Dear Executive Director Bridwell and Members of the Commission,

I am a resident and property owner in Henderson County, Kentucky. I understand that there has been a pre-construction notification letter mailed out from the current project owner, Stellar Renewable Power, stating that construction is anticipated to commence in January 2026 and continue through the first quarter of 2027.

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I respectfully request that the Public Service Commission and Siting Board:

1. Open an investigation into the current validity of the construction certificate under KRS 278.704 (as amended by House Bill 4, 2023), including confirmation of the issuance date of the last required permit from the Energy and Environment Cabinet, any implicit extensions due to delays, and compliance with conditions requiring Siting Board approval for ownership transfers.
2. Require Stellar Renewable Power to file updated project information, including current ownership documentation, revised timelines, and any material changes to the site plan or mitigations.

3. Temporarily halt construction activities until the investigation is complete and additional public comment opportunities are provided, ensuring transparency and fairness for affected residents.

This action would align with the Commission's commitment to public interest and allow for contemporary review of potential impacts (e.g., noise, dust, traffic, visual effects, and drainage) under changed circumstances.

Dear Executive Director Bridwell and Members of the Commission,

I am a resident and property owner in Henderson County, Kentucky. I understand that there has been a pre-construction notification letter mailed out from the current project owner, Stellar Renewable Power, to property owners located within the 2,400 foot project boundary, stating that construction is anticipated to commence in January 2026 and continue through the first quarter of 2027.

This notification comes nearly five years after the Siting Board's conditional approval of the construction certificate on December 22, 2021, during which time no construction has occurred. The project has undergone three ownership transfers (from Henderson County Solar LLC/Community Energy to AES, and now to Stellar Renewable Power), yet the public case docket reflects no filings or approvals related to these changes since early 2022. The original project timeline anticipated operations by October 2023, and the prolonged delay—combined with the absence of updated public records—has rendered the 2021 assessments, mitigation commitments, and community outreach efforts outdated and insufficient.

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
