ORDER

On June 27, 2023, the Commission, on its own motion, opened an investigation into the jurisdictional status of Lindsey Enterprises, LLC (Lindsey Enterprises).¹ The Commission was made aware of complaints to Kentucky’s Office of the Attorney General concerning the termination of natural gas service to customers of Lindsey Enterprises in the Fords Branch area of Pike County, Kentucky. Additionally, the Commission received a copy of the letter sent by Lindsey Enterprises to a customer identifying the service provided to this customer as “farm tap gas service.” At that time, the Commission had no record of approving farm tap rates to be charged by Lindsey Enterprises. Since the inception of this matter, Lindsey Enterprises has responded to two requests for information.²

Commission Case No. 2023-00224³ and Case No. 2023-00225⁴ were initiated to investigate the reasonableness of the proposed tariffs submitted by Lindsey Enterprises. Final Orders were rendered in both matters on July 29, 2024, mandating Lindsey Enterprises to file new tariff sheets consistent with the final Orders.⁵ As of the date of this Order, Lindsey Enterprises has failed to file the requisite new tariff sheets setting forth the approved rates, charges, and modifications as ordered by the Commission.

On its own motion, the Commission finds that this case shall be held in abeyance for thirty days until the final Orders in Case No. 2023-00224 and Case No. 2023-00225 relating to the tariffs are satisfied. Upon satisfaction of those final Orders, this case will be returned to the Commission's active docket.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this case shall be held in abeyance for thirty days until the final Orders in Case No. 2023-00224 and Case No. 2023-00225, relating to the tariffs are satisfied.

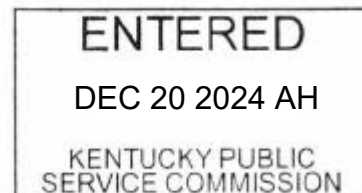
