

The Kentucky Laborers District Council wishes to express its support for the proposed 106-MW Summer Shade Solar project (Case No. 2025-00064) in Metcalfe County. This solar facility will provide employment opportunities for hundreds of Kentucky residents.

The proposed project will also provide good paying middle class jobs as the company behind the project is committed to utilizing prevailing wages for all the construction trades jobs. Workers on the site will be earning wages significantly above and beyond the typical hourly wage rate paid for a job in Metcalfe County.
