ORDER

Kentucky Power Company (Kentucky Power) has applied to the Commission pursuant to KRS 278.018(6) for an Order to be issued approving a written agreement between Kentucky Power and Grayson Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation (Grayson RECC) for Grayson RECC to serve a customer currently located within the certified territory of Kentucky Power in Carter County, Kentucky.¹ The customer is currently without service and is located within Kentucky Power's certified territory.²

To adequately serve the customer, Kentucky Power would have to extend its existing distribution facilities approximately 320 feet, plus an additional 70-foot service drop, which would cost the customer approximately \$400.³ Grayson RECC, however, would only have to extend its distribution facilities approximately 294 feet, and can provide

service at no cost to the customer.⁴ The customer whose property is the subject of the agreement has consented in writing to take retail electric service from Grayson RECC.⁵ The customer is already a customer of Grayson RECC so the transfer of service for this customer would create billing efficiencies.⁶ Grayson RECC and Kentucky Power agreed that nothing in the agreement shall be deemed a change in the boundary line between the certified territories of Grayson RECC and Kentucky Power.⁷

LEGAL STANDARD

In order to encourage the orderly development of retail electric service, to avoid wasteful duplication of distribution facilities, to avoid unnecessary encumbering of the landscape, to prevent the waste of materials and natural resources, and to minimize disputes between retail electric suppliers which may result in inconvenience, diminished efficiency and higher costs in serving the consumer, Kentucky's legislature divided the state into geographical areas, and established within each area which retail electric supplier is to provide the retail electric service.⁸ No retail electric service supplier may furnish retail electric service in the certified territory of another retail electric supplier.⁹ However, a retail electric supplier may contract with another retail electric supplier for the purpose of allocating territories and consumers and designating which territories and consumers are to be served by which retail electric supplier. Such a contract between

retail electric suppliers must be approved by the Commission, and the Commission shall approve such a contract if the Commission finds that the contract will promote the purposes of KRS 278.016 and will provide adequate and reasonable service to all areas and consumers affected by the contract.¹⁰

DISCUSSION


Having considered the evidence tendered by the parties and reviewed the Commission finds that the agreement will promote the purposes of KRS 278.016. The extension of Grayson RECC's current service facilities to the customer is consistent with the orderly development of retail electric service, will not result in wasteful duplication, and will not unnecessarily encumber the landscape of the Commonwealth. Moreover, the agreement demonstrates that Grayson RECC will provide adequate, reliable, and reasonable service to the Customer. In reviewing the application, the parties have demonstrated that the expense to provide service will be lower to the customer. The customer is served by Grayson RECC on the property and service by Grayson RECC will result in billing efficiencies and lessen customer confusion. In addition, Grayson RECC will be able to provide service within the normal, ordinary course of business.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:


1. The contract between Kentucky Power and Grayson RECC is approved by the Commission.
