U.S. 60 WATER DISTRICT OF SHELBY AND FRANKLIN COUNTIES

RULES AND REGULATIONS

This schedule of Rules and Regulations governs the furnishing of water service by U.S. 60 WATER DISTRICT OF SHELBY AND FRANKLIN COUNTIES (Ky.) hereinafter referred to as the Utility and applies to all service received from the Utility. No employee or individual director of the Utility is permitted to make an exception to Rates, Rules or Regulations. All Rules and Regulations are to be in effect so long as they are not in conflict with Public Service Commission Rules and Regulations. The Utility is further subject to all Rules and Regulations of the Commission even though not contained herein. (C)

REVISIONS

These Rules and Regulations may be revised, amended, supplemented or otherwise changed from time to time subject to approval of the Public Service Commission, and shall have the same force as the present Rules and Regulations.

SERVICE AREA

The Utility furnishes water service to the southeastern area of Shelby County and the west central area of Franklin County, Kentucky, with offices in Peoples Bank Building, Bagdad, Kentucky 40003.

AVAILABILITY

Water service is available to any domestic, commercial or industrial consumer within the Utility's area.

RATES AND TARIFFS

WATER FAILURE

The Utility is responsible for water failure only when in control of the Utility's employees. No consumer is paid damages for equipment unless such damages are specifically found to be caused by an act of negligence on the part of the Utility or its employees.

PROTECTION BY CONSUMER

Consumer shall protect the equipment of the Utility on his premises and shall not interfere with Utility's property or permit interferences except by duly authorized representatives of the Utility. (C)

RULES AND REGULATIONS

NOTICE OF TROUBLE

Consumer shall give immediate notice to the Utility of any irregularities or unsatisfactory service and of any defects known to consumer.

MAINTENANCE

The Utility may at any time deemed necessary, suspend service to any consumer or consumers for the purpose of making repairs, changes or improvements upon any part of its system. The Utility shall give reasonable notice of such suspension of service to the consumer.

The Utility shall be responsible for the maintenance of that portion of the service line installed by the Utility and the consumer shall be responsible for the maintenance of that portion thereof installed by the consumer.

EXTENSION OF SERVICE

Extension of service shall be in accordance with 807 KAR 5:066E, Section 12.

LINE RELOCATIONS

When necessary to move or relocate facilities, the cost will be paid by party or parties requesting such relocation.

BILLING, COLLECTION, PENALTIES

Bills for water service furnished by the water system will be mailed no later than the 30th day of each month and will be due and payable when rendered. If not paid within ten (10) days of the date mailed, penalty equal to ten percent (10%) of the bill will be applied.

DEPOSITS

The Utility may require from any customer or applicant for service a cash deposit or other guaranty to secure payment of bills not to exceed two-twelfths (2/12) of the estimated annual bill of such customer or applicant. Interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum will be paid on deposits so required, accruing from the date of deposit. (C)

DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE BY UTILITY

The Utility may refuse or discontinue service to an applicant or customer, after proper notice, for failure to comply with its rules and regulations or state and municipal rules and regulations, when a customer or applicant refuses or neglects to provide reasonable access to the premises, for fraudulent or illegal use of service, or for nonpayment of bills. If discontinuance is for nonpayment of bills, the customer shall be given at least forty-eight (48) hours written notice, separate from the original bill, and cut-off shall be effected not less than twenty (20) days after the mailing date of the original bill unless, prior to discontinuance, a residential customer presents to the Utility a written certificate, signed by a physician, registered nurse, or public health officer, that such discontinuance will aggravate an existing illness or infirmity on the affected premises, in which case discontinuance may not be effected until the affected resident can make other living arrangements or until not less than ten (10) days elapse from the date of the Utility's notification. When a dangerous condition is found to exist on the customer's or applicant's premises, the service shall be cut off without notice or refused.

When services are discontinued and all bills paid, the customer's deposit and accrued interest held by the Utility will be refunded. Upon discontinuance of service for nonpayment of bills, the total amount of the deposit and accrued interest held by the Utility will be applied toward the unpaid account. If the account is thereby fully paid the balance of said deposit and interest shall be refunded to the customer. Service discontinued for nonpayment of bills will be restored only after bills are paid in full and service charge of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) paid for each meter reconnected. (C)

DISTRIBUTION EXTENSIONS

Any person desiring an extension to the District's system shall request same in writing on a form approved by the District for such extensions. Any requested extension shall be provided as follows:

The District shall determine the total cost of the proposed water main extension (exclusive of the meter connection) and the total length of the extension. The District shall pay that portion of the cost of the water main extension equal to 50 feet for each applicant for service (the "50' rule contribution" as required by 807 KAR 5:066 §12(1). That part of the cost not covered by the District's portion shall be contributed equally by those applicants desiring service on the main extension. Each applicant will also be required to pay the District's approved "Tap-on-fee" for a meter connection to the main extension.

For a period of ten years after the original construction of the main extension each additional customer directly connected to each particular extension will be required to contribute to the cost of that water main extension based on a recomputation of both the District's portion of the total cost and each customer's contribution as set out above. The District must refund to those customers that have previously contributed to the cost of each main extension itself that amount necessary to reduce their contribution to the currently calculated amount for each customer connected to that extension. All customers directly connected to each main extension for a ten year period after it is placed in

service are to contribute equally to cost of construction of the water main extension itself. In addition each customer must pay the approved "Tap-on-fee" applicable at the time of their application for the meter connection. The "Tap-on-fee" is not part of the refundable cost of the extension and may be changed during the refund period. After the ten-year refund period expires, any additional customer applying for service on each main extension must be connected for the amount of the approved "Tap-on-fee" only.

All taps and connections to the extended line shall be made by District personnel.

It is the District's policy to use surplus district revenues to assist, in a nondiscriminatory manner, the extension of the District's water distribution system to areas not yet served by public water systems. When the District's surplus revenues permit, the District finds that there is a substantial opportunity for repayment of the District's additional contribution to construction costs, the District finds that the proposed extension will not otherwise be constructed, and the initial applicants unanimously agree, the District may, under the restrictions of this rule, contribute additional construction funds (over and above the 50' rule contribution) for the purpose of reducing each initial applicant's required contribution.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

When this occurs the District shall treat itself as one or more additional applicants, and shall accordingly contribute additional construction funds in an amount equal to each applicant's required contribution times the number of the District's contributions as an applicant(s). The District shall also contribute the appropriate additional sums under the 50' rule. All applicants other than the District shall execute in favor of the District a written assignment of each applicant's future refunds under this rule. Each refund so received shall be applied by the District toward the District's construction contribution for the water main extension (but not including the District's additional 50' rule contributions). Once the District's construction contribution has been repaid in full the assignments shall expire and all future refunds shall be paid directly to all applicants other than the District. In addition those refunds which would otherwise be paid to the District shall then be evenly divided between all applicants other than the District.
