<u>ORDER</u>

On August 1, 2022, Montgomery County Water District No. 1 (Montgomery District) filed an application requesting approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068.

LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.015, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district has the authority to increase its rate commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water district must file a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Montgomery District purchases water from Mount Sterling Water and Sewer (Mount Sterling). Mount Sterling notified Montgomery District that its wholesale rate would increase from \$3.17 per 1,000 gallons to \$3.40 per 1,000 gallons, effective

August 1, 2022.¹ Montgomery District proposes to increase the water rates to its customers effective August 1, 2022, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Mount Sterling.

Unaccounted-for Water

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes, a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2021 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Montgomery District reported a water loss of 16.3033 percent.² Montgomery District's application provides updated purchase and sales information for a more current period than the 2021 Annual Report. Based upon the updated information in the application and the percentage of other water consumed by the utility in its 2021 Annual Report, Montgomery District's unaccounted-for water loss is 19.8698 percent for the updated period.³ Reduction of Montgomery District's unaccounted-for water loss to 15 percent would result in an approximate \$6,744.26 decrease to purchased water expense.⁴ Potentially, Montgomery District is paying approximately \$0.21 per 1,000 gallons sold for expenses associated

with unaccounted-for water loss in excess of the 15 percent threshold.⁵ The cost of Montgomery District's total water loss is \$27,518.⁶

The Commission is placing greater emphasis on monitoring utilities that consistently exceed the 15 percent unaccounted-for water loss threshold. The Commission strongly encourages Montgomery District to pursue reasonable actions to reduce its unaccounted-for water loss. Failure by Montgomery District to make significant progress toward reducing unaccounted-for water loss may cause the Commission to pursue additional action with the utility.

Financial Condition and Rates

Based on a review of Commission records, Montgomery District has not sought a general base rate adjustment since 2009.⁷ Montgomery District's only rate increases have occurred from purchased water adjustments. As a result, Montgomery District has avoided comprehensive review by the Commission of Montgomery District's financial records and operational structure for 13 years.

In Case No. 2019-00041, the Commission discussed the problems that can occur when utilities intentionally avoid a review of their financial records by relying solely on financing cases to increase rates.⁸ A key recommendation from that proceeding was that

water districts should monitor the sufficiency of their base rates closely and, in general, apply for base rate adjustments on a more frequent basis.⁹

As documented in annual and audit reports filed with the Commission, Montgomery District reported negative net income each year from 2017 through 2021 and the cash basis income was negative in 2018 and 2021. Montgomery District's water loss was below 15 percent from 2017 to 2019 then jumped to 23.5545 percent in 2020. Water loss decreased between 2020 and 2021 to 16.3033 percent.

The lack of insight into Montgomery District's financial records leads the Commission to conclude that Montgomery District shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, or an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, or in the alternative, file a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and revenues explaining the reasons why no

modifications are necessary. Any filing for a rate adjustment filed under KRS 278.023 does not relieve Montgomery District from this requirement.

Purchase Water Rate Increase

In its application, Montgomery District proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.29 per 1,000 gallons. During the 12 months ended June 30, 2022, Montgomery District purchased 40,732,823 gallons of water from Mount Sterling and sold 32,639,310 gallons of water to its customers. The increase in the cost of purchased water from Mount Sterling is \$9,368.55, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.29 per 1,000 gallons.

Based upon the case record, the Commission finds that the purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.29 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A and the rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are fair, just and reasonable and are approved for water service rendered by Montgomery District on and after August 1, 2022. The rate adjustment factor is supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Montgomery District's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.015. On or before August 30, 2023, Montgomery District shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, or an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, or in the alternative, file a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and revenues explaining the reasons why no modifications are necessary.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.29 per 1,000 gallons is approved.

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2. The rates proposed by Montgomery District are approved. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Montgomery District on and after August 1, 2022.

3. Within 20 days of the date of service of this Order, Montgomery District shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.

4. On or before August 30, 2023, Montgomery District shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, or an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, or in the alternative, file a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and revenues explaining the reasons why no modifications are necessary. Any filing for a rate adjustment filed under KRS 278.023 does not relieve Montgomery District from this requirement.

5. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
