Case: Wood Duck 2024-00337

RE: Requesting certification from independent project engineer and Juergen Fehr on batteries

To Whom It May Concern:

Representatives from Geenex/Wood Duck Solar told local media that this project will not have any batteries. Also, we have heard that Kelley Pope from Wood Duck and Gregory Dutton from Frost Brown Todd, Attorneys at law, met with representatives at Mammoth Cave and assured them that there will be "no batteries."

We do not believe this statement and ask the PSC/Siting Board to seek and provide verification from **a state certified engineer to review the project** and confirm without a doubt that the project does not contain batteries or lithium or any type of power storage or any type of batteries used to operate the tracking systems and any other batteries.

Additionally, we are requesting **a certified letter from the owner of Geenex, Juergen Fehr** that he acknowledges that the project does not and will not have **any type of batteries or energy storage systems anywhere** in the entire project.

Wood Duck does not have any assets in Kentucky and no experience in development, so we believe the parent company should provide certification.


We believe there are batteries because their unrecorded leases refer to batteries, the application refers to underground and storage systems, and calls for 35 inverters and DC power must be stored to convert it to AC energy, the interconnectivity reports completed by PJM reference "Stored generating facility."

If, indeed there are ANY batteries, this project **should stop immediately** because they have lied to the public and this lie has many substantial implications including the concerns by Mammoth Cave National Park and we support the cave and their efforts to protect the project area.

It is wrong to allow Wood Duck to mitigate this issue when the community has not had an opportunity to review the development and believe the truth has not been provided. Perhaps an independent engineer can set the record straight and a letter from Fehr will help residents should batteries be discovered after the fact.

With these 2 statements of certification, we may find the truth. Thank you for your consideration and assistance.
