To the Commissioners of the Kentucky Public Service Commission:

I am a resident of Kentucky and a member-owner/ratepayer of Shelby Energy Cooperative. I am writing to formally log my objection to the massive 800-megawatt energy allocation being proposed for the PowerHouse and Poe Companies data center on Greens Bottom Road in Carrollton [weku.org].

While the physical site is slated to connect to Kentucky Utilities (KU), an energy demand of this astronomical scale impacts the entire regional transmission grid, directly threatening Shelby Energy members. I request the Commission halt infrastructure approvals for this project based on the following:

1. Severe Strain on the Interconnected Regional Grid

An 800-megawatt draw is large enough to power over half a million homes. The Kentucky grid operates as an interconnected ecosystem. Dropping a demand of this magnitude into the region threatens generation capacity and grid reliability during peak winter and summer events. As a Shelby Energy member, I am deeply concerned that this project increases the risk of regional rolling blackouts or emergency grid failures that will affect my home.

2. Increased Wholesale Power Costs for Co-ops

Shelby Energy purchases its power from East Kentucky Power Cooperative (EKPC). When massive hyperscale data centers rapidly drain regional capacity, wholesale electricity prices spike across the board. Under Governor Andy Beshear's Executive Order 2026-494, the PSC is mandated to protect Kentucky consumers from data centers driving up ratepayer burdens [weku.org]. The PSC must investigate how this massive draw will impact broader wholesale market prices for neighboring co-ops like Shelby Energy and EKPC.

3. Lack of Local Oversight and Premature Utility Commitments

The developers currently only hold "purchase options" on this un-zoned land, and 342 acres of the site are still owned by the public. Allowing utilities to advance infrastructure planning or capacity allocation for a speculative project that lacks final local real estate deeds and zoning oversight creates systemic risk for the entire Kentucky utility landscape.

Formal Request for Action:

I urge the Commission to uphold the consumer-protection principles of Executive Order 2026-494 [weku.org]. Please initiate a comprehensive regional grid impact study regarding this 800-megawatt data center before any transmission or capacity agreements are finalized, and ensure that the interests of surrounding co-op members are legally protected.
