## ORDER

On June 24, 2022, Breathitt County Water District (Breathitt District) applied for approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068 due to a rate increase from Breathitt District's wholesale water supplier, the city of Jackson, Kentucky (Jackson).

### LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.015, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district has the authority to increase its rates commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water district must file a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

## DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Having reviewed the record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that Breathitt District purchases water from Jackson and the city of Campton (Campton). The Commission finds that Jackson notified Breathitt District that its wholesale rate would increase from \$3.92 per 1,000 gallons to \$4.04 per 1,000 gallons,

effective July 1, 2022.<sup>1</sup> Breathitt District proposed to increase the water rates to its customers effective July 1, 2022, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Jackson.

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2021 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Breathitt District reported a water loss of 12.0241 percent.<sup>2</sup> Breathitt District's application provides updated purchase and sales information for a more current period than the 2021 Annual Report. Based upon the updated information in the application and the percentage of other water consumed by the utility in its 2021 Annual Report, Breathitt District's unaccounted-for water loss is 12.7226 percent for the updated period.<sup>3</sup> The cost of Breathitt District's total water loss is \$43,268.84.<sup>4</sup> Breathitt District's water loss is within 15 percent of its total water purchased and meets the standard in 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3). The Commission recommends that Breathitt District continue its efforts to reduce

unaccounted-for water loss and the utility remain informed about the cost of its unaccounted-for water loss.

In Case No. 2019-00041, the Commission discussed the problems that can occur when utilities intentionally avoid a review of their financial records by relying solely on financing cases to increase rates.<sup>5</sup> A key recommendation from that proceeding was that water districts should monitor the sufficiency of their base rates closely and, in general, apply for base rate adjustments on a more frequent basis.<sup>6</sup> The Commission noted its concern for Breathitt District's financial condition in its November 5, 2020 Order in a case filed for a certificate for public convenience and necessity.<sup>7</sup> Breathitt District was later found in violation of a Commission Order for failing to file an application for traditional adjustment in rates or an alternative rate adjustment within one year of the Commission's November 5, 2020 Order in Case No. 2020-00218.<sup>8</sup> Breathitt District tendered an application for an alternative rate adjustment (ARF) on June 13, 2022, and a subsequent notice of deficiency was issued, therefore that case has not yet been accepted for filing.<sup>9</sup>

Breathitt District filed a request for an extension of time to respond to the deficiency;<sup>10</sup> a decision on the request is pending.

In its application, Breathitt District proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.15 per 1,000 gallons in its application. During the 12 months ended May 31, 2022, Breathitt District purchased 84,100,000 gallons of water from Jackson, 99,500 gallons of water from Campton, and sold 69,267,000 gallons of water to its customers. The increase in the cost of purchased water is \$10,092, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.15 per 1,000 gallons. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.15 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A and the rates set forth in Appendix B to this Order, is fair, just and reasonable and shall be approved for water service rendered by Breathitt District on and after July 1, 2022. The water adjustment factor is supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Breathitt District's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.015.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.15 per 1,000 gallons is approved.
  - 2. The rates proposed by Breathitt District are approved.
- 3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Breathitt District on and after July 1, 2022.

4. Within 20 days of the date of entry of this Order, Breathitt District shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.
