Comments: I have the following comments on the proposal from LG&E: The applicant has not considered public opposition to data center growth, as evidenced by the cancellation of recent data center proposals in Oldham County, and growing opposition to a data center proposal in Metro Louisville. The application has ignored the democratically enacted Louisville Metro Council resolution that sets a goal of achieving a 100 percent sustainable electricity supply by the year 2040. The current CPCN, if approved, would render that goal impossible, contrary to the express wishes of the residents of Metro Louisville. LG&E has not conducted an open-bid request for proposals for sustainable fuel alternatives such as solar, wind and or hydro generation

with battery backup. The current CPCN application creates a real and present risk of creating excess generating capacity and stranded assets for which ratepayers will be obligated to pay over the next 40 years. The LG&E CPCN application should be denied, because it is premature and is based on a rushed analysis. There is plenty of time for LG&E to review and correct its analysis and reapply with a more complete and accurate analysis and with proper consideration for ratepayers express desires to achieve a greater mix of sustainable energy sources.
