The capacity of individual motors served under this schedule shall not exceed 7.5 H.P. The adjustment shall be applied to the nearest 0.1 mill per KWH.</p> <p>MINIMUM CHARGES</p> <p>The minimum monthly charge under the above rate shall be \$3.00 net where 10 KVA or less of transformer capacity is required. Each consumer who requires more than 10 KVA of transformer capacity shall pay, in addition to the above minimum, \$.75 for each additional KVA or fraction thereof required. intermittently so that the KW registered on a standard 15 minute integrated demand meter is small in comparison to the instantaneous load such equipment is capable of imposing each KVA of such special equipment shall be counted as one-third KW load for minimum billing purposes.

MINIMUM:

As determined by this Rate Schedule and the Rate Schedule to which this Rider is attached.


This schedule applies to all new loads; also to existing loads where such existing loads now or hereafter have a detrimental effect upon the electric service rendered to other consumers of the Cooperative.

21. TRAILER/MOBILE HOME SERVICE AGREEMENT

The consumer desiring electric service to a trailer or mobile home shall deposit with the Cooperative the cost of the facilities required to make service available. This deposit shall be paid before the Commencement of construction of the electric facilities.

Such deposit shall be returnable to the consumer in the form of a credit on the amount paid annually for electric service. Such credit shall be made annually in the amount of ten (10) per cent of the total billing, and such credit shall continue until the total of the deposit has been recovered by the consumer.

If however, the consumer moves the trailer or mobile home to a different site, any portion of the deposit for construction that hasn't been recovered by the consumer is forfeited. The deposit, or any portion thereof, is not assignable to any successor at the location.

Trailer/Mobile Home Service Agreement cont'd

If the consumer replaces the trailer or mobile home, with a permanent house, on this location, within a period of three years, the unrecovered cost of the deposit is refundable in a lump sum as soon as the house is permanently connected to the electric facilities.

22. STANDBY AND RESALE SERVICE


All purpose electric service (other than emergency or standby service) used on the premises of consumer shall be supplied exclusively by distributor, and consumer shall not, directly or indirectly, sell, sublet, assign, or otherwise dispose of the electric service or any part thereof.

23. NOTICE OF TROUBLE

Consumer shall notify Distributor immediately should the service be unsatisfactory for any reason, or should there be any defects, trouble, or accidents affecting the supply of electricity. Such notices, if verbal, should be confirmed in writing.

24. APPLICATION OF RESIDENTIAL AND POWER RATE SCHEDULES

1. Multiple Dwellings. Where premises include two or more residential or dwelling units, the residential farm and home rate may be applied only if separate circuits are provided without cost to the distributor. A residential or dwelling unit shall be defined, for the purpose of applying this interpretation, as the space provided for the occupancy of a single family, i.e., including separate living quarters and kitchen. If it is not practical to provide for separate metering of each individual unit, the entire premises shall be served under the appropriate commercial, small power and three-phase farm rate. There building services, such as hall lighting, elevators and water heating, are provided by a landlord who



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
