Barren County is home to diverse wildlife, agricultural lands, and scenic vistas that contribute to both our quality of life and local economy. A massive solar development of this scale could disrupt local ecosystems, agricultural activities, and the county's character. The loss of valuable farmland and natural landscapes would be a lasting blow to the community's heritage and future prosperity.

In light of these concerns, I respectfully request that the Public Service Commission deny approval for this solar project until proper zoning regulations are established and comprehensive community input is obtained. The well-being of Barren County's residents, the preservation of our land and resources, and the integrity of our community should be the foremost priorities in making decisions of this nature.
