<u>ORDER</u>

On June 11, 2024, Warren County Water District (Warren District) filed a notice of intent to file an application for a declaratory order regarding whether a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) would be required for the construction of certain sewer collection and transmission facilities. In the notice of intent, Warren District stated that it would file its application no later than July 15, 2024.

The Commission, on its own motion, finds the above-style case should be dismissed without prejudice as more than six months has passed, and no application has been filed. Warren District should refile its case when it is ready to proceed forward with its application.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The above-styled case is dismissed without prejudice.
- 2. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
