ORDER

On September 15, 2025, Christian County Water District (Christian District) applied for approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure set forth in KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068.

LEGAL STANDARD

In accordance with KRS 278.015, when a wholesale supplier selling water to a water district increases its rates, the water district has the authority to increase its rate commensurate with the wholesale supplier. The water district must file, within the statutory and regulatory deadlines, a copy of the notice from the wholesale supplier showing the increase in the wholesale rate, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rate adjustment. The Commission shall approve the filing by order after the above documents are filed.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Christian District purchases water from Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority (Hopkinsville), Barkley Lake Water District (Barkley Lake District), and Todd County Water District (Todd District). On August 28, 2025, Hopkinsville filed revised tariff

documents¹ with the Commission to change its wholesale rate design and to increase its wholesale rates to Christian District.² Hopkinsville proposed to change its rate design from a 3-tier rate schedule using cubic feet to a single volumetric rate using gallons.³ Hopkinsville notified Christian District that its wholesale rate would change from \$2.96 per 100 cubic feet for the First 3,000 cubic feet (\$3.957 per 1,000 gallons),⁴ \$2.59 per 100 cubic feet for the Next 3,000 cubic feet (\$3.463 per 1,000 gallons),⁵ and \$1.88 per 100 cubic feet for All Over 6,000 cubic feet (\$2.513 per 1,000 gallons),⁶ to \$3.07 per 1,000 gallons, effective October 1, 2025.⁷ Christian District proposed to increase the water rates to its customers effective October 1, 2025, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Hopkinsville. Barkley Lake District and Todd District proposed no wholesale rate changes.

<u>Unaccounted-for Water Loss</u>

Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 6(3), states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of the total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. In its 2022 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Christian District reported a water loss of 16.3168 percent.⁸ In its 2023 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Christian District reported a water loss of 12.8706 percent.⁹ In its 2024 Annual Report filed with the Commission, Christian District reported a water loss of 16.8617 percent.¹⁰ Christian District's three-year water loss average is 15.3497 percent.¹¹ The cost of Christian District's total water loss using a three-year average is approximately \$225,876.61.¹²

The Commission is placing greater emphasis on monitoring utilities that consistently exceed the 15 percent unaccounted-for water loss threshold. The Commission encourages Christian District to continue to pursue reasonable actions to reduce its unaccounted-for water loss.

Financial Condition and Rates

In Case No. 2019-00041, the Commission discussed the problems that can occur when utilities intentionally avoid a review of their financial records by relying solely on financing cases to increase rates. A key recommendation from that proceeding was that water districts should monitor the sufficiency of their base rates closely and, in general, apply for base rate adjustments on a more frequent basis. Based on a review of Commission records, Christian District last sought a general base rate adjustment in 2021, In Case No. 2021-00369, which became final on March 17, 2022, and reflected a required revenue increase of \$189,995 or 5.08 percent. Based upon a review of the annual and audit reports filed with the Commission, Christian District's rate-based income, or adjusted net income minus principal payments, was negative from 2020 through 2024 but improved following the rate increase. Cash basis income, or rate-based income plus depreciation, was positive in all years. A chart summarizing cash basis and rate-based income is presented below.

Given this information, Christian District shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076 to ensure that its revenue is sufficient to support adequate and reliable service, or, in the alternative, file a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and revenues and a statement of the reasons why a rate case is not necessary, no later than July 31, 2026, based on 2025 financial performance. Any filing for a rate adjustment filed under KRS 278.023 does not relieve or provide Christian District from this requirement.

Purchased Water Adjustment Factor

In its application, Christian District proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.62 per 1,000 gallons.¹⁷ During the 12 months ended July 31, 2025, Christian District purchased 414,444,900 gallons of water from Hopkinsville, 69,177,900 gallons of water from Barkley Lake District, and 1,429,200 gallons of water from Todd District.¹⁸ Christian District sold 374,057,805 gallons of water to its customers.¹⁹ The increase in the cost of purchased water from Hopkinsville is approximately \$230,792.09 resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.62 per 1,000 gallons. No rate changes occurred from Barkley Lake District or Todd District.

The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.62 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A and the rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved for water service rendered by Christian District on and after October 1, 2025, because the rates are supported by evidence of the increase in rates from Christian District's wholesale water supplier and the volume of purchased water used to calculate the rates in accordance with KRS 278.015.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.62 per 1,000 gallons is approved.
 - 2. The rates proposed by Christian District are approved.

- 3. The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Christian District on and after October 1, 2025.
- 4. Within 20 days of the date of service of this Order, Christian District shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.
- 5. On or before July 31, 2026, Christian District shall file an application for a general rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 16, an application for an alternative rate adjustment pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, or, in the alternative, a formal motion with a detailed analysis of its rates and revenues explaining the reasons why no modifications are necessary. Any filing for a rate adjustment filed under KRS 278.023 does not relieve Christian District from this requirement.
 - 6. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
