#### ORDER

On December 4, 2024, Fountain Run Water District #1 (Fountain Run District #1) tendered an application requesting approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068.<sup>1</sup> On December 12, 2024, Fountain Run District #1 submitted further documentation to correct the filing deficiencies, and the application was deemed filed as of December 12, 2024.

#### LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.015, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district has the authority to increase its rate commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water district must file, within the statutory and regulatory deadlines, a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

#### DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Fountain Run District #1 purchases water from Glasgow Water Company (Glasgow). Glasgow notified Fountain Run District #1 that its wholesale rate would increase from \$1.95 per 1,000 gallons to \$2.01 per 1,000 gallons, effective November 30, 2024.<sup>2</sup> Fountain Run District #1 proposed to increase the water rates to its customers effective December 1, 2024, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Glasgow.

#### Unaccounted-for Water Loss

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2021 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Fountain Run District #1 reported a water loss of 28.1364 percent.<sup>3</sup> In its 2022 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Fountain Run District #1 reported a water loss of 21.9626 percent.<sup>4</sup> In its 2023 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Fountain Run District #1 reported a water loss of 15.9395 percent.<sup>5</sup> Fountain Run District #1's three-year water loss average is

22.0128 percent.<sup>6</sup> The annual cost of Fountain Run District #1's total water loss using the three-year average is \$23,049.37.<sup>7</sup>

The Commission is placing greater emphasis on monitoring utilities that consistently exceed the 15 percent unaccounted-for water loss threshold. To address water loss issues, the Commission strongly encourages water districts to pursue reasonable actions to reduce its unaccounted-for water loss. Here, the Commission recognizes the improvements made by Fountain Run District #1 and encourages it to continue to actively address water loss issues with infrastructure planning and improvements.

## Financial Condition and Rates

Based on a review of Commission records, Fountain Run District #1 has not sought a general base rate adjustment since 2018. In 2018, Fountain Run District #1's filed an alternative rate adjustment, Case No. 2018-00205,8 using 2017 as the test year that resulted in an increase of \$74,272, or 32.27 percent. The 2018 rate increase was phased in over a two-year period. No other rate increases have occurred since that time.

As documented in annual and audit reports filed with the Commission, Fountain Run District #1's rate based income (adjusted net income minus principal payments) was negative for the years 2019 through 2022 with a positive rate based income in 2023. Fountain Run District #1's cash basis income (rate based income plus depreciation

expense) was positive for the years 2019-2023. Fountain Run District #1's financial snapshot for 2019 through 2023 is presented below.

Fountain Run District #1's negative rate based income for four out of five years leads the Commission to conclude that Fountain Run District #1 should file an application for a general base rate adjustment or an alternative rate adjustment by July 31, 2025, using 2024 as the test year, to ensure that its revenue is sufficient to support adequate and reliable service or present sufficient proof as to why such an adjustment is unnecessary.

#### Purchased Water Adjustment Factor

In its application, Fountain Run District #1 proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.08 per 1,000 gallons. During the 12 months ended September 30, 2024, Fountain Run District #1 purchased 52,094,000 gallons of water from Glasgow and sold 41,059,100 gallons of water to its customers. The increase in the cost of purchased water from Glasgow is \$3,125.64, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.08 per 1,000 gallons.

The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.08 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A, and the rates as proposed by Fountain Run District #1, and set forth in Appendix B to this Order, are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved for water service rendered by Fountain Run District #1 on and after December 1, 2024. Fountain Run District #1's proposed rates are fair, just and reasonable because the rates are supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Fountain Run District #1's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.015.

On or before July 31, 2025, Fountain Run District #1 should file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, or an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, or in the alternative, file a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and revenues explaining the reasons why no modifications are necessary.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.08 per 1,000 gallons is approved.

- 2. The rates proposed by Fountain Run District #1 are approved.
- 3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Fountain Run District #1 on and after December 1, 2024.
- 4. Within 20 days of the date of service of this Order, Fountain Run District #1 shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.
- 5. On or before July 31, 2025, Fountain Run District #1 shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, or an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, or in the alternative, file a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and revenues explaining the reasons why no modifications are necessary. Any filing for a rate adjustment filed under KRS 278.023 does not relieve Fountain Run District #1 from this requirement.
  - 6. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
