LG&E/KU customers like me have struggled with paying our energy bills or are affected by the air pollution from fossil fuel power plants. Investing in energy efficiency (DSM) instead will help lower the overall demand for energy while helping keep energy affordable for us Kentuckians.

We support closing coal plants but we absolutely do not want to replace them with expensive and polluting 40 year gas plants and their infrastructure. Opportunity: Planned reduction in energy demand

The world of American business seems to be predicated on eternal mandatory growth, but the mission of providing clean, reliable, affordable energy can be different.

Here is the original argument of the RewiringAmerica program, which was put in place nationally within the Inflation Reduction Act one year ago—reduction of household energy demand thru energy efficiency. (Similar incentives are offered for commercial and non-profit entities)

Current households vs. electrified

The electrified U.S. household uses substantially less energy than current homes.

One area of enormous savings is the elimination of thermoelectric losses in electricity generation, assuming we will provide our future loads with renewables.

The efficiency of electric cars over internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles also generates substantial savings.

Similarly, we show the substantial savings derived from the high efficiency of heat pumps for space and water heating.

Annual average energy use per U.S. household, kWh equivalents

Looking at this graph, the black section (thermoelectric losses in electricity generation) is out of householders' control, and very much in the hands of their electric utilities.

If we look at just the colored parts (Current: 55,000 — Future:20,000kWh) we see that the program provides much reduced need for electric generation. It can be reduced by more than half.

Is LGE/KU taking this into account investing for future need?

The IRA/Rewiring America program started right off the bat with tax incentives for a variety of these upgrades, but we all know that tax-based incentives do not reach everyone. As it expands next year with upfront discounts, this bottleneck should be resolved.

PS. Public Service Commission Building, LGE/KU buildings: Do YOU own or rent buildings? Efficiency and electrification upgrades are available, which lower cost of operation and maintenance. Savings there put more capital into your mission, same as for everybody else.

Opportunity: Home Energy Audits

Another bottleneck in this first year of the EPA Weatherization and Energy Efficiency program is in the lack of easily-available Home Energy Audits and advisory services.Utilities and RECCs concerned about their business plan and perhaps losing employment because of a planned decline in energy use could shift into this area where their expertise is so valuable going forward.

Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG)

Generous CPRG grants are available to develop and implement plans for reducing greenhouse gas emissions, which providing Home Energy Audits in prep for widely-available building upgrades clearly qualifies.

The State of Kentucky declined to accept the \$3 million planning grant, but the City of Louisville is taking up the slack for its area. To be considered for \$2 million - \$500 million implementation grants, an application would go through the City of Louisville Sustainability Office. For states and municipalities – Priority Climate Action Plans are due by March 1, 2024. Applications for the general implementation grants competition will likely be due on or around April 1, 2024.

EPA encourages applicants incorporate other level (state, local) grant programs and let CPRG be a jump-starter of something that can continue.

Kentucky entities should contact Louisville, Lexington, Bowling Green or Cincinnati to request being part of the planning process.

Funding for training of electricians, HVAC, construction workers, designers, programmers and other necessary workers is available

Opportunity: Reliability through Distributed Solar

Department of Energy (DOE) wants to address transmission infrastructure—close in transmission (ie distributed solar to the grid for stability and resilience of the entire grid)

When connected to the electric utility's lower voltage distribution lines, distributed generation can help support delivery of clean, reliable power to additional customers and reduce electricity losses along transmission and distribution lines.

Distributed solar and wind can also reduce the demand for new transmission lines.

In the IRA and other current initiatives, rooftop solar is highly encouraged, with 30% - 70% funding for residential, commercial and non-profits.

Applicants are encouraged to propose single projects throughout the area, bring them into the planning and the grid. Funds are available for building and selling energy including staffing, with 40% loans forgiveness, up to 70%.

Without mandating fossil fuel reductions or clean electricity targets, the IRA is largely an incentive bill. However, it goes beyond simply making wind, solar, and storage cheaper than gas and coal. By pairing clean energy tax credits with these refinancing programs to pay off remaining plant balances, we finally have a more level playing field for clean resources to compete, while also bringing new economic opportunities to fossil-dependent communities.

Repurposing retired coal and gas infrastructure with renewables in the same communities

Reviewing the Hazard PSC comment session online, I hear people's pain in the loss of traditional livelihoods around the coal industry. This is real.

I also applaud the bravery of the student who stood up for her generation's insight and need, recognizing the magnitude of facing down old habits and misunderstandings around our ability to do something about climate instability and wild weather. Her pain is also real.

On a personal level, we all want to keep our jobs, our children, our communities and our homes safe, predictable and nurturing. That goes for everyone whose job is upended by new goals and/or new technology.

Unstable climate, even if we address it now, is going to continue to cause disruption to all our lives, so I will do anything I can to help us find ways to cut to the chase and make a difference. Right now we have unprecedented help from our own tax money in federal programs.

From last week's EPA Funding Fair and other IRA materials, I am pretty sure that each and every application for funding requires attention to Environmental Justice for coal and brownfield communities and other communities impacted by industrial pollution. So, on that level, the people in Hazard and others like them should find assistance from all of us. I hope it can make a difference.

For the question at hand, I have to weigh in on the pressing issue of Climate, with the challenge to end our addiction to fossil fuel and its insidious poison as quickly as possible, which means immediately. I can't say it strongly enough, and I'm not going to try here.

I have selected three areas of potential action to bring to your attention, newly obtained from the EPA in its role as lead agency in federal level implementation of incentives and programs, existing and new, presented in Aug 9-11 Climate Action Funding Fair. They are (1) Planned Reduction in Energy Demand through Weatherization and Efficiency Upgrades, (2) Increased availability of Energy Audits, and (3) Increased reliability through Distributed Solar. If these are not included in current planning, they should be, and can all make significant financial difference to the industry and to the customer.

I very much affirm the current federal emphasis on Environmental Justice, and the fact that it is a major part of every one of the three opportunities above, and more.

In the Electrification and Energy Efficiency department, can we add to the GHG reductions the fact that so many people will have the opportunity to live in warmer, more comfortable homes and workplaces?

My husband and I support the retirement of the coal plants as requested by LGE & KU.

I believe the three opportunities provide a rationale for saying NO to new fossil fuel infrastructure, including natural gas, be it in Louisville, Mercer County, or my own backyard in Bullitt County.

The Public Service Commission (PSC) should rule that Louisville Gas and Electric and Kentucky Utilities must close aging fossil fuel plants and transition to a cleaner and more efficient energy future.

We note that in this case, Louisville Gas and Electric and Kentucky Utilities (LG&E/KU)'s has requested to retire four aging coal-fired electric generating units, plus three natural gas simple cycle combustion turbine units and to replace them with two new natural gas combined cycle facilities, two solar facilities, one battery storage facility, and four solar power purchase agreements.

In order to build these new gas plants, which will be very expensive, LG&E and KU ("the Companies") need to show the need for the new generating capacity and an "absence of wasteful duplication." The Greater Louisville Sierra Club submits that LG&E and KU have not made the case for building two large new greenhouse gas-emitting power plants before aggressively pursuing energy efficiency, renewables, storage systems, solar plus storage, and other available strategies to meet and lower energy demand.

We do support the proposed closure of the coal-fired generating units, which are old and nearing the end of their useful lives, rather than pouring more money into keeping them maintained and running. These coal-fired generating units also aggravate climate change and the related deadly weather events now associated with climate change, an aspect which is not fair, just, and reasonable for our citizens who are currently alive.

The need for the large new gas-fired units was not identified during the most recent Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) process or in their final plan, and the Companies have not reasonably considered less-risky lower-cost alternatives. The PSC should strongly question and reject the Companies' proposals that were not in their 15 year planning scenarios at all just a year earlier.

Rather than approving the certificates for the two new gas plants at a cost of over \$1 billion, the PSC should instruct LG&E and KU to invest in energy efficiency and demand-side management to reduce electric load, and to pursue other affordable, options which are therefore less risky.

We ask the PSC to order LG&E-KU to immediately increase Demand Side Management (DSM) programs and re-engage the Demand Side Management (DSM) Advisory Group of stakeholders. The Companies did not take the DSM process seriously before making this filing, and did not engage with the stakeholders who joined the DSM Advisory Group in good faith. As a

participant in this process, it was clear to us that the Companies regarded the hours we spent with them as merely a perfunctory engagement, an exercise that allowed them to check off a box.

We submit the PSC should reject the poorly formulated DSM proposals in this filing, and tell the Companies to start over with a genuine goal of using DSM to reduce load and demand. Every study that we know of has found effective efficiency programs are a low-cost way to reduce electric demand, a strategy which is less costly than new generation.¹

A well-formulated menu of DSM programs should also be sensitive to the needs of the low- and fixed-income customers. The Companies neglected to conduct critical basic analysis for supporting their DSM portfolio offerings for low- and fixed-income households. For example, the Companies propose to expand the WeCare (Weatherization, Conservation Advice and Recycling Energy) Program parameters to include households up to 300% of the Federal Poverty Limit (FPL) without a fully corresponding increase in funding. This is going to dilute the impact in the demographic of the previous program target, of households up to 200% FPL. Arguably, this is taking assistance away from the neediest sector. We consider this bad program design, and urge the PSC to not accept it.

The Companies should be instructed to conduct the analysis of potential residential DSM programs using readily available economic and race data by census tract in order to create the most effective DSM program offerings. The DSM programing should seek to target benefits to the most low- and fixed-income customer sectors, as they can least afford high utility bills, as well as seeking to curtail load and demand from large customers.

Kentucky needs an energy future that is clean, efficient, and renewable.

We submit that the Commission should approve the proposed solar and battery storage projects, but should also encourage the Companies to regard this beginning of emission-free renewable and storage projects as <u>only</u> the beginning on a transition. We must transition away from burning fossil fuels if we are to avoid living in a world of continuous weather disasters.

We submit the PSC should strongly encourage the Companies to increase their development of solar generation resources. To increase the use of solar power, Louisville Gas & Electric (LG&E) can implement some of the following ideas

1. Conduct a Comprehensive Solar Resource Assessment: the Companies should conduct a thorough assessment of the solar resource potential in their service areas. This assessment should include not only evaluating solar irradiation levels, and land availability, but give strong attention to the feasibility of widespread installation of solar panels on rooftops, (especially 'big box' and industrial rooftops), and parking lots, creating Distributed Energy Resources.

2. Set Clear Renewable Energy Targets: the Companies should establish clear and ambitious targets for increasing the share of solar power in their energy mix. These targets should be

specific, to provide a clear roadmap for the company's solar energy expansion, and should be spelled out in the next Integrated Resource Plan (IRP). This will also enable planning for some of the known obstacles, such as the current delays in the PJM interconnection queue.

3. Increase the planning for, and investment in, utility-scale solar projects. There are obstacles and barriers to be overcome in developing large solar projects. But if good planning is undertaken immediately, utility-scale solar projects offer economies of scale and can significantly increase the amount of solar power in the company's energy generation portfolio, without the looming danger of becoming stranded assets which is a very large consideration for fossil fuel generating units.

4. Enhance Grid Integration and Storage Capabilities: LG&E should invest in grid integration technologies to accommodate increased solar power generation. This includes advanced monitoring and control systems, smart grid infrastructure, and energy storage solutions. These types of needed investments do not appear to be adequately addressed in the CPCN application.

As discussed below, energy storage can significantly help address intermittency issues associated with solar power and ensure a more reliable and stable grid.

5. Encourage Customer-Owned Solar Installations: LG&E can incentivize and promote customer-owned solar installations through net metering programs and other financial incentives. This approach allows customers to generate their own solar energy and feed excess power back into the grid, thereby reducing the need for expensive conventional (fossil fuel) sources. It provides the companies with new generating assets at virtually no capital cost. Andy McDonald provides credible calculations in his submitted intervenor comment (July 14, 2023) on the size of reasonable expectations for such Distributed Energy Resources, and shows that they can be significant within just a few years, 690 MW of capacity or more.

Stated another way, the PSC should encourage the Companies to increase Distributed Energy Resources (DER) to minimize the need for creating new energy capacity with fossil-fuel plants.

5. Implement Community Solar Programs: LG&E can establish community solar programs, allowing multiple customers to collectively invest in a shared solar project. This approach enables customers who cannot install solar panels on their own properties to access the benefits of solar energy, and may again provide the companies with new generating assets at virtually no capital cost.

6. Collaborate with Local Governments and Organizations: LG&E should collaborate with local governments, environmental organizations, and community groups to advocate for favorable solar energy policies and regulations. Such collaboration would help streamline the permitting process for solar installations, simplify interconnection procedures, and promote solar-friendly policies. All of which assist in lower cost strategies for planning a reliable grid in Kentucky.

8. Educate and Raise Awareness: the Companies should undertake public awareness campaigns to educate customers about the benefits of solar power and the company's planning for

commitment to renewable energy. This can include informational materials, workshops, and partnerships with schools and educational institutions to promote renewable energy literacy.

9. Foster Research and Development: the Companies should invest in, or partner with, research and development initiatives promoting more integration of solar energy technologies into the grid. Louisville's Office of Sustainability is investigating this topic with the research assistance of the National Renewable Energy Laboratory. The Companies could readily assist in such efforts.

10. Monitor and Report Progress: LG&E should regularly monitor and report on the progress of their solar energy initiatives to their customer communities, (Louisville and Lexington, etc) including the amount of solar power generated, reductions in greenhouse gas emissions, and other relevant metrics. Transparent reporting can demonstrate the company's commitment to sustainability and help build trust with customers and stakeholders. Such activity would help to overcome the somewhat adversarial relationship the companies currently has with many stakeholder organization in their service areas.

Filings in this case show that solar plus storage has become an established technology for reliably serving electric load, without the risk of becoming stranded assets posed by building new fossil-fueled generation units.

Battery storage can become a valuable and helpful distributed energy resource

Customer-sited battery storage can play a significant role as a demand response resource. Quoting a Pennsylvania study "Energy storage deployment has grown rapidly across the United States over the last decade and can address many priorities and challenges currently facing the energy sector. Energy storage can help integrate increasing levels of renewable energy into the grid and reduce the environmental impacts of electricity production. Additionally, energy storage can improve the resilience of the electrical grid, ensure reliable service, and decrease costs to ratepayers." (*Pennsylvania Energy Storage Assessment*, 2021)²

For these reasons, utilities in multiple states are now integrating customer-sited batteries into "Virtual Power Plants" - resources that can be remotely and rapidly discharged by the utilities as a distributed resource to reduce peak loads.³ We have not seen evidence that the Companies have given this option due consideration.

But utilities in other states are doing so. As of March, 2022, at least twelve states had programs to incentivize customer battery storage systems: California, Connecticut, Florida, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Maine.

All six New England states offer customer battery incentive programs. Although specific program details vary in each state, they share three common features:⁴

1. All programs offer participating customers performance payments through contracts with their electric utility, based on the utilities' ability to discharge the batteries during peak times.

2. All programs are deployed as "virtual power plants – that is, a system of aggregated distributed battery resources that can be dispatched by the utility in concert during peak demand hours to lower costs associated with serving regional demand peaks."⁵

3. All New England programs support customer resilience, enabling customers to use the batteries for back-up power during grid outages.

Customer-sited battery storage programs have been demonstrated to be cost-effective Reports filed by the Joint Intervenors' in this case (Andy McDonald) show that such programs offer desirable savings for the rate-paying customers. We cite the assessment for the Massachusetts ConnectedSolutions program which concluded that

"among the supply-side and demand-side measures reviewed in this report, customersited battery storage is by far the lowest priced new winter peaking resource now available to utilities."⁶

In an accompanying report, the Applied Economics Clinic ("AEC") reported that the Commercial & Industrial program's planned benefits exceeded costs by a ratio of 4:1.⁷ The residential battery program's planned benefits exceeded costs by a 2:1 ratio. As was noted above, GMP in Vermont reports ratepayer savings around \$3 million per year from their battery programs.

Although we can not be certain that a program which is cost-effective in Massachusetts will be equally effective in Kentucky, because there are clearly significant differences between the electricity systems in these regions, the experience in other states suggests that batteries used in virtual power plants represent an opportunity worthy of serious investigation. We submit that the PSC should instruct the Companies to do such investigation before approving expenditures for new fossil-fuel generation.

Using customer-sited batteries will help to meet the reliability and resilience standards established in SB4 for coal-plant retirements.

Customer-sited battery storage improves grid reliability by serving as a rapidly dispatchable resource for utilities during times of peak demand. Thousands of batteries distributed among

customer homes and businesses can be aggregated by the utility and operated as a virtual power plant to support the grid when needed. These same batteries can also supply rapid back-up power to customers during grid outages, further improving the reliability and resilience of the electricity system.

Combined solar and storage systems offer value to both the utility and customers. For the customer, a solar plus storage system provides greater resilience and increases the availability of the battery-solar system. (Since during a grid outage, a solar-only system ceases producing power for safety reasons, leaving the customer without power, which is a frustrating reality for many net metering customers).

In battery-only systems, the customer will have back-up power but be limited by the storage capacity of the battery. If the outage drags on long enough, eventually a battery can become discharged. Combining solar plus storage creates more resilient systems than battery only installations, as the solar array can recharge the batteries even when the grid is down, providing the customer with a limited but indefinite supply of electricity until the grid is repaired.

In conclusion, the Greater Louisville Sierra Club submits that LG&E and KU have not adequately made the case for building two large new greenhouse gas-emitting power plants, which may become stranded assets. The PSC should instruct the Companies to formulate a more effective DSM program to reduce load, and to also more aggressively pursue lower cost options such as renewables, solar plus storage, and other available strategies to meet and lower energy demand. Aging coal-fired plants should be retired rapidly. Such strategies can provide a reliable, resilient electric grid at a lower cost, and with less financial risk than the expensive proposals the Companies have submitted.



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

Dear Kentucky Public Service Commission,

We cannot lock ourselves into paying for 40 more years of natural gas when we should be well into our transition away from fossil fuels. Please approve the coal retirements and reject the proposals for two new large scale 40-year fossil fuel plants.

LG&E/KU customers like me have struggled with paying our energy bills or are affected by the air pollution from fossil fuel power plants. Investing in energy efficiency (DSM) instead will help lower the overall demand for energy while helping keep energy affordable for us Kentuckians.

We don't want or need new fossil fuel generation

We support closing coal plants but we absolutely do not want to replace them with expensive and polluting 40-year gas plants and their infrastructure. Before 40-year gas plants are even considered we need to expand efficiency programs, rooftop solar, utility scale solar, storage, and fully explore new capacity alternatives such as virtual power plants, joining regional grids. The companies' proposed energy efficiency proposals are inadequate. Kentucky has one of the poorest records in the country on energy efficiency in terms of residential energy efficiency programs. Kentuckians need Energy Efficiency programs that achieve at least 2-3% of load. We want a public commitment to ignore the companies' 1% cap on rooftop solar and to continue to support distributed resources after reaching that threshold. We want the companies to help customers invest in Energy

Efficiency, solar, and storage - and access IRA benefits outside of company programs: this means better policy advocacy.

Companies need to track need (energy burden), energy insecurity (arrearages and disconnections), and utility retrofits better - and make that data publicly available. The companies need to support energy efficiency financing programs that are maximally inclusive and do not neglect particular income groups. Support programs that address the problem of split incentives between landlords and tenants. The reach of the proposed low-income weatherization and efficiency programs is far too limited. They need to offer better value for rooftop solar

We need to lower pollution levels and threats of extreme temperatures and extreme weather events . These extremes threaten our health, agriculture, and economy. These threats are expensive and these costs need to be factored in.

Gas plants face carbon policy threats during their 40-year life cycle, increasing the risk of stranded assets (customers being on the hook to pay for gas plants that are no longer useful)/ bad debt for customers. The EPA is already proposing new pollution requirements for gas plants. Utilities should assume risk of fuel cost volatility, rather than passing costs through via the fuel adjustment charge

The state requires that utilities submit a 15-year plan for review by the Public Service Commission every 3 years. In the most recently submitted plan (2021) there was no mention of new gas plants. LG&E and KU need to take the regulatory planning process seriously and use the processes in place in planning for future capacity needs.

In addition to my public comment above, please see the comment submitted by Kentuckians for Energy Democracy for important data and evidence that supports my lived experience and concerns.



Comments on KU and LPE plans to close coal and gas-fired electrical generating facilities (Case number 2022-00402):

As a retired Physicist born to a family deeply involved in electrical power generation I have much experience in most factors involved in this project and also have been studying climate change or global warming for more than 15 years. This experience leads me to several conclusions about the KU-LGE proposal.

First, my position about climate change, or global warming, is similar to those enumerated by many other scientists. A few of these include Roy Spencer and John Christy at the University of Alabama Huntsville, former Undersecretary of Energy Stephan Koonin and recent Physics Nobel Prize Physicist John Clauser. K_over the last 80-160 years with the best data coming from satellite measurements begun in 1979. The trend from that data show about a 0.14 C increase per decade. The data show little correlation with Carbon Dioxide trends and no statistical temperature increase over the last 8 plus years. Thus, I conclude global temperature trends are not catastrophic. So, the efforts, as these companies plan, to eliminate the coal and gas-fired power plants is not warranted.

Second, the use of wind turbines and solar panels to provide electricity has been shown to be highly non-uniform and unreliable. Texas had serious electricity problems during a recent

winter cold spell which showed this reliability problem. Also, the life of these two sources of electricity is about 20-30 years. The solid waste from them cannot be recycled, the solar panels and turbines contain toxic metals, and the turbine towers cannot be removed economically.

Finally, the history of these type facilities in California and Europe suggest electricity cost will be about 35-45 cents per kilowatt-hour compared to the present cost in Kentucky of less than 12 cents per KWH. Such costs cannot be afforded by the majority of Kentucky residents. While the coal industry is in difficulty, the production of natural gas is robust and its use to produce electricity is easily done. It should remain as a (or the) major source of electricity production. Perhaps more thought should be given to a 60–80-year reliable source such as a nuclear power plant.

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

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
