

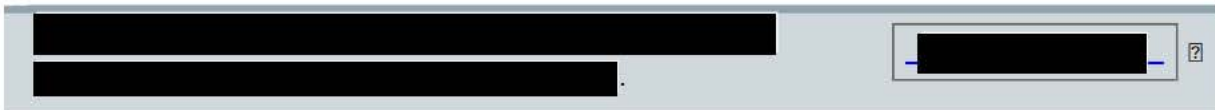

Dear Kentucky Public Service Commission,

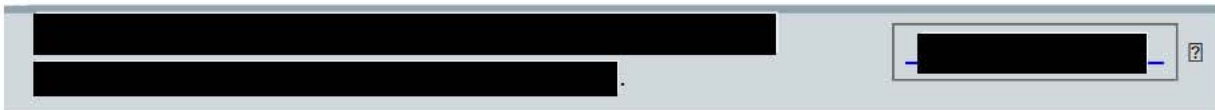
