Reject the Relief from Merger Commitment Regarding LG&E and KU Foundation. The desire to reduce overhead is admirable, but the merger will make it more difficult for Kentucky based organizations to apply for assistance from the resulting merged foundation.

Approve the Request for Deviation from 807 KAR 5:041. Section 7 Voltmeter Requirements. The alternative proposed by KU meets the goal of the regulation.

Reject the Adjustment of Electric Rates. The inflationary costs that KU references in the filing do not apply in full to the costs to provide service for KU. Costs for fuel, salaries, are flat or down since the last filing. KU should be able to take advantage of these flat costs to generate and deliver power without a significant increase. While KU should be afforded a reasonable opportunity to earn a fair return, the commission is not required to give KU a guaranteed opportunity, nor is the commission required to give KU a generous return. A reasonable opportunity to earn a fair return does not justify the tariffs presented in this application.

There are many residents, including myself, under your jurisdiction using LGE and KU utilities. Many are unable to pay their bills and choose between heat/air conditioning and food or drugs. Many have to set up an account to pay debt for utilities which they can never afford as well. Those who are unable to qualify for assistance and yet are still struggling are affected greatly. As a single, retired widow, and for those of us on a fixed income, the rate increase that has been proposed, as well as the subsequent increases, is literally causing excessive suffering to your residents. I understand that there is an increased demand for investment in upgrades to accommodate greater needs for utilities (especially as more data centers are created in our areas which exponentially

increase such demands). The cost for these increased demands should be covered by those centers causing such costs, not the residents who are maximally strained already with such high costs of utilities that exist today. Perhaps the utility companies can seek out greater efficiency with smart grid technology, operational optimization, reducing operational costs, streamlining work orders for efficiency, being proactive with preventative maintenance, upgraded infrastructure, and use of AI, as opposed to taxing its consumers with the costs of inefficiency. My June bills for LGE and KU totaled \$288.05. That is ever increasing and *unaffordable* on a fixed income, particularly after loosing my spouse causing my taxes to substantially increased going from married to single status as well as loosing half of our Social Security income. I urge you to reconsider acceptance of the proposed rates and finding a way to substancially reduce it.
