alternatives such as virtual power plants, joining regional grids. Kentuckians need Energy Efficiency programs that acheive at least 2-3% of load.

We want the companies to help customers invest in Energy Efficiency, solar and storage -- and access IRA benefits outside of company programs: this means better policy advocacy.

cheaper in the long run and will help lower the overall demand for energy while helping keep energy affordable for us Kentuckians.




