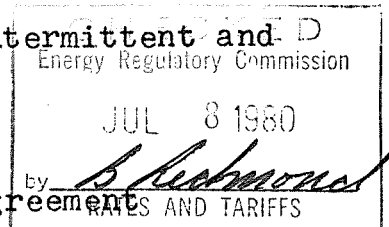

RULES AND REGULATIONS

NOMINAL SERVICE VOLTAGE

The nominal service voltage shall be 120/240 volts. Rules and regulations concerning nominal service voltage shall conform with Kentucky Energy Regulatory Commission Administration Regulations.

CONSUMER'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR COOPERATIVE'S PROPERTY

All meters, service connections, and other equipment furnished by the Cooperative shall be, and remain, the property of the Cooperative. Consumers shall provide a space for, and exercise proper care to protect the property of the Cooperative on their premises; and in the event of loss or damage to the Cooperative's property, arising from neglect of the consumer to care for same, the cost of the necessary repairs or replacements shall be paid by the consumer.

RELOCATION OF LINES BY REQUEST OF MEMBERS

The Cooperative's established lines shall not be relocated unless the expense for moving and relocating is paid by the member.

CONSUMER'S WIRING

All wiring of the member must conform to the Cooperative's requirements and accepted modern standards. The member agrees to wire his premises in accordance with specifications at least equal to those prescribed in the National Electrical Code. The Cooperative, however, assumes no responsibility in respect to the type, standard of construction, protective equipment, or the condition of the member's property, and will not be liable for any loss or injury to persons or property occurring on the premises or property of the member.

The member agrees to operate and maintain its facilities so as not to interfere with the service of the Cooperative to its other members. The member will have complete responsibility for all construction, operation, and maintenance beyond the meter and will save the Cooperative harmless against liability for injury or damages resulting in any manner from construction, location, operation, or maintenance of the member's facilities.

INSPECTION

Upon implementation of the electrical inspection certification feature of the State Regulations, the Cooperative will comply with the rules and regulations affecting the areas served.

TRAILER/MOBILE HOME SERVICE AGREEMENT

As required under Section II of 807KAR 2:050.

1. All extensions of up to 150 feet from the nearest facility shall be made without charge.
2. Extensions greater than 150 feet from the nearest facility and up to 300 feet shall be made provided the consumer shall pay the utility a "consumer advance for construction" of fifty dollars (\$50.00) in addition to any other charges required by the Cooperative for all consumers. This advance shall be refunded at the end of one (1) year if the service to the Mobile Home continues for that length of time.
3. For extensions greater than 300 feet and less than 1000 feet from the nearest facility, the utility may charge an advance equal to the reasonable costs incurred by it for that portion of the service beyond 300 feet plus fifty dollars (\$50.00). Beyond 1000 feet, the extension policies set forth in Section 10 apply.
 - a. This advance shall be refunded to the consumer over a four (4) year period in equal amounts for each year the service is continued. All deposits made for trailer extensions prior to 10/3/75 when the time for refunding was 10 years, shall be refunded at the earliest convenient time. In no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the amount of deposit paid to the utility.
 - b. If the service is discontinued for a period of sixty (60) days, or should the Mobile Home be removed and another not take its place within sixty (60) days, or be replaced by a permanent structure, the remainder of the advance shall be forfeited.
 - c. No refunds shall be made to any consumer who did not make the advance originally.
