CITY OF EDDYVILLE, KENTUCKY ORDINANCE 2018-05-07 WATER AND SEWER RATE ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the City of Eddyville, Kentucky on February 1, 2016 passed and adopted a City Ordinance pertaining to the rates, rules and regulations of the water and sewer system of the City of Eddyville, Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, certain changes and modifications of said Ordinance have become necessary due to changing times; and

WHEREAS, the cost of providing water and sewer services for the residents of the City of Eddyville, Kentucky has increased dramatically over the past few years; and

WHEREAS, the City of Eddyville, Kentucky must establish a rate to pay for maintenance and repairs to water and sewer system facilities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Eddyville, Kentucky as follows:

1. The City Ordinance Section 51.087 and Section 51.088 be amended and the specified provisions of the sections shall hereinafter read as follows:

SECTION 51.087 RATES AND CHARGES FOR ORDINARY WATER SERVICE.

The rates and charges for ordinary water services shall be based upon a metered rate as follows:

PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present. Meg Link, KIA Secretary was asked to call the Roll.

I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of September 24, 2020

Judge David Voegele moved to approve the minutes of the September 24, 2020, regular board meeting. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

- B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS
 - 1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F20-026) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$600,000 TO THE CITY OF WHITSBURG, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Whitesburg's request for a Fund F loan, (F20-026) for an amount up to \$1,100,000 for the Water Storage Tank Replacement project. This project will replace two tanks in the Whitesburg Water System. Both tanks have been experiencing leaks that are cost ineffective to repair. The Shady Drive tank is a 175,000-gallon tank which will be replaced with a 200,000-gallon tank to lessen pump cycling. The new tank will increase the overall storage for the system and improve the techniques of isolating areas during leaks. Hale Drive tank will also be replaced, but will remain at its current capacity of 275,000 gallons. The replacements will ensure that the tanks are in an adequate and safe condition to continue serving the existing customers in the City and surrounding area.

The City provides retail water to approximately 1,400 customers and wholesale water to the Letcher County Water and Sewer District, which is a PSC regulated entity. Wholesale water is less than 10% of the total usage.

Mr. Bob Amato moved to approve the Fund F loan (F20-026), for an amount up to \$600,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Paul Miller seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-019) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,200,000 TO THE CITY OF WHITESBURG, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Whitesburg's request for a Fund F Loan, F21-019, for an amount up to \$2,200,000 for the KY HWY 931 Waterline Extension Project. This project will install approximately 61,000 LF of 2", 3", 4", and 6" PVC waterlines, meters, flushing hydrants, a water storage tank, and a duplex pump station. The extension will serve 166 households who currently rely on wells or hauled water. The duplex pump station will be constructed at the end of the existing 6" waterline to ensure that water pressure requirements are met at the top of the hill on KY HWY 931. This will provide the currently unserved residents with a reliable and safe supply of potable water while increasing rate revenues to the City from the new customers.

The City provides retail water to approximately 1,400 customers and wholesale water to the Letcher County Water and Sewer District, which is a PSC regulated entity. Wholesale water is less than 10% of the total usage.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund F Loan (F21-019) for an amount up to \$2,200,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Paul Miller seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-025) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$270,000 TO THE MCCREARY COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, MCCREARY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the McCreary County Water District's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$270,000 for the Catron/Needle Road Water Line project. This project will install 6,550 linear feet of 3-inch water line that will provide a safe and reliable source of potable water to nine unserved customers. If available, any remaining funds will extend approximately 2,500 linear feet of 3-inch water line along KY 896 (Noah Dock Road) to serve additional customers.

The District currently serves approximately 5,900 retail water customers and 1,100 sewer customers in McCreary County and provide wholesale water to the Whitley County Water District and the City of Onieda in Tennessee. Both McCreary and Whitley County Water Districts are under the Public Service Commission jurisdiction ("PSC") and subject to PSC rate regulations. The District had not sold any water to Onieda in the past 3 years due to the need basis agreement but may resume sales in 2021 to supply water for Onieda's source water project.

Mr. Bob Amato asked how many additional customers would be added to service. Mr. Becker noted 9 customers for the initial project. Mr. Alan Robinson, Eclipse Engineers and Mr. Stephen Whitaker, McCreary County Water District noted that 6 customers would be eligible for service and some customers would be reconnected.

Mr. Jeb Pinney abstained from voting. Mr. Russ Rose made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F21-025, for an amount up to \$270,000, with the standard conditions and the following special conditions, as required by the PSC: 1) The District shall apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for KIA loan F21-025 in the amount of \$135,000. This debt authorization application should include a financial forecast that meets debt service projected through 2025. 2) Prior to execution of the assistance agreement, the District must receive a Certificate

of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020, from the PSC for any portion of the project that may require it, or provide an opinion from legal counsel or the staff of the PSC, or a declaratory order from the PSC, that a CPCN is not required for any portion of the assets to be constructed as part of the loan agreement. Mr. Kurt Stafford seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-076) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,637,500 TO THE CITY OF HAZARD, PERRY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Hazard's request for a Fund F loan, F21-076, for an amount up to \$1,637,500 for the Emergency Tank Replacement project. This project will replace the Liberty Street tank. This project will construct two 1,000,000 gallon ground storage tanks at the existing location. The existing will be demolished upon completion of the new tank.

The project will include telemetry. Currently, the existing 2,000,000 million-gallon tank feeds the entire Hazard system from the plant, when the tank has issues or needs maintenance, the system must be taken offline. By constructing two 1,000,000 million gallon tanks the City will be able to leave one tank in operation when issues arise or maintenance is necessary and therefore not have to take the system offline.

The project will also include two VFD's at the plant. Governor Andy Beshear issued an emergency declaration due to the results of a tank inspection dated August 14, 2020 that deemed the tank unsafe and needed to be taken out of service.

Currently the City of Hazard serves 9,000 residential and over 750 commercial customers.

Judge David Voegele asked if the problems were found during a periodic inspection. City officials said it was found by the City's contractor. Mr. Ron Lovan asked Mr. Paul Nesbitt about the tank that ruptured many years ago. Mr. Nesbit noted it was in Jenkins about 40 years ago, a prominent doctor was killed as a result of the accident. Mr. Lovan thanked Mr. Nesbitt for his input and stated his appreciation to KIA for being able to step in and assist with this project so quickly.

Mr., Ron Lovan made the motion to approved the Fund F Loan, F21-076 in an amount up to \$1,637,500 to the City of Hazard with the standard conditions. *Mr. Winston Miller* seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Deputy Executive Director Linda Bridwell discussed the Drinking Water and Clean Water State Revolving Fund Call for Projects deadline is December 4th. A project has to be on the priority list to be eligible to receive funding from the federal programs. The Division of Water completes an initial review of the projects and requested modifications or answers to questions.

The KIA audit is currently being completed. As a reminder, Jeff Abshire left the agency on June 15, 2020, or two weeks prior to the close of the fiscal year. KIA hired Blue & Co. to help prepare our financial statements, and Denise Pitts (a former KIA employee) has been working with us two days a week. The financial statements have been submitted to our auditor, Dean, Dorton & Ford. The Office of Financial Management wanted all agency audits submitted by October 2, but had granted us an extension to November 15 in light of the transition of key personnel. We are targeting completing everything by next week and get it submitted with no issues. We plan to present it to the Board at the December board meeting.

KIA submitted the annual reports to the EPA by the September 30, 2020 deadline.

KIA has been awarded both the CW and DW capitalization grants for FY 2021.

Staff has initiated a billing process that will auto-generate bills to each of our borrowers. A trial run was done this week, but they were duplicates of the paper bills that were mailed out in mid-October. If successful, we will also use this process to communicate with the borrowers on audit submissions. One borrower has requested a delay in payment due to reduced revenues during Covid. We have granted that request and will continue to work with everyone who contacts us.

The financial team staff has been participating in virtual training with the EPA, which has been a great opportunity.

A handful of 2020 projects have not moved forward due to the Covid delays, so the Board will continue to see some of those projects at future meetings.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-003) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,745,064 TO THE CITY OF EDDYVILLE, LYON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Eddyville, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$2,745,064 including permanent financing for planning & design Ioan A20-027 in the amount of \$423,964 and \$2,321,100 for construction, and capitalized interest during the construction period, to the City of Eddyville for the Wastewater SSES and Rehabilitation – South of Fairview Ave Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,745,064 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$6,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$138,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 3rd day of December, 2020.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Eddyville ("City") is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$2,745,064 to fund the Wastewater SSES and Rehabilitation – South of Fairview Ave Project. The requested loan amount includes \$423,964 for the planning and design portion previously approved in November, 2019. This project will rehabilitate and replace the lines and manholes as identified in the planning and design phase to reduce inflow and infiltration points in Eddyville's collection system. It will also replace the dry pit design of the existing lift station at the Industrial Park on US 62 East with a more appropriate and safer submersible pump station that will reduce repeated overflows. The new pump station is designed to accommodate the current demands and potential growth from the Industrial Park.

The City's sewer system currently serves approximately 900 retail customers and treats wastewater from the City of Fredonia. The KISOP (Kentucky Inter-System Operating Permit) wastewater treatment accounts for less than 4% of total volume treated annually.

The City's Ordinance 2018-05-07 approved a 3% rate increase on water and sewer to take effect each July 1 of every even-numbered year until 2026.

VII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

Green Project Reserve - The project is categorically green with its total project cost of \$2,745,064 qualifying for the Green Project Reserve (GPR) fundinng.
 Subsidization - This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, had been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below were based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 2.2% from \$ 1.35 million in 2017 to \$1.38 million in 2019 due to previously approved rate increases while operating expenses stayed consistent during the same time period. The debt coverage ratio was 2.4, 1.5, and 1.9 for 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflected a current ratio of 0.6, debt to equity ratio of 0.5, and 53.7 days of sales in accounts receivable. The unrestricted cash of water and sewer operations was reported under the City's general fund, therefore the number of month of operating expenses in unrestricted cash was irrelevant.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Total revenues will go up 3% each in every even-numbered year until 2026 as approved by Ordinance 2018-05-07.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% each year for inflation.
- 3) The project will be ready to open bids immediately after KIA approval of the loan.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in SFY2022 when principal and interest repayments for the loan begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$138,000 total) of the final amount borrowed prior to principal forgiveness to be funded annually (\$6,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District ("MSD") plans to assume the following Fund B wastewater loans: B10-01, B10-04, B15-006 from the Bullitt County Sanitation District (BCSD) as part of MSD's acquisition of the BCSD wastewater system and all of its assets. The existing loans were approved between 2010-2016 by the KIA board to fund various wastewater system improvement and expansion projects in Bullitt County. At this time, it is estimated that the acquisition will be completed by the end of March 2021.

Upon the execution of this transfer of assets, MSD will assume total ownership of BCSD. This merger will help provide the residents of Bullitt County seamless transition while adding capacity to MSD's capacity and customer base. MSD will continue to honor the enacted ordinance increases for BCSD.

In 2016, Bullitt County Fiscal Court approved a series of 12% rate increases to occur annually for a period of 10 years starting January 1, 2017. MSD will continue these approved BCSD rate increases until the 10-year period ends in 2026.

IV. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020 from the combined wastewater and storm water funds. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 14.3% from \$279 million in 2018 to \$319 million in 2020. MSD's board can approve rate increases up to 7% without needed approval from Louisville Metro Council which they have done in 2018 and 2019 audited years and 5% in 2020 driving the annual increases in revenue. Wastewater service charges totaled \$237.8 million in 2020 while storm water service charges totaled \$75 million. Operating expenses increased 17.6% during the same time period from \$93.8 million to \$110.3 million. Expense increases were attributed mostly to increased labor expense as well as various weather events (flooding) that occurred during the audited period observed. The debt coverage ratio for 2018-2020 was 1.62, 1.63, and 1.71 respectively (includes only net operating income).

The 1993 Sewer and Drainage System Revenue Bond Resolution requires MSD to provide available revenues sufficient to pay 110% of each year's aggregate net debt service on revenue bonds and 100% of operating expenses. Each year MSD's audit contains a Comparative Schedule of Debt Service Coverage which includes net operating income as well as other sources of revenue including investment income and current period payments of property owner assessments. When factoring in those additional revenue streams, MSD's debt coverage ratio from 2018-2020 was 1.9, 1.8, and 1.9 respectively. Moody's Investors Service affirmed an Aa3 rating for MSD on September 14, 2020 for outstanding senior revenue bonds with a stable outlook. S&P Rating Service affirmed an AA long term rating and stable outlook on September 11, 2020.

The 2020 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt to equity ratio of 3.6, 31.1 days sales in accounts receivable, and 10.9 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase 6.9% each forecasted year due to rate increases anticipated from MSD's Board.
- 2) Expenses will increase 4% for inflation and expected increases in general operational expenses for pending projects.
- 3) The forecast includes debt service for both approved KIA loans for MSD including A19-015 and A19-028 (total of \$25,870,000).
- 4) MSD will make the June 1, 2021 debt service payments for the existing Bullitt County Sanitation District KIA loans and all other existing BCSD debt assuming that the transfer is complete by that date.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.55 and above during the projected FY 2021-2025.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan assumptions.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains Debt Reserve Accounts equal to the maximum annual debt service requirements on its senior lien obligations (currently \$55 million). No additional replacement reserves will be required for this loan.

A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.
