## CONTRACT FOR PURCHASE OF TREATED WATER

WITNESSETH:

SEP 22 1994

PURSUANT TO 807 KAR 5:011,

THAT WHEREAS, KENTUCKY WATER SERVICE COMPANY, INC., is a Kentucky corporation engaged in the acquisition, treatment, distribution, and sale of pure and potable water, and is presently serving the City of Somerset, Kentucky, including a portion of the area encompassed by the geographic boundaries of the PLEASANT HILL WATER DISTRICT, hereinafter made more definite, and said Water Company has adequate facilities and water capacity in and about the area of Somerset, Kentucky, to sell treated water on a substantial basis to said District; and

WHEREAS said Water District has obtained a grant in the amount of \$61,300.00 from Farmers Home Administration, a facility of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, to be supplemented by the proceeds from a loan of \$103,000 to be evidenced by Promissory Note, secured by Mortgage on plant facilities and pledge of certain revenues to the Farmers Home Administration payable over a period of forty (40) years from the date of said loan; and additional funds for the construction of said water district having been obtained by contributions from the prospective users in the amount of \$17,700.00; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary prior to the execution of the aforesaid Promissory Note and Mortgage in the sum of \$103,000.00 to the Farmers Home Administration that the Water District enter into a contract with said Water Company whereby said Water Company will agree to furnish adequate water to said Water District for a period of not less than forty (40) years, and it is therefore appropriate that this Contract now be consummated,

NOW THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES AND THE MUTUAL COVENANTS AND UNDERTAKINGS HEREIN DESCRIBED, THE PARTIES HERETO COVENANT AND AGREE, EACH WITH THE OTHER, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Kentucky Water Service Company, Inc., hereby covenants and agrees to sell to the Pleasant Hill Water District a volume of pure treated water which shall not exceed Two Hundred Sixteen Thousand (216,000) Gallons per day (being a pumpage of 150 gallons per minute for a 24-hour period), the price of said water to be in accordance with the following schedule:

Service will be supplied under Company's General Rules and Regulations, and subject to rates and the Rules and Regulations of the Public Service Commission of the State of Kentucky.

It is hereby acknowledged by the PLEASANT HILL WATER DISTRICT that 216,000 gallons of pure and treated water per day is adequate for the present and foreseeable needs of the Water District. The foregoing schedule of rates for

treated water furnished by Kentucky Water Service Company, Inc., is stated by the Water Company to be its approved, commercial schedule for treated water.

Section 2. The Water District hereby covenants and agrees to cause to be constructed an adequate reception and pumping facility to receive said purchased water from Water Company. Said pumping and reception facility shall have a minimum capability of pumping treated water at the rate of one hundred and fifty (150) gallons per minute and shall be constructed in full compliance with regulations, standards, and requirements of the Kentucky State Department of Health and any other public agencies having regulatory jurisdiction thereof. Said pumping and reception facility shall be constructed at the location noted on that certain site plan prepared by the Water District's Consulting Engineers, which PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION is appended hereto as Exhibit "A," and said location is hereby Office COMMISSION and consented to by Water Company.

This Contract shall remain in full force and effect to PURSUANT TO 807 KAR 5.011, Section 3. term of forty (40) years from and after July 15, 1969, said expiration date being July 14, 2009. It is acknowledged by the parties hereto that July 14, 2009, will be the latest possible date of the final maturity of the Promissory Note to be executed by the Water District to the Farmers Home Administration; except that, if by reason of a delay in executing the said Promissory Note and Mortgage, the date of the same is later, this agreement shall automatically be amended to conform to the date of the proposed Promissory Note and Mortgage to the Farmers Home Administration. It is further provided that in the event any court of competent jurisdiction shall ever hold the duration of this Contract is illegal by reason of being in excess of twenty (20) years or any other period, then it is agreed by the parties that this Contract shall be effective for a period of twenty (20) years or for such shorter period as shall be determined to be valid by a final decision of such court, provided, however, this clause is not to be construed as indicating any doubt as to the validity or effectiveness of said forty (40) years provision or of any other provision of this Contract. Upon termination of the term of this Contract, it may thereafter be renewed or extended for such term or terms as may be agreed upon between the Kentucky Water Service

Company, Inc., and the Pleasant Hill Water District.

Section 4. The effectiveness of this Contract is subject to the award by the Water District of contracts for the construction of its waterworks distribution system after approval by the Public Service Commission of Kentucky and the effectiveness of this Contract is also subject to the approval of said Public Service Commission. The Water District agrees that it will receive construction bids and make award of said bids at the earliest feasible date.

Section 5. The quality of water delivered by the Water Company to the Water District hereunder shall meet the standards of the United States Public Health Service's Limitations for Drinking Water.

Section 6. In the event that the water needs of said Water District should exceed two hundred sixteen thousand (216,000) gallons per day, the Water Company will endeavor to provide adequate service to the Water District to the extent necessary, but cannot unqualifiedly covenant to do so. As noted aforesaid, it is acknowledged that 216,000 gallons of water per day is at this time in excess of present and foreseeable water needs of the Water District. Sums due and payable from the Water District to the Water Company for purhcase of treated water on the basis aforesaid, shall be due and payable at the same time and in the same manner as other commercial accounts of the Kentucky Water Service Commission in Effective the Somerset, Kentucky, area.

Section 8. This Contract shall inure to the benefit of, and shall be binding upon the parties hereto, and their successors in interest, grantees, assignees, and transferees.

Section 9. The terms of this Contract are subject to the rights of the holders of any Notes and Mortgages encumbering the water works system of the Water District.

Section 10. Nothing contained in this Contract is to be construed or intended by the parties as divesting the Public Service Commission of Kentucky of any of its authority, control, or prerogatives in connection with either of the parties.

Section 11. It is agreed that the Water Company will furnish the master meter at the point of delivery of water to the Water District at the connection point approximately four hundred (400) feet northwest of U. S. Highway 27 on the Clifty Road, KY. 1647, and that the Water Company shall furnish, install, own, and maintain said meter.

Section 12. Temporary or partial failures to deliver water shall be remedied with all possible dispatch. In the event of an extended shortgage of water, or the supply of water available to the Water Company is otherwise diminished over an extended period of time, the supply of water to the Water District's customers shall be reduced or diminished in the same ratio or proportion as the supply to the Water Company's customers is reduced or diminished, except as otherwise provided by the Rules and Regulations of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, or the statutes now or which might later be in effect in Kentucky.

Section 13. If any section, paragraph, or clause of this Contract shall public SERVICE COMMISSION be invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, or clause Exercise any of the remaining provisions of this Contract.





## DEED OF EASEMENT

That for and in consideration of the mutual WITNESSETH: benefits to be derived hereunder, including the provision of water to certain residents within Pulaski County, Kentucky by the second party, the party of the first part does hereby grant unto the party of the second part a perpetual easement on and use of the Pulaski County road rights-of-way throughout Pulaski County south of the Cumberland River for the construction and maintenance of water lines for what is known as the Pleasant Hill Water District water project.

The party of the second part agrees as a condition hereof to restore any disturbed portions of the rights-of-way to as good or better condition as before any disturbance due to construction or The party of the second part maintenance of lines hereunder. further agrees as a condition hereof to be responsible for the cost of relocating any water lines on the first party's rights-of-way in the event relocation is necessitated due to construction, reconstruction, or widening or the rights-of-way by the first party.

It is further agreed and understood by the parties hereto that the party of the second part shall be responsible for all maintenance of the water lines referred to herein.
