As the Kentucky Public Service Commission deliberates on the above-referenced application for the retirement and replacement of four coal-fired electric generating units and three natural gas simple cycle units, we are writing to show our opposition to the proposal and believe that it should not be approved because it is not in the public interest.

The Harlan County Economic Development Authority is a sub-component unit of the Harlan County Fiscal Court with appointed representatives for various sectors in the community. Additionally, One Harlan County is a 501(c)(3) founded in 2016 to create jobs and economic growth in the community. Please consider this letter our submission for public comment on this case.

We are united in our feeling that the proposed retirement and replacement of four coal-fired electric generating units and three natural gas simple cycle units will potentially result in higher rates and poorer service to the customers of Kentucky Utilities (KU). The proposal presented by KU comes with a price tag of \$2.09 billion, which would ultimately be passed on to the ratepayer. Harlan County has some of the highest rates of poverty in the nation, and the increased cost due to the proposed retirement and replacement will only increase the burden of utility bills on Harlan Countians.

Additionally, Harlan County has a long-standing history of coal mining, which has been a significant source of employment and economic stability for our residents. The proposed retirement of these power plants would lead to immediate job losses and a subsequent decline in our local economy.

The livelihood of countless families in Harlan County relies heavily on the coal industry, from miners to truck drivers to the various businesses that support these operations. The sudden closure of coal-fired power plants would result in a severe loss of jobs and a subsequent ripple effect on other industries that depend on the purchasing power of these workers. Young people like me in Louisville, throughout Kentucky, across the United States and all over the world are extremely concerned about the havoc wreaked on our world, and our future in it, by the continued burning of fossil fuels. For decades, our Commonwealth has borne the brunt of the harm that the fossil fuel industry has caused through its extraction and burning of fossil fuels, always putting profits above the health of our people, communities and ecosystems. Today, Kentucky has been plunged into a series of crises due to overextraction and a changing climate. Mountaintop removal has forever altered the landscape of Eastern Kentucky and made communities already susceptible to flooding even more vulnerable. We simply cannot afford forty more years of fossil fuels. If anything, to have seriously mitigated the worst of the climate catastrophe that energy corporations have unleashed upon us, we should have phased them out forty years ago—when the fossil fuel giants and utility companies were already aware of their destructive properties but chose to continue promoting their use anyway to maximize profits. Instead, LG&E/KU have shown a total disregard for Kentuckians and our simple ambition to live out our days in peace with breathable air, drinkable water, an unpolluted environment and a livable climate.
