Comments: My name is Patrick Mason, and I am a resident of Lexington, Kentucky, living less than five miles from the proposed project site. I am writing to express my concerns regarding the East Kentucky Power Cooperative's application for a solar facility in Fayette County (Case Number: 2024-00129). I strongly support the development of renewable energy sources like solar power. Transitioning to cleaner energy solutions is crucial to address climate change and ensure a sustainable future for our Commonwealth. However, it is critical to strike a balance between environmental goals and responsible land use practices. There are several concerning points to consider on the proposed solar facility's potential impact on Lexington's irreplaceable prime farmland. We have three to consider - farmland, the city's residents, and the precedent we set. The land targeted for this project is classified by the United States Department of Agriculture as "Prime Farmland," meaning it possesses the optimal combination of factors for producing high crop yields. Although this project is potentially funded by the Department of Agriculture, this is not a consideration in providing that project with monetary support. Therefore, it is incumbent on us to consider how the soil may or may not be recovered by a facility that plans to power "hundreds of

homes" for many years to come. Further, this project is not governed by local planning and zoning regulations, bypassing the wishes of Lexington residents who value this land for both agriculture and tourism purposes, making the community and region unique. This squarely prioritizes the interests of an external organization with no stake in us or our city's long-term development. Additionally, approving this project sets a worrying precedent for converting more workable farmland within city limits. Where will we draw the line? While I fully support the use of solar energy, I believe its implementation should be tailored to Lexington's specific needs. Here are some recommendations: A. Explore alternative locations for the solar facilities that do not involve converting productive farmland. (Brownfields, industrial areas, or rooftops could be suitable options.) B. Ensure the project aligns with existing and future urban growth plans for Lexington. C. Hold additional forums, especially with city leaders, planning experts, and the intervenors present, to gather feedback from residents and stakeholders throughout the planning process. By prioritizing responsible land use, we can leverage the benefits of solar energy while protecting the agricultural heritage that defines our city. Thank you for your time and consideration.
