



Comments: Methane, as a greenhouse gas is 84 times more potent than carbon dioxide over a 20-year period, and sadly our window of opportunity to avoid the worse effects of climate change is very small. The IPCC says "limiting warming to around 1.5°C (2.7°F) requires global greenhouse gas emissions to peak before 2025 at the latest, and be reduced by 43% by 2030" (<https://www.ipcc.ch/2022/04/04/ipcc-ar6-wgiii-pressrelease/>). According to nature (<https://www.nature.com/articles/s41586-021-03821-8>), we need to avoid extracting 60% of oil and gas as well 90% of coal reserves by 2050. These new plants will need to run for many years or even decades to pay for themselves, but the climate does not have that kind of time. If obligations to stave off the worst effects of climate change are to be met, then these plants will need to be abandoned well before end of life and likely before they break even. I imagine it is the consumer and the tax payer that will be stuck holding this bill. In the meantime the cost of renewables and the price of batteries continues to plummet. Rather than investing in costly new natural gas that will leave Kentucky with sunk assets, we should be investing in the future.

We don't want or need new fossil fuel generation

We support closing coal plants but we absolutely do not want to replace them with expensive and polluting 40 year gas plants and their infrastructure. Before 40 year gas plants are even considered we need to expand efficiency programs, rooftop solar, utility scale solar, storage, and fully explore new capacity alternatives such as virtual power plants, joining regional grids. The companies' proposed energy efficiency proposals are inadequate. Kentucky has one of the poorest records in the country on energy efficiency in terms of residential energy efficiency program savings as a percentage of sales, and revenues spent on energy efficiency programs

Kentuckians need Energy Efficiency programs that achieve at least 2-3% of load. We want a public commitment to ignore the companies' 1% cap on rooftop solar and to continue to support distributed resources after reaching that threshold.

We want the companies to help customers invest in Energy Efficiency, solar, and storage - and access IRA benefits outside of company programs: this means better policy advocacy. The companies need to do much more for low and moderate income customers.

Companies need to track need (energy burden), energy insecurity (arrearages and disconnections), and utility retrofits better - and make that data publicly available. The companies need to support energy efficiency financing programs that are maximally inclusive and do not neglect particular income groups. Support programs that address the problem of split incentives between landlords and tenants. The reach of the proposed low income weatherization and efficiency programs is far too limited.

Gas threatens our health and safety

We need to lower pollution levels and threats of extreme temperatures and extreme weather events . These extremes threaten our health, agriculture, and economy. These threats are expensive and these costs need to be factored in. Customers will be on the hook

Gas plants face carbon policy threats during their 40-year life cycle, increasing the risk of stranded assets (customers being on the hook to pay for gas plants that are no longer useful)/ bad debt for customers. The EPA is already proposing new pollution requirements for gas plants.

Utilities should assume risk of fuel cost volatility, rather than passing costs through via the fuel adjustment charge

LG&E and KU Didn't Propose New Gas in their Most Recent 15-Year Plan

The state requires that utilities submit a 15 year plan for review by the Public Service Commission every 3 years. In the most recently submitted plan (2021) there was no mention of new gas plants.

LG&E and KU need to take the regulatory planning process seriously this is our future!

I am writing as a long-time LG&E rate-payer and sustainability professional to urge you to consider the long-term public interest concerns raised by PSC case #2022-00402. For so many reasons in the public interest, from electric rates to air pollution to climate chaos to local green jobs, it is vital that this case does not get approved as proposed. This proposal threatens to lock us into paying the financial, social, and ecological costs of another four decades of fossil fuel ("natural gas") consumption at a time when all the science and recent lived experience is loudly telling us that we ought to be rapidly transitioning away from fossil fuels. Investing in new natural gas plants at this time is wildly irresponsible and willfully ignorant. Of course, I urge you to approve the proposed coal retirements, but you must also reject the proposals for two new utility-scale fossil fueled plants.

It is evident that many LG&E/KU customers like me are already struggling to afford our current energy bills, while at the same time, we all suffer from the ravages of air pollution and the fossil-fueled climate chaos that has already ripped apart communities in Western Kentucky and drowned our hollers in Appalachia. As such, we the public, demand that the PSC refuse LGE/KU's plans for new fossil fueled construction and instead require LGE/KU to invest significant funding in additional, resilient, and diverse renewable energy production and DSM energy efficiency programs to lower overall demand while keeping energy affordable for Kentuckians.

The public wants a new way forward that gets us out of the costly, polluting strategies of the past. We don't want new fossil fuel generation and it clearly is not needed. There is such a

We can do so much better, and the rate-payers and all those who breathe our air, rely on a stable climate, or seek local employment will reap the rewards.

But LGE/KU also need to do much more for low and moderate income customers. The reach of the proposed low income weatherization and efficiency programs is far too limited. The utilities must offer better value for rooftop solar and must offer energy efficiency financing programs that are maximally inclusive and do not neglect particular income groups. They must address the problem of split incentives between landlords and tenants. 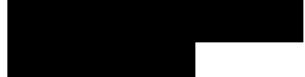

Comments: We are going to need a much more courageous, creative, and forward-thinking electricity plan if we want to try to avoid societal chaos due to climate change. Is a regulated utility model able to achieve what we need? I am not sure, but we can try. Rather than proposing to build new gas plants, I suspect retiring coal plants could be met with a combination of aggressive energy efficiency programs, flexible timing of end-uses, distributed solar, and peak pricing to incentivize customers to use power when it is most available. For example, I calculate that if the estimated 51,000 pre-1976 mobile homes in Kentucky were to be replaced with ultra-low-energy homes in a DSM program, the peak demand reduction would be equivalent to a couple power plants (816 MW). With a \$1.3 billion price tag, KU could afford to pay a \$26,000 incentive per home. This new KU/LG&E proposal makes me want to defect from the grid entirely, but I know that we need the power system to work for everyone. For natural gas to perform better than the coal it is replacing and to act as a short-term bridge technology, it would be best deployed as combined heat and power systems. In addition, the upstream emissions will need to be captured. Unfortunately, the utility may have limited ability to influence the natural gas supply.

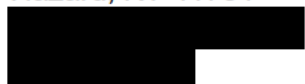
