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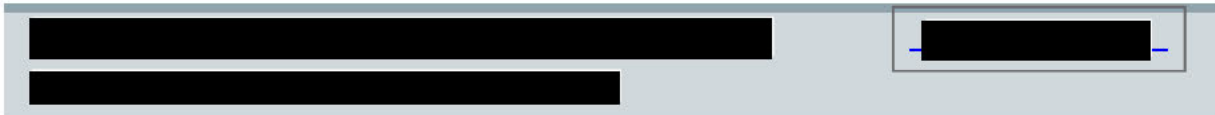

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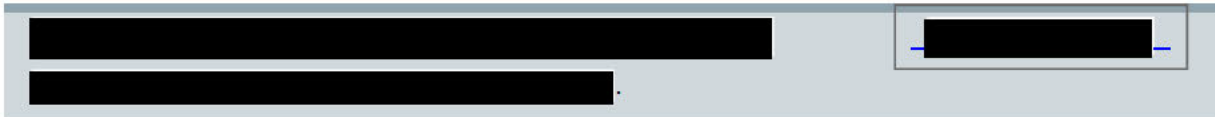

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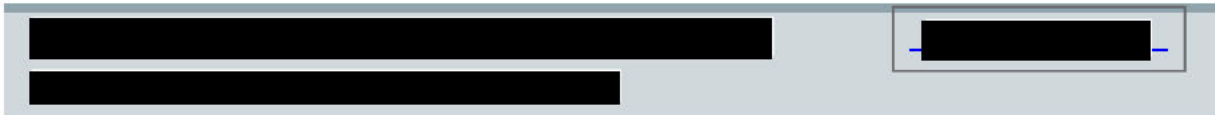

You have not previously corresponded with this sender.

I am writing to ask if the Public Service Commission would consider moving the hearing on PSA case no. 2022-00402 to Louisville so that the people who will be most affected by their decision can attend. To explain: This concerns the case filed by LG&E before the PSC that

includes, among some other issues, the production of two gas-fired plants at a time when such plants will soon be replaced by solar and wind-generated power, at tremendous cost to all ratepayers. This is PSC case no. 2022-00402 .

Currently a public hearing on the case is scheduled for Frankfurt and it will most likely be virtual, but this case desperately deserves a public hearing and at a time and place where the people who will be most affected by it can attend. Local voices should be heard locally. I am writing to request that the PSC hold a public hearing on this case IN LOUISVILLE.

There are so many issues swirling around this action. A number of them, briefly, are as follows:

A racism factor entangled with the impact of additional costs in rates; cut offs and late fees, Location may be an issue. (Note that LG&E is removing their presence from Louisville, even LG&E does not want to live in the environment they are creating.)

Next one could address the “stranded asset” factor built into the proposal: given the progress with alternative energy production, we could wind up still paying for these plants long after they are deemed unusable in current form, and then we would have to pay more to convert them. Why would anyone build gas-powered plants in this day and age anyway? Will having new gas fired plants in the face of all we know about fossil fuels prejudice Louisville’s chances of getting competitive awards from the federal government as the environmental funds are rolled out?

No explanation for the reason for having a cost that is a billion dollars being sprung on us for quick action without prior notice in the 15-year plan or to DSM-a. Is it because it is clear that this kind of investment is doomed?

A very deep concern is that these plants as well as the pipelines and all that are involved in such facilities will become obsolete long before the facilities become obsolete, but customers will still have to pay them off. The rate payers in Louisville will be stuck with the bill and they deserve to know about it. Hopefully attending the hearing will wake some folks up!

I have written to my State Resentative Nima Kulkarni and to State Senator Denise Harper Angel with the same request. Hopefully if two officials ask, the PSC will take the request seriously.

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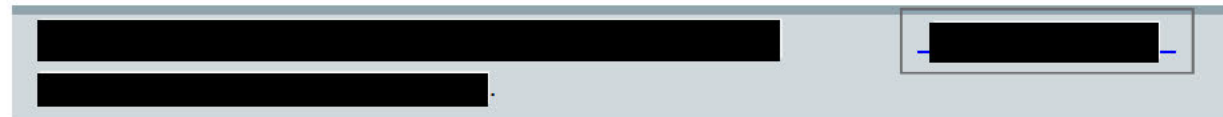
