ORDER

On June 5, 2024, Fleming County Water Association, Inc. (Fleming County Water) tendered an application requesting approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.012 and 807 KAR 5:068. On June 5, 2024, the Commission notified Fleming County Water that its application was rejected for certain filing deficiencies. On June 12, 2024, Fleming County Water submitted further documentation to correct the filing deficiencies, and the application was deemed filed as of June 12, 2024.

LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.012, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water association increases its rates, the water association has the authority to increase its rate commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water association must file, within the statutory and regulatory deadlines, a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Fleming County Water purchases water from Greater Fleming County Regional Water Commission (Greater Fleming), Rowan Water Inc. (Rowan Water) and the Electric Plant Board, city of Vanceburg (Vanceburg). Greater Fleming notified Fleming County Water that its wholesale rate would increase from \$2.00 per 1,000 gallons to \$2.07 per 1,000 gallons, effective July 1, 2024. Fleming County Water proposes to increase the water rates to its customers effective July 1, 2024, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Greater Fleming. Rowan Water and Vanceburg did not propose any rate changes.

Unaccounted-for Water Loss

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2021 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Fleming County Water reported a water loss of 11.0049 percent.² In its 2022 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Fleming County Water reported a water loss of 9.2007 percent.³ In its 2023 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Fleming County Water reported a water loss of 8.2463 percent.⁴ Fleming County Water's three-year water loss average is

9.4840 percent.⁵ The approximate cost of Fleming County Water's total water loss using the three-year average water loss percentage is \$64,070.01.⁶

Financial Condition and Rates

Based on a review of Commission records, Fleming County Water has never sought a general base rate adjustment. Fleming County Water's only rate increases since 2004 have occurred as a condition for federal financing of a construction project in accordance with KRS 278.023,⁷ financing cases,⁸ purchased water adjustment cases,⁹ and rate adjustments to service charges.¹⁰ In accordance with the provisions of

KRS 278.023, the Commission's review of such applications is a limited review that does not assess a utility's total financial stability and operational viability.

As a result of the lack of a general base rate adjustment, the Commission has not had an opportunity to perform a comprehensive review of Fleming County Water's financial records and operational structure. In Case No. 2019-00041, the Commission discussed the problems that can occur when utilities avoid a comprehensive review of their financial records and operational practices by relying solely on less comprehensive cases to increase rates.¹¹ A key recommendation from that proceeding was that water associations should monitor the sufficiency of their base rates closely and, in general, apply for base rate adjustments on a more frequent basis.¹²

As documented in annual and audit reports filed with the Commission, Fleming County Water's rate-based income (adjusted net income minus debt service) was negative in each of the years 2019 through 2023.¹³ Cash basis income (rate-based income plus depreciation) averaged 58 percent of depreciation for the five-year period, as shown in the table below. The Commission notes that while reported water loss is significantly under 15 percent each year, the combined water loss percentage (system use percentage plus water loss percentage) averaged 25.30 percent for the five-year period.

Because Fleming County Water has incurred negative rate based income for each of the past five years, the Commission concludes that Fleming County Water should file an application for a general base rate adjustment or an alternative rate adjustment on or before July 25, 2025, based upon a 2024 test year, to ensure that its revenue is sufficient to support adequate and reliable service.

Purchased Water Adjustment Factor

In its application, Fleming County Water proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons. During the 12 months ended March 31, 2024, Fleming County Water purchased 314,429,000 gallons of water from Greater Fleming, 11,146,800 gallons of water from Rowan Water and 2,289,500 gallons of water from Vanceburg and sold 253,433,090 gallons of water to its customers. The increase in the cost of purchased

water from Greater Fleming is \$22,010, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons. No rate changes occurred from Rowan Water and Vanceburg

The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A and the rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved for water service rendered by Fleming County Water on and after July 1, 2024, because the rates are supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Fleming County Water's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.012.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons is approved.
 - 2. The rates proposed by Fleming County Water are approved.
- 3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Fleming County Water on and after July 1, 2024.
- 4. Within 20 days of the date of service of this Order, Fleming County Water shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.
- 5. On or before July 31, 2025, Fleming County Water shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, or an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, or in the alternative, a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and revenues explaining the reasons why no modifications are necessary. Any filing for a rate adjustment filed under KRS 278.023 does not relieve Fleming County Water from this requirement.

6.	This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
