I am writing to formally notify you that the Martin County Water District Alliance Company has installed water lines and structures on my property located at 3320 Blacklog Rd, Inez, KY, 41224, without my permission or a valid easement.

A review of my property records indicates that your company has no legal easement, lease, or permission to occupy this land. This encroachment constitutes a continuous trespass and restricts

the full use and enjoyment of my property.

Please contact me within 14 business days of receiving this letter to coordinate a timeline for the prompt removal of the structure and the restoration of my land to its original condition. Failure to respond or take corrective action will compel me to pursue legal remedies, which may include seeking a court order for removal, damages, and legal fees.
