Applicable to small commercial, churches, community centers, industrial, public buildings, and three-phase farm service, including lighting, heating and power, subject to the established rules and regulations of the Seller.

CHARACTER OF SERVICE

Single-phase or three-phase, 60 cycles, at available secondary voltages.

MONTHLY RATE

PART 1 (For demands less than 25 KW)

Demand Charge: None

Energy:

Customer Charge \$5.15 per meter per month

All KWH per month .0419 per KWH

Minimum Monthly Charges:

\$5.15 where 3 KVA or less of transformer capacity is required. Each consumer who requires more than 3 KVA of transformer capacity shall pay, in addition to the above minimum, 86¢ for each additional KVA or fraction thereof required. Where the minimum charge is increased in accordance with the terms of this section, additional energy therefore may be taken in accordance with the terms of the foregoing schedule.

<p style="text-align: center;">PART 2 (for demands greater than 25 KW)</p> <p>Demand Charge: \$2.60 per KW of billing demand</p> <p>Energy Charges: All KWH per month:                      \$.0236 per KWH</p> <p><b>DETERMINATION OF BILLING DEMAND</b></p> <p>The billing demand shall be the maximum kilowatt demand established by the consumer for any period of fifteen consecutive minutes during the month for which the bill is rendered, as indicated or recorded by a demand meter and adjusted for power factor as provided below.</p> <p><b>POWER FACTOR ADJUSTMENT</b></p> <p>The consumer agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. The measured demand will be adjusted to correct for consumers with 50 KW or more of measured demand to correct for average power factors lower than 85 per cent. Such adjustments will be made by increasing the measured demand 1 percent for each 1 percent by which the average power factor is less than 85 percent lagging.</p> <p><b>FUEL ADJUSTMENT CHARGE</b></p> <p>All rates are applicable to the Fuel Adjustment Clause and may be increased or decreased by an amount per KWH equal to the fuel adjustment amount per KWH as billed by the Wholesale Power Supplier plus an allowance for line losses.</p>	<div style="text-align: right; border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <p>RECEIVED Energy Regulatory Commission AUG 18 1980 by <i>B. <p>The allowance for line losses will not exceed 10% and is based on a twelve-month moving average of such losses. This Fuel Clause is subject to all other applicable provisions as set out in 807 KAR 50:075.</p> <p><b>MINIMUM MONTHLY CHARGE</b></p> <p>The minimum monthly charge shall be the highest of the following charges as determined for the consumer in question.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The minimum monthly charge as specified in the contract for service.</li> <li>2. A charge of \$.86 per KVA of installed transformer capacity.</li> <li>3. A charge of \$28.75.</li> </ol> <p><b>MINIMUM ANNUAL CHARGE FOR SEASONAL SERVICE:</b></p> <p>Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons not exceeding 9 months per year may guarantee a minimum annual charge, in which case there shall be no minimum monthly charge. The minimum annual charge shall be sufficient to assure adequate compensation for the facilities installed to serve the Consumer, and in no event shall it be less than \$11.52 per KVA of installed transformer capacity or \$384.16 whichever is greater.</p> <p><b>SERVICE PROVISIONS:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <u>Delivery Point</u>. 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electric equipment on the load side of the delivery point shall be owned and maintained by the Consumer. If the service is furnished at Seller's primary line voltage, the delivery point shall be the point of attachment of Seller's primary line to Consumer's transformer structure unless otherwise specified in the contract for service. All wiring, pole lines and other electric equipment (except metering equipment) on the load side of the delivery point shall be owned and maintained by the Consumer.

2. Primary Service. If the service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, a discount of fifteen cents (\$.15) per KW shall apply to the demand charge, and if the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of seven per cent (7%) shall apply to the minimum charge. However, the Seller shall have the option of metering at secondary voltage and adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt demand and kilowatt hours.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

The above rates are net, the gross rates being 5% higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid by the first of the month following the meter reading date, the gross rates shall apply.
