ORDER

On June 12, 2026, Kentucky Power Company (Kentucky Power) filed a motion for leave to deviate from Section 8(2) of 807 KAR 5:001 as well as an application with the Commission seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) to authorize it to bid on a franchise offered by the city of Prestonsburg, Kentucky, for electric transmission and distribution service. Kentucky Power provided a copy of Ordinance No. 08-2026, which authorized granting a franchise for the sale and distribution of electricity within the city of Prestonsburg boundary.<sup>1</sup> Ordinance No. 08-2026 was approved on May 29, 2026, and public notice of the sale of franchise was published on June 3, 2026.<sup>2</sup>

Sections 163 and 164 of the Kentucky Constitution and KRS Chapter 96 authorize municipal corporations to require public utilities, including non-governmental providers of electricity within the municipal corporations' boundaries, to operate under franchise agreements and to grant utilities the right to use public right-of-way on reasonable and

necessary conditions. Under the provisions of KRS 278.020(5), no utility may apply for a franchise from any governmental agency until it has obtained a CPCN from this Commission based on our finding that there is a need and demand for the service sought to be rendered.

In light of the city of Prestonsburg's ordinance creating a franchise for electric transmission and distribution service, the Commission determines that there is evidence of a need and demand for electric transmission and distribution service in the above-mentioned city. Since the Commission's authority in such matters is limited by statute to finding only whether there is a need and demand for the service sought to be rendered, no finding or determination is made as to the qualifications of the bidder, the validity of any of the provisions of the franchise offered by said city, or the manner in which any franchise fee is to be treated for rate purposes.

Pursuant to Section 22 of 807 KAR 5:001, the Commission finds good cause that Kentucky Power's Motion for Leave to Deviate should be granted.

The Commission directs Kentucky Power to the Commission's July 22, 2021 Order in Case No. 2020-00085<sup>3</sup> regarding filings with the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Kentucky Power's motion for leave to deviate from the timing requirements set forth in Section 8(2) of 807 KAR 5:001 is granted.

2. Kentucky Power is granted a CPCN that authorizes it to bid on a franchise offered by the city of Prestonsburg, Kentucky, for electric transmission and distribution service.

3. If Kentucky Power is not the successful bidder, Kentucky Power shall file with the Commission, within ten days of the award of the franchise at issue, a written notice stating that Kentucky Power was not the successful bidder.

4. If Kentucky Power is the successful bidder, Kentucky Power shall file with the Commission, within ten days of the award of the franchise at issue, a copy of the executed franchise agreement and a statement disclosing the amount of the initial franchise fee.

5. If Kentucky Power is the successful bidder, Kentucky Power shall file with the Commission, within ten days of an increase or decrease in the amount of the initial franchise fee set forth in the franchise agreement, documentation setting forth the revised fee.

6. Any documents filed pursuant to ordering paragraphs 2, 3, or 4 of this Order shall reference the number of this case and shall be electronically submitted via the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System.

7. This Order shall not be construed as granting a CPCN to construct utility facilities in said city.


8. This case is closed and removed from the Commission's docket.
