ORDER

On July 31, 2026, Kentucky Power Company (Kentucky Power) filed its application pursuant to KRS 278.020(1) and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 15, requesting a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) to expand and upgrade portions of the Allen Station electric transmission grid located in Floyd County Kentucky.

In its application, Kentucky Power requested a deviation to satisfy the filing requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 15(2)(d)(2). The specifications submitted in Exhibit 5 are demonstrative of the components that make up the general arrangement drawing of the proposed station and are standard across the American Electric Power (AEP) system.¹ However, because the specifications for the standard transmission equipment provided in Exhibit 5 were designed by the manufacturer, Kentucky Power was unable to provide specifications signed or stamped by an engineer registered in Kentucky.²

The Commission finds that the deviation pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 22, with respect to Exhibit 5, should be granted to satisfy the requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 15(2)(d)(2).

The Commission also finds that a procedural schedule should be established for the orderly processing of this case. The procedural schedule is attached as an Appendix to this Order.

Additionally, any hearing scheduled in this matter shall be held on the designated day or days and continued until called from the bench by the presiding officer. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 2, if the hearing is not concluded on the designated day, the hearing may be continued upon verbal announcement by the presiding officer. A verbal announcement made by the presiding officer shall be proper notice of the continued hearing. Hearings are held in the Richard Raff Hearing Room at the offices of the Public Service Commission at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky. Witnesses who sponsor schedules, testimony, or responses to requests for information are expected to participate in person at a hearing.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The deviation to accept Exhibit 5 to satisfy the requirements of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 15(2)(d)(2) is granted.
2. The procedural schedule set forth in the Appendix to this Order shall be followed.
3. Kentucky Power shall respond to all requests for information propounded by Commission Staff, whether identified on the procedural schedule or otherwise, as provided in those requests.

4. Any party filing a paper with the Commission shall file an electronic copy in accordance with the electronic filing procedures set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 8. Electronic documents shall be in portable document format (PDF), shall be searchable, and shall be appropriately bookmarked. The Commission directs the parties to the Commission's July 22, 2021 Order in Case No. 2020-00085³ regarding filings with the Commission.

5. As set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 4(11), a person requesting permissive intervention in a Commission proceeding is required to demonstrate either (1) a special interest in the proceeding that is not otherwise adequately represented in the case, or (2) that intervention is likely to present issues or develop facts that will assist the Commission in fully considering the matter without unduly complicating or disrupting the proceedings. Therefore, any person requesting to intervene in a Commission proceeding must state with specificity the person's special interest that is not otherwise adequately represented, or the issues and facts that the person will present that will assist the Commission in fully considering the matter. A mere recitation of the quantity of the utility service consumed by the movant or a general statement regarding a potential impact of possible modification of rates will not be deemed sufficient to establish a special interest.

6. Any motion to intervene filed after the date established in the procedural schedule shall also show good cause for being untimely. If the untimely motion is granted, the movant shall accept and abide by the existing procedural schedule.

7. Witnesses who sponsor schedules, testimony, or responses to requests for information shall participate in person at any hearing scheduled in this matter.

8. At any public hearing in this matter, neither opening statements nor summarization of direct testimonies shall be permitted.

9. The Commission does not look favorably upon motions for continuance. Accordingly, motions for extensions of time with respect to the schedule herein shall be made in writing and will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

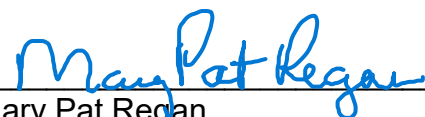
10. The Commission does not look favorably upon motions to substitute witnesses or excuse witnesses from testifying at Commission hearings. Accordingly, motions to substitute witnesses or excuse a witness from testifying at a Commission hearing or from testifying in person at a Commission hearing shall be made in writing at least 14 days prior to the hearing and will be granted only upon a showing of good cause.

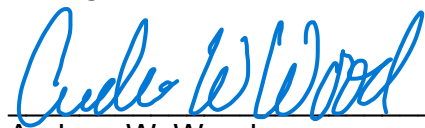

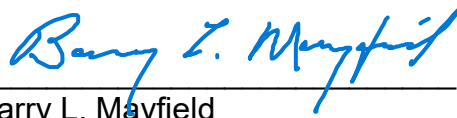
