The applicant will enter into a standard one year contract with the Cooperative, agreeing to abide by the Bylaws and Rules and Regulations adopted by the Cooperative and pay to the Cooperative a membership fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) which is refundable to the applicant upon termination of service when all billings are paid in full. The Cooperative reserves the right to apply the membership fee on any unpaid bill for electric energy.
- 2. The applicant will guarantee the Cooperative a minimum monthly bill of the the higher of the following:
 - (a) Where five (5) KVA or less of transformer capacity is required on Rate Schedules "R", "C" and "D-1", a monthly minimum of \$2.40 will be applicable.
 - (b) Where over five (5) KVA of transformer capacity is required on Rate Schedules "R" and "C", the monthly minimum shall be \$2.40 plus 75 cents per month per KVA or fraction thereof of installed over five (5) KVA.
 - (c) Where over five (5) KVA of transformer capacity is required on Rate Schedule "D-1", the monthly minimum shall be 75 cents per month per KVA or fraction thereof of installed transformer capacity.

In unusual circumstances, when the application of these rules appears impracticable or unjust to either party, or discriminatory to other customers, the Cooperative or Applicant shall refer the matter to the Commission for a special ruling or for the approval of special conditions which may be mutually agreed upon, prior to commencing construction.

4. INSTALLATION OF UNDERGROUND FACILITIES TO INDIVIDUAL SERVICE DELIVERY POINTS

- a. Where primary and secondary conductors are involved, the Cooperative shall estimate the cost to provide adequate service both overhead and underground, and the Applicant shall pay such difference in cost as a non-refundable contribution prior to the commencement of such construction. Where an indeterminate consumer is the Applicant, the Cooperative may require an advance deposit in addition to the contribution and which deposit shall be returned to the Applicant as provided in the Indeterminate Extension Policy and in accordance with Kentucky PSC Rules governing such construction deposits. All other terms and conditions set forth in Section "E", 1, 2 and 3 which are not in conflict with this Section "E", 4, shall also apply.
- b. Where only secondary conductors are involved, the Cooperative shall install underground conductors as follows:
 - 1. If the Cooperative trenches and backfills and installs the secondary conductor, the Applicant shall pay fifty five cents (55¢) per ground foot (pole to house) prior to the commencement of such construction.
 - Where the Applicant performs the trenching and backfilling with the Cooperative installing the secondary conductors, a twenty five cents (25¢) per foot credit shall be allowed under "b", 1 above. All other terms and conditions set forth in Sections "E", 1, 2 and 3 which are not in conflict with this Section "E", 4, shall also apply.

for such period as may be required but will not inconvenience the consumer unnecessarily. Whenever possible the Cooperative will give reasonable notice to the Consumer prior to such suspension of service.

F. SERVICE COMPLAINTS

The Cooperative shall make a full and prompt investigation of all complaints of service made to the Cooperative and shall keep a record of all written complaints received showing the name and address of the complainant, the date and character of the complaint, and the adjustment or disposal made thereof.

G. METER TESTING AND ACCURACY

- The Cooperative will test and inspect its meters from time to time and maintain their accuracy of registration in accordance with good practice. The Cooperative will without charge make special tests when requested provided that the meter has not been tested within the twelve (12) months period prior to such request and provided the Consumer will accept the results of such test for settlement of differences claimed. When the meter has been tested within the twelve (12) months period prior to such request, the Cooperative may collect a two dollar (\$2.00) meter test deposit. If such special test shows the average registration of a meter to be in error by more than two percent (2%) fast or slow, the Cooperative shall refund the Consumer's two dollar (\$2.00) deposit. If the amount of error is less than two percent (2%), the deposit shall be retained by the Cooperative as payment of the special test.
- If the result of tests on a Consumer's meter shows an average error greater than two percent (2%) slow or fast, then the Consumer's biff, for the period during which the meter error is known to have existed, shall be recomputed and the account adjusted either upwards or downwards on the basis of the test.

In the event the period during which the error existed is unknown, then the Consumer's bill shall be recomputed and adjusted either upwards or downwards for one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of the elapsed time since the last previous test but in no case to exceed twelve (12) months unless the Public Service Commission rules otherwise in any particular case.

	III METER READING, E	BILLING, AND COLLECTION

A. NORMAL BILLING AND METER READING

- 1. The Cooperative will mail a billing card monthly to each customer or member on or about the 5th of each month. Such card shall show the previous and present meter readings, KWH's used, gross charges, net charges, applicable rate schedule and taxes. The card shall also request the consumer to read his meter on or about the 5th of the month and space for this information shall be provided on the card. The card shall be perforated to allow one portion to be returned to the office and one portion to remain with the consumer as a receipt and/or record.
- 2. The consumer or member is requested to pay the net bill by the 18th of the month in which the bill is mailed by the Cooperative, together with the current months meter reading.
 - (a) <u>Mail Payments:</u> Checks or money orders and not cash should be used by the consumer when making payments by mail. The cancelled check or money order receipt shall serve as the customers receipt.
 - (b) Office Payments: Payments received at the office shall be receipted on the consumer's portion of the billing stub and returned to the consumer as a receipt.
 - (c) Night Depository: A night depository is provided by the Cooperative for payment after hours for the convenience of the consumer. Checks, or money orders should be used since the cancelled check or money order receipt will serve as a receipt for the consumer.

B. LARGE POWER BILLINGS

- 1. Where the Cooperative installs demand meters which must be reset monthly and on certain other meters, the Cooperative shall read these meters, prepare the monthly billing and mail said billing to the consumer on or about the 5th of each month.
- 2. Payments of large power billings or other billings where the Cooperative reads the meter shall be made as provided in Section "A", (2) of this policy except the meter reading portion shall be omitted.

B. LARGE POWER BILLINGS

- 1. Where the Cooperative installs demand meters which must be reset monthly and on certain other meters, the Cooperative shall read these meters, prepare the monthly billing and mail said billing to the consumer on or about the bill/read date for each cycle of each month.
- 2. Payments of large power billings or other billings where the Cooperative reads the meter shall be made as provided in Section "A", (2) of this policy except the meter reading portion shall be omitted.

C. DELINQUENT BILLS

- 1. On all bills which are not paid be the due date of each cycle in the month in which they are mailed by the Cooperative, the gross rates shall apply. Gross rates are five (5) percent higher than net rates.
- 2. On all bills not paid by the delinquent date as set forth on the bill for each cycle of cycle billing, the Cooperative shall make all reasonable efforts to induce the customer to pay same. The customer shall be given at least ten (10) days written notice of pending cutoff, but the cutoff shall not be effected before thirty (30) days after the mailing date of the original bill. Such termination notice shall be exclusive of and separate from the original bill. If, prior to discontinuance of service, there is delivered to the utility office payment of the amount in arrears, then discontinuance of service shall not be made, or as to residential service where a written certificate is filed signed by a physician, a registered nurse or a public health officer stating that, in the opinion of the person making the certification discontinuance of service will aggravate an existing illness or informity on the affected premises, service shall not be discontinued until the affected resident can make-other living arrangements or until thirty (30) days elapse from the time of the utility's notification to the customer in writing of the existence of local, state and federal programs providing for the payment of utility bills under certain conditions and of the offices to contact for such possible assistance. Residential service shall not be discontinued where the customer and the utility have reached agreement on a partial payment plan. The written notice for any discontinuance of residential service shall advise the customer of his rights and of his right to dispute the reasons for such discontinuance.

C. **DELINQUENT BILLS**

- On all bills which are not paid by the 18th of the month in which they are 1. mailed by the Cooperative, the gross rates shall apply. Gross rates are five (5) percent higher than net rates on Schedules "R", "SL", "CSL", and "C". The gross rates are higher than the net bill on Schedule "D-1" by five (5) percent on the first \$25.00 and two (2) percent on the remainder of the bill.
- 2. On all bills not paid by the 25th of the month in which they are mailed by the Cooperative, the Cooperative shall mail a five (5) day delinquent notice to the consumer notifying him that his bill is delinquent and that if not paid in full by the end of the current month, that a collection agent will be dispatched to either collect all amounts due and payable or else will discontinue the service. Should a collection agent be dispatched by the Cooperative, a \$2.00 collection fee shall be added to the consumer's billing to partially defray the cost of the collection agent and mileage to effect such collection. If the service is disconnected, a \$2.00 disconnect fee shall also be charged to the consumer.
- 3. In the event service is discontinued under the terms of "C", (2), above, an additional fee of \$2.00 shall be charged for reconnection. All past due accounts shall be paid in full including all penalties, the collection fee, disconnect fee, and the reconnect fee. Reconnection of such disconnected services made for non-payment, will be made only during regular working hours of the Cooperative unless the consumer agrees to pay actual labor and mileage costs for overtime work. No consumer shall be reconnected at a different location until all past due accounts and charges arising from previous service shall have been paid in full even though a different member of the family requests service.

D. CASH DEPOSITS

The Cooperative may require at any fime from any consumer or prospective consumer, a cash deposit intended to guarantee payment of current bills. Such required deposit shall not exceed the amount of an estimated sixty (60) days' bill of such customer, except that in the event an extension of lines and facilities is required to furnish such prospective customer with service, the deposit may be the amount of the estimated bill for a longer period if so specified in the provisions of the Service Agreement. At the option of the Cooperative, the cash deposit may be returned to the consumer after six (6) months or may be applied against any unpaid billing. Interest shall be paid as prescribed by the Public Service Commission of

E. RETURNED CHECKS

- 1. Checks returned to the Cooperative by the bank which are marked "insufficient funds", "no account", etc. will not be regarded as payment. Post-dated checks will not be accepted by the Cooperative as payment of any account.
- 2. Upon receiving a returned check from the bank, a letter shall be prepared and mailed to the consumer stating that such check or checks have been returned by the Cooperative and that the account is still due and payable in addition to a \$5.00 charge for handling the returned check. If reimbursement is made by the $oldsymbol{z}$ consumer for such check prior to the delinquent date, then the net charges will prevail. However, if reimbursement by the consumer to the Cooperative is made following the delinquent date, the gross charges shall apply.
- 3. Should the bank make a charge for returning such checks, these costs shall be charged (passed on) to the consumer.
- 4. In the event a collection agent is dispatched to effect collection of such returned check, then the same charges and procedures listed under "C", (2) shall apply.

F. PARTIAL PAYMENTS

- Partial payments will be accepted only in emergency circumstances and only 1. upon approval by the General Manager.
- 2. Partial payments will be credited to the consumer's account and the balance forward shall be reflected in the following months statement.
- 3. In the event partial payment is received by mail and through error on the part of the consumer, and the difference is not great, such payment will be accepted and the procedure listed under "F", (2), shall be followed in addition to which the consumer shall be notified of the under or over payments.

Where the connection of a service does not coincide with the meter reading date and a valid reading is received, the following two calculations are made and the higher of (1) or (2) is charged.

- 1. The actual number of days service was available for the billing month is divided by thirty (30). This quotient is termed the "prorate factor". The number of KWH's used is divided by the prorate factor to put the usage on a monthly basis so that the monthly rate can be applied. When the monthly bill is calculated, this amount is multiplied to arrive at a partial months billing.
- 2. The monthly minimum amount is divided by thirty (30) to arrive at a daily minimum amount. This is multiplied by the actual number of days service was used for a partial months minimum billing.

If a reading is not received to use for the first billing, the following procedure is used to bill. The actual number of days service was used for the billing month is recorded and divided by thirty (30). This quotient is the prorate factor. The prorate factor is multiplied by the monthly minimum bill. The product is the amount to be billed for that billing period. For each following month, thirty (30) days are added and recorded to the total number of days to be including the month a valid reading is received. Each of these months a minimum bill is used. When a valid reading is received, a prorate factor is calculated by dividing thirty (30) into the total number of days to be prorated. The KWH's used is derived by subtracting the original reading from the valid reading. This difference is divided by the prorate factor and the quotient is used as the number of KWH's to calculate an amount from the rate schedule. This amount is multiplied by the propate factor. The amount previously billed is subtracted from this product and the difference is the amount to be billed for the KWH's used during the billing month.

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H. FINAL BILLING

1. Where the disconnection of a service does not coincide with the meter reading date, the method used under "G", (1) and (2) are used to calculate the final billing.

2. Upon payment of the final bill as prepared and upon the surrender of the membership certificate, the membership fee or fees and deposits (if any) shall be refunded

J. ESTIMATED BILLING AND METER READING

- 1. If the Cooperative fails to receive a meter reading from the consumer, the Cooperative will estimate the consumer's billing based on the customer's previous three (3) or four (4) months usage. Each month a bill is estimated, thirty (30) days are added and recorded to the total number of days to be prorated including the month a valid reading is received. When a valid reading is received, a prorate factor is calculated by dividing thirty (30) into the total number of days to be prorated. The KWH's used is derived by subtracting the original or last valid reading from the current valid reading. This difference is divided by the prorate factor and the quotient is used as the number of KWH's to calculate an amount from the rate schedule. This amount is multiplied by the prorate factor. The amount previously billed is subtracted from this product and the difference is the amount to be billed for the KWH's used during the billing month.
- 2. In the event the Cooperative shall have failed to receive meter readings from the consumer for three (3) consecutive months, the Cooperative shall dispatch a meter reader to obtain an accurate meter reading for which the consumer shall have a \$2.00 charge added to his account to partially offset the labor and mileage costs of obtaining such meter reading.
