ORDER

On June 17, 2025, Duke Energy Kentucky, Inc. (Duke Kentucky) filed its application with the Commission seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) to authorize it to bid on two franchises offered by the city of Independence, Kentucky, one for electric and one for natural gas transmission and distribution service. Duke Kentucky provided a copy of Ordinance No. 2025-O-09 and Ordinance No. 2025-O-08, which authorized granting a franchise for the sale and distribution of electricity and natural gas within the city of Independence boundary.¹ Ordinance No. 2025-O-09 and Ordinance No. 2025-O-08 were approved on June 2, 2025, and public notice of the sale of each franchise was published on June 5, 2025.²

Sections 163 and 164 of the Kentucky Constitution and KRS Chapter 96 authorize municipal corporations to require public utilities, including non-governmental providers of electricity within the municipal corporations' boundaries, to operate under franchise agreements and to grant utilities the right to use public right-of-way on reasonable and

necessary conditions. Under the provisions of KRS 278.020(5), no utility may apply for a franchise from any governmental agency until it has obtained a CPCN from this Commission based on our finding that there is a need and demand for the service sought to be rendered.

In light of the city of Independence's ordinance creating a franchise for electric and natural gas transmission and distribution service, the Commission determines that there is evidence of a need and demand for electric and natural gas transmission and distribution service in the above-mentioned city. Since the Commission's authority in such matters is limited by statute to finding only whether there is a need and demand for the service sought to be rendered, no finding or determination is made as to the qualifications of the bidder, the validity of any of the provisions of the franchises offered by said city, or the manner in which any franchise fees are to be treated for rate purposes.

The Commission directs Duke Kentucky to the Commission's July 22, 2021 Order in Case No. 2020-00085³ regarding filings with the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Duke Kentucky is granted a CPCN that authorizes it to bid on the two franchises offered by the city of Independence, Kentucky, for electric and natural gas transmission and distribution service as set forth herein.
2. If Duke Kentucky is not the successful bidder of either or both franchises, Duke Kentucky shall file with the Commission, within ten days of the award of any

franchise at issue, a written notice stating that Duke Kentucky was not the successful bidder.

3. If Duke Kentucky is the successful bidder of either or both franchises, Duke Kentucky shall file with the Commission, within ten days of the award of any franchise at issue, a copy of the executed franchise agreement and a statement disclosing the amount of the initial franchise fee.


4. If Duke Kentucky is the successful bidder of either or both franchises, Duke Kentucky shall file with the Commission, within ten days of an increase or decrease in the amount of the initial franchise fee set forth in the franchise agreement, documentation setting forth the revised fee.


5. Any documents filed pursuant to ordering paragraphs 2, 3, or 4 of this Order shall reference the number of this case and shall be electronically submitted via the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System.


6. This Order shall not be construed as granting a CPCN to construct utility facilities in said city.

7. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
