The consumer agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. The Cooperative reserves the right to measure such power factor at any time. Should such measurements indicate that the power factor at the time of the consumer's maximum demand is less than 80%, the demand for billing purposes shall be the demand as indicated or recorded by the demand meter multiplied by .80 and divided by the percent power factor.

MINIMUM ANNUAL CHARGE FOR SEASONAL SERVICE

Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons not exceeding nine (9) months per year may guarantee a minimum annual payment of twelve (12) times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with the foregoing section in which case there shall be no minimum monthly charge.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

- (1) Motors having a rated capacity in excess of 10 horse-power must be three-phase.
- (2) All wiring, pole lines, and other electrical equipment beyond the metering point shall be considered the distribution system of the consumer and shall be furnished and maintained by the consumer.
- (3) If service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, a discount of ten (10) percent shall apply to the demand and energy charges; and if the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of ten (10) percent shall also apply to the minimum charge. However, the Cooperative shall have the option of metering at secondary voltage and adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt hours and kilowatt demand.

This tariff is limited to the consumers selected by the cooperative and will require the installation of a special meter capable of registering the on-peak and off-peak kilowatt hours.

SUMMER SCHEDULE

For the purpose of this tariff, the on-peak billing period for the months of May, June, July, August, and September is defined as 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., local time, for all days of the week, including Saturday, Sunday and holidays. The off-peak billing period is defined as 10:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m., local time for all days of the week, including Saturday, Sunday and holidays.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within fifteen (15) days from the date of the bill, five percent (5%) shall be added to the bill.

FUEL ADJUSTMENT CHARGE

All rates are applicable to the Fuel Adjustment Clause and may be increased or decreased by an amount per kWh equal to the fuel adjustment amount per kWh as billed by the Wholesale Power Supplier plus an allowance for line losses. The allowance for line losses will not exceed 10% and is based on a twelve month moving average of such losses. Rates and service information can be obtained from the Cooperative office or Cooperative personnel.

2. REVISIONS

These Rules and Regulations may be revised, amended, supplemented or otherwise changed from time to time by the Fox Creek Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation Board of Directors and approved by the Public Service Commission. Such changes when effective shall have the same force as the present Rules and Regulations. The member shall be informed through the Cooperative's monthly newsletter or direct mailing.

3. MEMBER'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR COOPERATIVE'S PROPERTY

5. COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS

If such tests show that the meter was not more than two per cent (2%) fast, the Cooperative will make a service charge of twelve dollars (\$12.00) for the test. Such charge would be subject to the same collection policies as any other amount due and owing to the Cooperative. If the meter, after testing, is found to be more than two per cent (2%) fast or slow the members bill will be adjusted as prescribed in the Kentucky Public Service Commission Rules and Regulations, 807 KAR 5:041, Section 17.

19. DISTRIBUTION LINE EXTENSIONS

An extension of 1,000 feet or less shall be made to existing distribution line without charge for a prospective member. When an extension of distribution line to serve an applicant or group of applicants amounts to more than 1,000 feet per member, the applicant or applicants may be required to deposit the total cost of the excessive footage over 1,000 feet per member.

The cost will be based on the average estimated cost per foot of the total extension. Each member receiving service under such extension will be reimbursed under the following plan: Each year for a period of not less than ten (10) years, the Cooperative shall refund to the member or members who paid for the excessive footage, the cost of 1,000 feet of the extension in place for each additional member connected during the year whose service line is directly connected to the extension installed and not to extensions of laterals therefrom, but in no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the amount paid the Cooperative. This refund is not allowable for any type service other than a permanent residence or commercial service. Camps and week-end cottages are classified as temporary services and will not be considered permanent residences due to their incidental usage.

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After the end of the refund period, no refunds will be required to be made. An applicant desiring an extension to a proposed real estate subdivision may be required to pay the entire cost of the extension. Each year for a period of not less than ten (10) years, the Cooperative shall refund to the applicant who paid for the extension, a sum equivalent to the cost of 1,000 feet of the extension installed for each additional member connected during the year, but in no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the amount paid to the Cooperative. After the end of the refund period from the completion of the extension, no refund will be required to be made.

20. UNDERGROUND ELECTRIC SERVICE

The purpose of this regulation is to formulate Fox Creek Rural Electric Cooperative's requirements for underground electrical service for individuals and subdivisions, the application of which will insure adequate service and safety to all persons engaged in the construction, maintenance, operation, and use of underground facilities and to the public in general.

A. Applicability - This policy shall only apply to underground electrical supply facilities used in connection with electric distribution within the definitions set out herein.

B. Definitions - The following words and terms, when used in this policy, shall have the meaning indicated:

Applicant - The developer, builder, or other person, partnership, association, corporation, or governmental agency applying for the installation of an underground electric distribution system.

Building - A structure enclosed within exterior walls or fire walls built, erected, or framed of component structural parts and designed for less than five (5) family occupancy.

Multiple-Occupancy Building - A structure enclosed within exterior walls or fire walls, built, erected, and framed of component structural parts and designed to contain five (5) or more individual dwelling units.

Subdivision - The tract of land which is divided into ten (10) or more lots for the construction of new residential buildings, or the land on which is constructed two (2) or more new multiple occupancy buildings.

Trenching and Backfilling - Opening and preparing the ditch for the installation of conductors including placing of raceways under roadways, driveways, or paved areas; providing a sand bedding below and above conductors when required and backfill of trench to ground level.

C. Rights of Way and Easements

1. The Cooperative shall construct, own, operate and maintain distribution lines only along easements, public streets, roads and highways which are by legal right accessible to the utility's equipment and which the utility has the legal right to occupy, and the public lands and private property across which rights of way and easements satisfactory to the Cooperative are provided without cost or condemnation by the Cooperative.
2. Rights of way and easements suitable to the Cooperative for the underground distribution facilities must be furnished by the applicant in reasonable time to meet service requirements. The applicant shall make the area in which the underground distribution facilities are to be located accessible to the Cooperative's equipment, remove all obstructions from such area, stake to show property lines and final grade, perform rough grading to a reasonable approximation of final grade, and maintain clearing and grading during construction by the Cooperative.

Cooperative shall complete the installation 30 days prior to the estimated completion date. (Subject to weather and ground conditions and availability of materials and barring extra-ordinary or emergency circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the Cooperative.) However, nothing in this policy shall be interpreted to require the Cooperative to extend the service portions of the subdivisions not under active development.

- 5. A non-refundable payment shall be made by the applicant equal to the difference between the cost of providing underground facilities and that of providing overhead facilities. The payment to be made by the applicant shall be determined from the total footage of single-phase primary, secondary and service conductor to be installed at an average per foot cost differential in accordance with the average cost differential filed herewith as Exhibit A, which shall be updated annually as required by the Public Service Commission. Where rock, shale, or other impairments are anticipated or encountered in construction, the actual increased cost of trenching and backfilling shall be borne by the applicant.

- 6. The applicant may be required to deposit the entire estimated cost of the extension. If this is done, the amount deposited in excess of the normal charge for the underground extensions provided in Paragraph 5 above shall be refunded to the applicant over a ten (10) year period as provided by the Public Service Commission. The Cooperative shall then credit the applicant's cost in an amount equal to the Cooperative's normal cost for trenching and backfilling. However, the Cooperative personnel must be present at the time of backfilling if the member elects to trench and backfill.

- 8. The Cooperative shall furnish, install, and maintain the service lateral to the Applicant's meter base.

13. In unusual circumstances, when the application of these rules appears impractical or unjust to either party, or discriminatory to other consumers, the Cooperative or Applicant shall refer the matter to the Commission for special ruling or for the approval of special conditions which may be mutually agreed upon, prior to commencing construction.

14. For all other developments that do not meet the conditions set forth in these rules above, underground distribution will be installed provided an advance to the Company is made in an amount equal to the difference between the Company's estimated cost of underground facilities and overhead facilities, which it would otherwise provide.

E. Installation of Underground Distribution Systems Other Than For New Subdivision Developments

Upon agreement of both parties, the applicant is responsible for opening and closing the trench and furnishing conduit to the utility's specifications. than 1,000 feet from the nearest facility, an advance (deposit) equal to the reasonable cost incurred for that portion of service beyond 300 feet plus fifty dollars (\$50.00) will be required. Beyond 1,000 feet, the extension policy as set forth in Item No. 19, Distribution Line Extensions, of these Rules and Regulations, shall apply. The advance (deposit) for extensions greater than 300 feet and less than 1,000 feet shall be refunded to the customer over a four (4) year period in equal amounts for each year service is continued. If the service is disconnected for a period of sixty (60) days, or should the mobile home be removed and another not take its place within sixty days (60) or be replaced by a permanent structure, the remainder of the advance (deposit) shall be forfeited. No refunds shall be made to any customer who did not make the advance (deposit) originally.

The applicant shall be responsible for the installation of necessary service equipment and provide the proper supporting structure in accordance with the National Electrical Safety Code and the National Electric Code heretofore adopted.

To avoid locating service in the wrong place, mobile homes must be set in place before service is extended. As soon as mobile home is set in place, applicant must advise the office of Fox Creek Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation and request permanent service. The Engineering Department will have to stake the line and prepare the work order for the construction crew. Normally, service can be extended within five (5) working days after notification from the applicant, providing there are no unusual circumstances such as bad weather, right of way problems, etc.

When the Cooperative is requested to relocate its' facilities for any reason(s), any expense involved will be paid by the firm, person, or person, requesting the relocation, unless one or more of the following conditions are met:

23. TEMPORARY SERVICE

24. FAILURE OF METER TO REGISTER

In the event a member's meter should fail to register, the member shall be billed from the date of such failure at the average consumption of the member, based on the twelve months period immediately preceding the failure.

25. APPLICATION FOR SERVICE

Each prospective member desiring electric service may be required to sign Cooperative's standard form of application for membership and for electric service, also, sign a contract when applicable before service is supplied by the Cooperative.

CONTINUITY OF SERVICE

for nonpayment of bills. If discontinuance is for nonpayment of bills, the members shall be given at least ten (10) days written notice, separate from the original bill, and cut-off shall be effected not less than twenty-seven (27) days after the mailing date of the original bill unless, prior to discontinuance, a residential member presents a written certificate signed by a physician, a registered nurse or a public health officer stating that, in the opinion of the person making the certification discontinuance of service will aggravate an existing illness or infirmity on the affected premises, in which case discontinuance may be effected not less than thirty (30) days from the date the Cooperative notifies the member, in writing, of state and federal programs which may be available to aid in payment of bills and the office to contact for such possible assistance.

When a dangerous condition is found to exist on the customer's or applicant's premises, the service shall be cut off without notice or refused, provided that the Cooperative notifies the customer immediately of the reasons for the discontinuance or refusal and the corrective action to be taken by the applicant or customer before service can be restored.

28. LEVELIZED BILLING

N

The Cooperative will provide a Levelized Billing Plan for any member who wishes to equalize monthly electric bills based on the latest twelve (12) months usage. The primary purpose of the levelized billing plan is to equalize a member's bill without accumulating a large credit or debit balance on the account.

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The member's bill is levelized by averaging energy charges on twelve (12) months of usage history. If twelve (12) months of usage history is not available, the bill average can be calculated on the history available.

actual and average charges is called the "deferred balance". There are two (2) deferred balances - the current deferred balance which is the difference in the actual and the average charges for the most recent bill and the prior deferred balance which is the accumulated difference in the actual and average charges for the prior bills.

Any member may be set up on levelized billing at any time of the year if the account is paid up to date.

The levelized billing plan may be cancelled by the member at any time.

The member agrees to pay the levelized amount specified including security light amount, if applicable, and send a meter reading within fifteen days from the date of the statement each month.

29. MONITORING USAGE

The following procedure has been established for monitoring customer usage so as to detect any unusual deviations in individual customer usage and the reasons for such deviations.

The computerized billing system is programmed to automatically alert Fox Creek Rural Electric to any consumer provided meter readings which would cause kWh usage to be significantly higher or lower than usual.

The criteria used in the computer program to determine high usage is:

If usage minus the average is greater than 50 and that usage is greater than 1 1/2 times the average.

IF the usage exceeded 1/2 the capacity of the meter.
