still falls within the exclusions from disclosure requirements established in KRS 61.878. If AT&T Mobility and Tillman Infrastructure are unable to make such demonstration, the requested material shall be made available for inspection. Otherwise, the Commission shall deny the request for inspection.


6. The Commission shall not make the requested material available for inspection for 30 days from the date of service of an Order finding that the material no longer qualifies for confidential treatment in order to allow AT&T Mobility and Tillman Infrastructure to seek a remedy afforded by law.

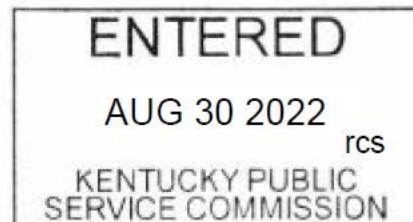
