Available for outdoor lighting to individual customers located outside areas covered by municipal street lighting systems.

This Tariff is made available for experimental purposes to determine the usefulness of this type of service to the customers described above. It is available only for service contracted for before January 1, 1962.

RATE.

For each 2500 lumens overhead lamp with diffuser and an upsweep arm not over 6 feet in length controlled by photoelectric relay where service is supplied from the existing pole and secondary facilities of company \$3.00 per lamp per month

When new facilities are to be installed by the company, the customer will in addition to the above monthly charge, pay in advance the installation cost for the new overhead facilities extending from the nearest or most suitable pole of the company to the point designated by the customer for the installation of said lamp.

PAYMENT.

Bills are due and payable at the main or branch offices of the company within 15 days of the mailing date.

TERM OF CONTRACT.

For residential or farm customers—1 year.
For commercial or general service customers—3 years.

HOURS OF LIGHTING.


