ORDER

On December 31, 2024, Navitas KY NG, LLC (Navitas) filed a motion, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, and KRS 61.878, requesting that the Commission grant confidential treatment for five years for invoices received from third-party suppliers submitted as part of its supplemental responses to Commission Staff's First Request for Information, Item 4, in Case No. 2023-00428.¹

On February 28, 2025, Navitas filed a motion seeking confidential treatment for an Excel file containing pricing and volume information, supplier names, and transaction details, and for contracts for the purchase of liquefied natural gas between Navitas and Kinetrex, which Navitas submitted with its responses to Commission Staff's First Request for Information issued in this case. Navitas requested that confidential treatment be afforded to the Excel file for a period of five years and to the Kinetrex contracts for an indefinite period of time.

In support of the motions, Navitas argued that the referenced materials contain sensitive and confidential business information, the disclosure of which could give

Navitas's competitors an unfair competitive advantage and impact the execution of its business strategy, ultimately resulting in a negative impact on customers.

Having considered the motion and the material at issue, the Commission finds that material is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary, the release of which may place Navitas at an unfair competitive disadvantage and thus meets the criteria for confidential treatment. Accordingly, the Commission further finds that the material should be exempted from public disclosure pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, and KRS 61.87(1)(c)(1).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Navitas's December 31, 2024 motion for confidential treatment is granted.
2. Navitas's February 28, 2025 motion for confidential treatment is granted.
3. The material subject to the December 31, 2024 motion shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for five years or until further Order of this Commission.
4. With the exception of the Kinetrex contracts, the material subject to the February 28, 2025 motion shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for five years or until further Order of this Commission.
5. The Kinetrex contracts subject to the February 28, 2025 motion shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for an indefinite period of time or until further Order of this Commission.
6. Use of the designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order in any Commission proceeding shall comply with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13(9).

7. If the designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order becomes publicly available or no longer qualifies for confidential treatment, Navitas shall inform the Commission and file with the Commission an unredacted copy of the designated material.

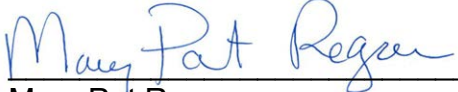
8. If a nonparty to this proceeding requests to inspect the material granted confidential treatment by this Order and the period during which the material has been granted confidential treatment has not expired, Navitas shall have 20 days from receipt of written notice of the request to demonstrate that the material still falls within the exclusions from disclosure requirements established in KRS 61.878. If Navitas is unable to make such demonstration, the requested material shall be made available for inspection. Otherwise, the Commission shall deny the request for inspection.

9. The Commission shall not make the requested material available for inspection for 30 days from the date of service of an Order finding that the material no longer qualifies for confidential treatment in order to allow Navitas to seek a remedy afforded by law.

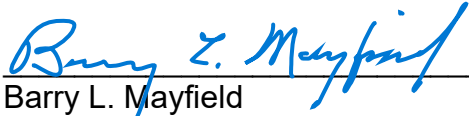
