Dual-Fuel Off-Peak Gas Space Heating Rate

Applicable:

In all territory served.

Availability:

Available on an off-peak basis to any commercial or industrial customer for interruptible gas service to space heating equipment with a rated input capacity in excess of 2,000,000 Btu per hour, who can be adequately served from the Company's existing distribution system without impairment of service to other customers, and who contracts for service subject to the special conditions hereinafter set forth. Provided, however, that a customer served under this schedule prior to January 1, 1962, may continue service hereunder even though the capacity of his heating equipment is less than 2,000,000 Btu per hour.

Rate:

55¢ net per 1,000 cubic feet.

Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause:

The monthly amount computed at the charges specified above shall be increased or decreased in accordance with the Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause set forth on Tariff Sheet No. 13.

Prompt Payment Provision:

The monthly bill will be rendered at the above net charges plus an amount equivalent to 1% thereof, which amount will be deducted provided bill is paid within ten days from date.

Minimum Annual Charge:

Service supplied hereunder shall be subject to a minimum annual revenue guarantee of 30¢ net per 1,000 Btu of rated hourly input capacity of customer's space heating equipment but not less than \$300.00.

Special Conditions:

Any customer contracting for service under this rate schedule must agree in writing to the following special conditions:

1. The design, type, and manner of operation of Customer's space heating installation served hereunder must be acceptable to Company. Such installation must be designed to permit complete discontinuance of natural gas usage and substitution of oil or other alternate fuel immediately upon notice from Company to Customer directing such discontinuance of natural gas usage.

Summer Air Conditioning Service Under Gas Rate G-1

Applicable:

To General Gas Rate G-1.

Availability:

Available to any customer who takes gas service under Rate G-1 and who has installed and in regular operation a gas burning summer air conditioning system with a cooling capacity of three tons or more. The special rate set forth herein shall be applicable during the five monthly billing periods of each year beginning with the period covered by the regular June meter reading and ending with the period covered by the regular October meter reading.

Rate:

For "Summer Air Conditioning Consumption" determined in the manner hereinafter prescribed, the rate shall be 4.0 cents net per 100 cubic feet, subject to the "Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause" and to the "Prompt Payment Provision" incorporated in Rate G-1. All monthly consumption other than "Summer Air Conditioning Consumption" shall be billed at the regular charges set forth in Rate G-1, beginning with the initial block of such schedule.

Minimum Bill:

Application of this rider shall not alter the regular Minimum Bill provision of Rate G-1.

Determination of Summer Air Conditioning Consumption:

The Summer Air Conditioning Consumption shall be determined as follows:

Residential Service:

For each of the aforesaid five billing periods all gas consumption in excess of 5,000 cubic feet per single family dwelling unit shall be taken as the Summer Air Conditioning Consumption.

Commercial and Industrial Service:

(1) Where the only gas usage during the aforesaid five billing periods is considered to be for summer air conditioning purposes (this being the case when gas is used only for summer air conditioning or only for space heating and summer air conditioning), the consumption recorded on the regular Rate G-1 meter during such five periods shall all be taken as the Summer Air Conditioning Consumption.

(2) Where gas is used during the aforesaid five billing periods for purposes other than space heating and summer air conditioning and where summer air conditioning usage during such periods can be isolated from such other gas usage in such a way as to permit separate metering of

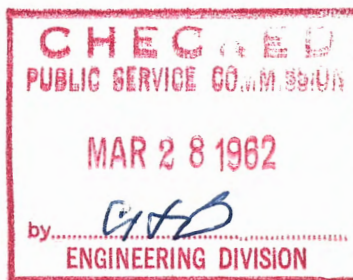

summer air conditioning usage, the Summer Air Conditioning Consumption will be determined by separate metering. During the seven remaining billing periods the readings of such separate meter will be combined with those of the regular Rate G-1 meter for billing at the regular charges set forth in Rate G-1.

(3) Where it is not possible to determine the Summer Air Conditioning Consumption by metering as provided in (1) or (2) above, the Summer Air Conditioning Consumption during each of the aforesaid billing periods shall be taken as 4,500 cubic feet for each ton of installed cooling capacity, but not more than the total consumption recorded by the meter during such billing period. For this purpose the capacity of air conditioning equipment will be determined by American Refrigeration Institute ratings.

Other Terms and Conditions:

This rate shall not be available for summer air conditioning equipment used occasionally or sporadically, it being contemplated that equipment served hereunder will operate for not less than 800 hours in a normal summer.

Classification:

Available during the 275-day period from March 15 to December 15 of each year to commercial and industrial customers using over 50,000 cubic feet of gas per day who can be adequately served from the Company's existing distribution system without impairment of service to other customers and who agree to the complete discontinuance of gas service for equipment served hereunder and the substitution of other fuels during the 3-month period from December 15 to March 15. No gas service whatsoever to utilization equipment served hereunder will be supplied or permitted to be taken under any other of the Company's gas rate schedules during such 3-month period. Any gas utilization equipment on customer's premises of such nature or used for such purposes that gas service thereto cannot be completely discontinued during the period from December 15 to March 15 will not be eligible for service under this rate, and gas service thereto must be segregated from service furnished hereunder and supplied through a separate meter at the Company's applicable standard rate for year-around service.

Character of Service:

Gas supplied under this rate schedule shall be natural gas with a heat content of not less than 1,000 Btu per cubic foot.

First 1,500,000 cu ft per month . . . . . 40.0¢ net per 1000 cu ft  
Next 3,500,000 cu ft per month . . . . . 38.0¢ net per 1000 cu ft

Minimum monthly Bill:

The minimum monthly bill for gas service hereunder shall be \$1.00 net per Mcf of maximum daily delivery contracted for by customer, but not less than \$100.00 net per month. Such minimum monthly bill shall be applicable only during the period of service availability hereunder and shall be subject to pro-rata downward adjustment for billing periods covering less than a full month.

Maximum Daily Contract Delivery:

The customer shall contract under this rate schedule for a specified quantity of gas stated in terms of maximum required deliveries per day. On no day will the Company be obligated to supply gas in excess of such contract quantity.

Curtailement Provision:

In the event of an actual or threatened shortage of natural gas, due to any cause whatsoever, during the period of service availability hereunder, or in the event that unusually cold weather experienced at any time during such period imposes such load on Company's distribution facilities as to impair or threaten to impair Company's service to customers served under other rate schedules, Company shall have the right to discontinue wholly or in part the supply of gas hereunder for such period or periods, as in the judgment of the Company, may be necessary to enable it to supply the full gas requirements of its customers served under all other rate schedules.

Term of Contract:

Minimum contract term for service under this schedule shall be for the period from March 15 (or date of initial deliveries hereunder, if after March 15) to December 15. However, in those cases in which customer must make a substantial investment in gas utilization equipment, Company will execute contracts for a longer term of not to exceed five years. In the event that an extension or enlargement of Company's gas distribution facilities is necessary to supply service to any Customer hereunder, Company may condition such extension or enlargement upon Customer's execution of a five-year contract providing for a minimum annual revenue guarantee sufficient to warrant making the extension.

Customer's Right to Contract Termination:

The provisions of this rate schedule and all contracts for gas service hereunder are at all times subject to such changes in rates or service conditions as may be ordered or authorized by the Public Service Commission of Ky. Any customer who is adversely affected by any changes in this rate schedule which may be made during the term of his contract shall have the right for such cause to terminate his contract prior to its scheduled expiration date.

Reserved Right of Limitation of Additional Contracts:

This gas rate schedule is predicated on the availability to the Company during the period from March 15 to December 15 of each year of a seasonal off-peak gas supply in excess of the full requirements of customers served under all other rate schedules and for placing in underground storage. The Company therefore reserves the right to decline acceptance of any additional contracts for service hereunder at such time as, in the judgment of the Company, the volume of service already contracted for equals the seasonal surplus gas supply available for this class of service.

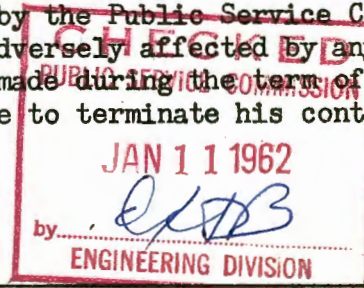

Availability:

Available to any customer who takes gas space heating service under Rate G-8 and who installs and operates a gas burning summer air conditioning system in accordance with the terms of this rider. The special rate set forth herein shall be applicable during the five monthly billing periods of each year beginning with the period covered by the regular June meter reading and ending with the period covered by the regular October meter reading.

Rate:

For consumption recorded during the aforesaid five billing periods the rate shall be 40 cents net per 1000 cubic feet, subject to the "Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause" and to the "Prompt Payment Provision" incorporated in Rate G-8.

Minimum Bill:

Application of this rider shall not alter the regular Minimum Annual Charge provision of Rate G-8.

Other Terms and Conditions:

Gas service under this rider is applicable only to summer air conditioning usage in conjunction with space heating service supplied under a Rate G-8 contract. This rider will not be applicable if gas is used for purposes other than space heating and summer air conditioning; provided, however, that when gas service is purchased under Rate G-8 for a steam boiler or other gas burning facility utilized jointly for space heating, summer air conditioning, and incidental water heating (where water heating usage during the five months availability of this special rate is not more than 25% of air conditioning usage), the special rate set forth herein shall apply to all gas usage under the Rate G-8 contract during the five monthly billing periods above designated.

.381¢ (381/1000 of one cent) per 100 cubic feet of gas used during the period covered by bill.

This purchased gas adjustment is placed in effect in accordance with the procedure set forth in an order of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky dated November 26, 1957, in Case No. 3300.

The rates authorized herein (~~Case No. 3300 — November 26, 1957~~) are based upon the wholesale cost of gas to the Applicant (~~Louisville Gas and Electric Company~~) as computed upon rates of its wholesale suppliers then currently in effect under Federal Power Commission tariffs for interstate business or under wholesale tariffs of this Commission. For the purpose of this purchased gas adjustment clause, these rates shall be considered as the base rate for purchased gas. In the event there is any change in this base rate, either increase or decrease, the Applicant (~~Louisville Gas and Electric Company~~) shall within thirty days from the time it receives notice of the proposed change file with this Commission the following information:

- (1) A copy of the Federal Power Commission tariff effecting the change in the base rates and a statement relative to the effective date of such proposed change.
- (2) A statement setting out the details of gas purchased under the provisions of the base rate for the previous twelve months showing billing under the base rate and under the proposed revised rate applicable to this service.
- (3) A balance sheet as of the end of the twelve months period and a statement of operating expenses and revenues in the same detail as reported to this Commission in the Utility's Annual Report.
- (4) A forecast showing the estimated gas purchases from all of the Utility's contract suppliers for the next twelve months period together with an estimate of the cost thereof.
- (5) Such other information as this Commission may request for a proper determination of the purchased gas adjustment.

Upon receipt of this information this Commission will review the effect of the revised base rate on the operations of the Applicant (~~Louisville Gas and Electric Company~~) and will prior to the effective date of the revised base rate, but not less than thirty days from date of the filing of the above prescribed information, issue its Order setting out the purchased gas adjustment that the utility shall apply to its rates and/or such refunds as may be proper.

The maximum amount of the adjustment so prescribed shall not produce revenue adjustments based upon the actual preceding twelve months period, greater than the difference between the purchased gas billed at the then existing rate and the purchased gas billed at the revised rate.

All gas service furnished by the Company shall be subject to the following rules and regulations which shall be considered as constituting part of all applications and contracts for such service.

1. Rules and Regulations on File. A copy of the rates, rules and regulations under which gas service will be supplied is available for public inspection in the office of the Company and on file with the Public Service Commission of Kentucky.

2. Written Application or Contract Required. A written application or contract, properly executed, may be required by the Company from prospective customers before the Company will be required to supply gas service; provided, however, that the Company shall have the right to reject for valid reasons any such application or contract.

All applications for service shall be made in the legal name of the party desiring the service.

Except for temporary service and where a longer term is specified in the rate schedule, the fixed term contract shall be for at least one year, and after its expiration shall renew itself from month to month until one party or the other shall give notice of a desire to terminate it.

Customers desiring temporary suspension of service will be charged the cost of disconnecting and reconnecting the service before the service is reconnected. The minimum charge shall be one dollar (\$1.00) for disconnecting and one dollar (\$1.00) for reconnecting the service.

The Company may require special contracts for some specified term when unusual construction or equipment expense is necessary to furnish the customer with service.

3. **Transfer of Application.** Applications for gas service are not transferable and new occupants of premises will be required to make application for service before commencing the use of gas. Customers who have been receiving gas service shall notify the Company when about to move and shall pay for all service furnished until such notice has been given and final meter readings made by the Company.

4. **Deposits.** To insure the payment of bills the Company may require any customer or applicant for gas service to furnish satisfactory surety or make a minimum cash deposit of \$2.50 or a larger amount not to exceed two-twelfths of the estimated annual bill of such customer or applicant.

The Company will evidence the receipt of such cash deposits by the issuance of certificates of deposit which shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum until service is discontinued, but not thereafter, such interest to be paid annually upon demand of the customer or upon return of the deposit.

The Company reserves the right to refund such deposit at any time it so desires or to require at any time an additional deposit sufficient to maintain the total deposit at an amount equivalent to two-twelfths of the customer's annual bill.

The deposit will be returned to the customer by the Company upon discontinuance of service and upon payment by the customer of all unpaid bills.

5. **Meter Readings.** Meters will be read at regular monthly intervals. A month as referred to herein and in the rate schedules, means the period between two consecutive meter readings, which shall be as nearly as feasible thirty days apart.

In the case of opening and closing bills when the total period between regular and special meter readings is less than thirty days the rate blocks and minimum charges of the applicable rate schedules will be pro-rated on the basis of the ratio of the actual number of days in such period to thirty days.

In the event that the Company is unable to read customer's meter after reasonable effort, such fact will be indicated on the customer's bill. At such time as a regular meter reading is available, the customer's bill for service during the two or more months intervening since the previous meter reading will be computed on the assumption that his consumption has been equally divided between such intervening months.

6. Reading of Separate Meters Not Combined. For billing purposes each meter upon the customer's premises will be considered separately and readings of two or more meters will not be combined except where the Company's operating convenience requires the installation of two or more meters upon the customer's premises instead of one meter.

7. Payment of Bills for Service. Bills for gas service will be rendered monthly and are due and payable in their net amount at the office of the Company during business hours, or at other locations designated by the Company, within ten days from date of rendition thereof. In the event bill is not paid on or before the final day of this ten day net payment period, the gross bill including forfeited discount or delayed payment charge shall become due and payable. Failure to receive bill will not entitle the customer to the net bill.

If customer's bill for gas service is not paid within five days after the last day of net bill as shown on customer's statement, the Company shall have the right to discontinue service to such cus-

tomer after giving twenty-four (24) hours written notice of such intention.

Removal bills, special bills, bills rendered on vacation of premises or bills rendered to customers discontinuing service are due and payable on presentation.

8. Weekly Billings. When warranted by special conditions, the Company may read meters and render bills for gas service on a weekly rather than on a monthly basis, in which event the rate blocks and minimum bills of the applicable rate schedules shall be taken as seven-thirtieths of the corresponding monthly figures.

9. Failure of Meter. In the event the Company's gas meter installed in the customer's premises fails to register properly by reason of damage, accident, etc., the Company reserves the right to estimate the customer's consumption during such period of failure on the basis of such factors as the customer's connected load and his consumption during a previous corresponding period and during a test-period immediately following replacement of the defective meter.

10. Discontinuance of Service. The Company reserves the right to discontinue service to the customer for non-payment of bills within fifteen days from date of rendition thereof, for fraudulent use of the Company's service, or for non-compliance with or violation of the Company's rules and regulations. In the event of discontinuance of service for any of the foregoing reasons all amounts owed by the customer to the Company shall immediately become due and payable and must be paid in full before service is restored.

Where a dangerous condition is found to exist on customer's premises the Company reserves the right to discontinue service without notice.

11. Reconnection Charge. A reconnection charge of One Dollar (\$1.00) will be made and collected by the Company before service is re-established after having been discontinued for non-payment of bills or for violation of the Company's rules and regulations.

12. Customer Indebtedness. The Company reserves the right to refuse to furnish service at any premises to any applicant for such service who is indebted to the Company for similar service at the same or other premises until such applicant shall have paid such indebtedness to the Company and conformed to Company's Rule No. 4 relating to deposits.

The customer shall obtain or cause to be obtained all permits or certificates, except street permits, necessary to give the Company or its agents access to the customer's premises and equipment and to enable its service to be connected therewith. In case the customer is not the owner of the premises or of intervening property between the premises and the Company's distribution mains the customer shall obtain from the proper owner or owners the necessary consent to the installation and maintenance in said premises and across such intervening property of the piping and other facilities required for the supply of gas service to the customer.

The Company shall make or cause to be made application for any necessary street permits and shall not be required to supply service under the customer's application until a reasonable time after such permits are granted.

19. Diversion of Service. When the Company discovers that a customer has obtained service, in whole or in part, without such service having been registered on the meter as evidenced by mechanical contrivances retarding meter registration, or any method which interferes with the proper metering of such service, or where a comparison of registration by an outside check meter discloses a discrepancy or irregularity of registration not due to any inherent defect in the customer's meter, the Company may immediately disconnect the service to the customer, and by written notice to the customer may require him at his own expense to install protective equipment and make proper changes in the service entrance facilities of approved type, all of which shall be done as may be required by the Company before service is restored.

In addition to the foregoing the Company may require the customer to pay to the Company the following:

- (a) The cost of any and all damage to the Company's equipment due to such interference with its metering.

- (b) The deficiency in revenue occasioned by such interference with the proper metering of service, for the entire period of such diversion as determined from inspection of the customer's meter record and/or the customer's admission of the duration of such interference, or any other evidence indicating the duration and extent of such interference.
- (c) The cost incurred by the utility in the correction of the diversion, such as the cost of removal and installation of meters and the cost incident to the restoring of the service.

20. Resale of Gas. Gas service furnished under the Company's standard application or contract is for the use of the customer only and no customer shall resell same to any other person, firm or corporation on the customer's premises or for use on any other premises without the written consent of the Company.

21. Choice of Optional Rates. When two or more rate schedules are available for the same class of service as indicated by the complete copy of the Company's rates open to public inspection in the Company's office, and the customer is undecided as to which schedule will result in the lowest annual cost, the Company will assist the customer in the choice of the most favorable schedule, the customer then to designate the schedule he desires. In those cases in which decision as to the most favorable schedule is difficult of pre-determination the customer will be given reasonable opportunity to change to another schedule after trial of the schedule originally designated, provided, however, that the Company may not be required to make a change in schedule after the first change more often than once in twelve months.

(1) The Company will extend its low pressure gas mains at its own expense for the following distances to bona-fide applicants for year-around gas service who agree in writing to take service when the extension is completed:

- (a) A distance of seventy-five (75) feet for each customer having either a gas range, a gas water heater, or a central gas heating system installed and ready for connection.
- (b) A distance of one hundred (100) feet for each customer having two or more of the above major units of equipment installed and ready for connection.

(2) The Company will extend its low pressure mains in excess of the distances stated in Section (1) above provided the applicant for service advances to the Company an amount equal to the estimated cost of such excess portion of the extension.

(3) The Company will install at its own expense a service pipe of suitable capacity extending from its low pressure main to the customer's property line, beyond which point all necessary piping shall be installed by and at the expense of the customer, and in a manner acceptable to the Company. The Company will install the necessary meter at its own expense.

(4) In consideration of the amounts advanced by the applicant for the cost of the excess portion of the main extension as provided in Section (2) above, the Company will refund to the applicant the amounts set out below for additional range, water heater, and central gas heating installations which are actually connected to the extension during the six-year period following completion of the extension without additional cost to the Company except for curb services and the necessary metering equipment, such refunds to be limited to a period of six years following completion of the extension and in no case to exceed the amount advanced by the applicant:

- (a) For each new year-around customer who takes gas service for either a gas range, a gas water heater, or a central gas heating system, a refund equal to 70 times the unit cost per foot of extension advanced by the applicant.

(b) For each new year-around customer who takes gas service for two or more of the three major units of equipment named in Paragraph (a) above, a refund equal to 90 times the unit cost per foot of extension advanced by the applicant.

(c) When a customer already using only one of the three major units of equipment named in Paragraph (a) above begins taking service for one or both of the other two major units so named, a refund equal to 20 times the unit cost per foot of extension advanced by the applicant.

(5) In the event the Company is required to make a further extension of its mains to serve a customer, the Company reserves the right to tap any extension constructed under these rules and to make connections from such additional extension without application of the refund referred to in Section (4) above.

(6) The title to all extensions herein provided for, together with all necessary rights-of-way, permits and easements, shall be and remain in the Company.

(7) The Company shall not be obligated to serve any customer from its low pressure gas mains in cases where such extensions, in the judgment of the Company, would be infeasible, impractical, or contrary to good operating practice. Any unusual extensions requested for service to new real estate subdivisions, industrial customers, public institutions, or to urban communities within reasonable reach of the Company's existing gas system will be dealt with in accordance with the special circumstances pertaining thereto, subject to the regulatory jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky.

(1) The Company will extend its medium and high pressure gas mains at its own expense for the following distances to bona-fide applicants for year-around gas service who agree in writing to take service when the extension is completed:

- (a) A distance of seventy-five (75) feet for each customer having either a gas range, a gas water heater, or a central gas heating system installed and ready for connection.
- (b) A distance of one hundred (100) feet for each customer having two or more of the above major units of equipment installed and ready for connection.

(2) The Company will extend its medium and high pressure mains in excess of the distances stated in Section (1) above provided the applicant for service advances to the Company an amount equal to the estimated cost of such excess portion of the extension.

(3) The Company will install at its own expense a service pipe of suitable capacity extending from its medium or high pressure main to the customer's property line, beyond which point all necessary piping shall be installed by and at the expense of the customer and in a manner acceptable to the Company. The Company will install at its own expense the necessary meter together with the regulator equipment required to convert from medium pressure to service pressure.

(4) Where, in order to serve a customer or a group of customers, it is necessary to tap a high pressure gas main, the Company will make such connection and install the required additional high pressure regulator, the estimated cost of such connection and regulator to be advanced by the customer or customers to be served.

(5) In consideration of the amounts advanced by the applicant for the cost of the excess portion of the main extension as provided in Section (2) above, the Company will refund to the applicant the amounts set out below for additional range, water heater, and central gas heating installations which are actually connected to the extension during the six-year period following completion of the extension without additional cost to the Company except for curb services and the necessary metering and regulating equipment, such refunds to be limited to a period of six years following completion of the extension and in no case to exceed the amount advanced by the applicant;

RULES GOVERNING APPLICATION OF GAS RATE SCHEDULES

All gas service supplied by the Company under its four standard rate schedules shall be subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

1. Registration of Space Heating Loads. Before any new or additional gas space heating equipment is connected to Company's lines such equipment shall be registered with the Company and a space heating permit secured therefor as a condition precedent to the Company's obligation to supply service thereto. Application for such space heating permit may be made by the owner, builder, contractor, or other person responsible for the type of space heating installation in the premises for which service is desired, on a special form which will be provided by the Company. No permit will be required in connection with the replacement of existing gas space heating equipment with new equipment of lesser or equal Btu hourly input capacity.

2. Maximum Allowable Capacity of Space Heating Equipment. The total rated input capacity of gas space heating equipment for service under General Gas Rate G-1 or Interruptible Commercial and Industrial Rate G-2 shall be limited to an aggregate of 2,000,000 Btu per hour for any space heating customer at any one location. In the case of multi-family residential structures, each family dwelling unit equipped with its own heating system served directly by the Company through a separate gas metering installation will be considered a separate customer. 9-6-62

No customer whose existing gas space heating equipment already has an aggregate rated hourly input capacity of 2,000,000 Btu or more shall be eligible for any increase in such capacity under Rates G-1 and G-2. No customer whose existing gas space heating equipment has an aggregate rated input capacity of less than 2,000,000 Btu per hour shall be eligible for any increase in such capacity under Rates G-1 and G-2 in excess of the difference between the rated input capacity of his present equipment and 2,000,000 Btu per hour.

3. Limitations on Firm Gas Service for Commercial or Industrial Purposes. Company's acceptance of any new contract for the supply for commercial or industrial purposes for more than 150,000 cubic feet of gas on any one day or more than 4,000,000 cubic feet of gas in any one month may be conditioned upon the rendition of such service only under an interruptible or off-peak rate schedule, unless the nature of customer's gas usage is such that its curtailment or interruption would adversely affect the public welfare, health, or safety.

Because of the non-availability to Company of a total present and prospective natural gas supply sufficient to meet combined winter peak demands of all customers who are now using or desire to use natural gas for space heating in addition to firm usage for other purposes, and in order to protect gas users and the general public from the suffering and hazards which would result from the connection to Company's mains of a larger volume of gas space heating than can be adequately and safely served within the limits of Company's total present and prospective peak day natural gas supply, the following limitations shall henceforth apply to all gas service supplied by Louisville Gas and Electric Company. These rules supersede Company's previous gas limitation rules which became effective July 12, 1951, by order of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky dated July 11, 1951, as amended August 7, 1951; and they likewise supersede the gas limitation rules embodied in Petroleum Administration for Defense Order No. 2 which became effective August 22, 1951, and which were continued in effect under jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky by order of that Commission dated April 3, 1952. They are subject to such amendments, modifications and temporary exceptions as may be ordered or approved from time to time by Public Service Commission of Kentucky.

1. In order to assist the Company in forecasting future peak demands for its service and in order to afford a basis of priority in supplying additional gas space heating loads to existing, new or prospective premises, the Company will maintain a Register of New Gas Space Heating Loads applied for. A special application form will be provided by the Company for this purpose. Such applications for gas space heating may be made to the Company by the owner, builder, contractor or other person responsible for type of space heating installation in the premises for which such service is desired, and will be filled chronologically according to date on which received by the Company. As a condition precedent to the Customer's right to receive and the Company's agreement to supply gas for space heating service to equipment which qualifies for such service under these rules, applicant must secure Company's written acceptance of his application before proceeding with the installation of his equipment and shall give the Company opportunity to check conformity of his completed installation with these rules before connection to the Company's lines and commencement of gas service thereto.
2. The Company will not allow the connection to its lines or supply gas service to any new or additional gas space heating equipment installed in any residential or non-residential structure subsequent to the effective date of these rules unless and until written application for the right to connect such gas space heating equipment to Company's gas lines has been made to and approved in writing by the Company

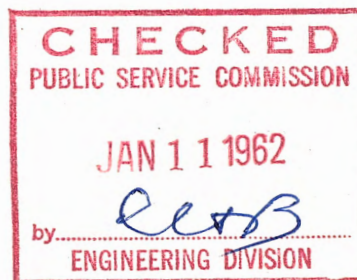

4. Curtailement and Interruption of Service. Company's standard rate schedules G-2, G-6 and G-8 are available only for interruptible gas service. Company shall have the right to require curtailment or interruption of gas usage under such rate schedules in accordance with the terms thereof or as Company may deem necessary to avoid a shortage of supply for residential and other high priority purposes. The order of such curtailment or interruption, insofar as practicable, shall be as follows:

- Step 1. Deliveries under Seasonal Off-Peak Gas Rate G-6.
- Step 2. Deliveries under Dual-Fuel Off-Peak Gas Space Heating Rate G-8.
- Step 3. Deliveries under Interruptible Commercial and Industrial Gas Rate G-2.

If, after reasonable notice from Company, any customer served under any of the above named interruptible rate schedules fails to limit his use of gas as directed by Company, then Company shall have the right, at its option, to either (1) discontinue its entire supply of gas to such customer and to withhold such supply until satisfactory assurance is given by the customer that any and all subsequent requests for limitation of his gas usage will be fully complied with, or (2) transfer the customer's gas service to General Service Rate G-1 if the load is eligible for service thereunder.

pursuant to the provisions of such authorization orders as may be issued from time to time by the Public Service Commission of Kentucky.

3. Any customer may replace his existing gas space heating equipment with new equipment of lesser or equal Btu hourly input capacity, provided he makes written application to the Company in the same manner and subject to the same written acceptance and approval as provided in Rule 1 above.

4. The total rated input capacity of gas space heating equipment eligible for natural gas service under General Gas Rate G-1 or Interruptible Commercial and Industrial Gas Rate G-2 shall be limited to an aggregate of 1,000,000 Btu per hour for any space heating customer at any one location. In the case of multi-family residential structures, each family dwelling unit equipped with its own heating system served directly by the Company through a separate gas metering installation will be considered a separate customer.

No customer whose existing gas space heating equipment already has an aggregate rated input capacity of 1,000,000 Btu or more per hour shall be eligible for any increase in such capacity under Rates G-1 or G-2. No customer whose existing gas space heating equipment has an aggregate rated input capacity of less than 1,000,000 Btu per hour shall be eligible for any increase in such capacity under Rates G-1 or G-2 in excess of the difference between the rated input capacity of his present equipment and 1,000,000 Btu per hour.

5. Company's acceptance of any new contract for the supply for commercial or industrial purposes of more than 75,000 cubic feet of gas on any one day or more than 2,000,000 cubic feet of gas in any one month may be conditioned upon the rendition of such service only under an interruptible or off-peak rate schedule, unless the nature of customer's gas usage is such that its curtailment or interruption would adversely affect the public welfare, health, or safety. As a condition precedent to connection of any loads to be served under an interruptible or off-peak rate schedule, Company may require such customers to install standby fuel installations of capacity acceptable to Company.

6. Whenever evidence available to the Company indicates that any gas space heating equipment has been installed in any premise and connected to the Company's gas service lines without having been registered with and approved in writing by the Company, as required by these rules, or has been otherwise installed in violation of said rules, the Company shall after five days written notice, discontinue the entire supply of gas to said premise and shall withhold such supply until such gas space heating equipment has been disconnected and the violation of these rules corrected to the satisfaction of the Company.

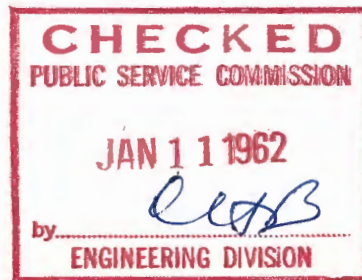

7. Company's standard rate schedules G-2, G-6 and G-8 are available only for interruptible gas service. No customer whose gas usage is of such nature that its curtailment or interruption would adversely affect the public welfare, health, or safety shall be eligible for service under an interruptible rate schedule unless he is equipped with adequate standby fuel facilities acceptable to Company. In the event that at any time Company's total available natural gas supply is insufficient in Company's judgment to meet the full requirements of all of its gas customers, Company shall have the right to require such degree of curtailment or interruption of gas usage, in accordance with the successive steps listed below, as it may deem necessary to avoid a shortage of supply for residential and other highly essential purposes closely related to the public welfare, health, or safety. The order of such curtailment or interruption, insofar as practicable, shall be as follows:

Step 1. Deliveries under Seasonal Off-Peak Gas Rate G-6.

Step 2. Deliveries under Dual-Fuel Off-Peak Gas Space Heating Rate G-8.

Step 3. Deliveries under Interruptible Commercial and Industrial Gas Rate G-2.

If, after reasonable notice from Company, any customer served under any of the above named interruptible rate schedules fails to limit his use of gas as directed by Company, then Company shall have the right to discontinue its entire supply of gas to such customer and to withhold such supply until satisfactory assurance is given by the customer that any and all subsequent requests for limitation of his gas usage will be fully complied with.
