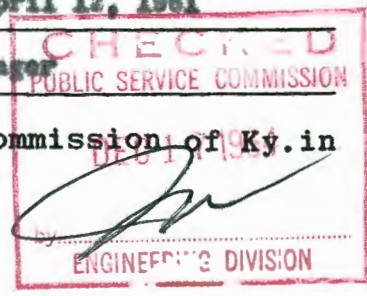

(3) All wiring, pole lines, and other electrical equipment beyond the metering point, shall be considered the distribution system of the consumer and shall be furnished and maintained by the consumer.

(4) If service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, a discount of ten per cent (10%) shall apply to the demand and energy charges, and if the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of 10% shall also apply to the minimum charge. However, the Seller shall have the option of metering at secondary voltage and adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt-hours and kilowatt demand.

(5) In those cases where additional investment is required for three-phase service it will be rendered only after the following conditions are met:

(a) The consumer will give satisfactory assurance by means of a written agreement as to the character, amount, and duration of the business offered.

(b) The consumer will guarantee a minimum monthly bill for the three-phase service which will be computed on the basis of any additional investment including the additional cost of any transformers and other equipment necessary to make effective for a period of time designated in the written agreement from the date on which service commences under (a) above.

A - CLASSIFICATION OF CONSUMERS FOR RATE PURPOSES

1. Service is available to anyone not now receiving central station service, who can be reached by the electric distribution lines of the Cooperative, either directly, or by extensions. Each prospective member is required to sign the Cooperative's form of application for membership before service is supplied, and is subject to the rules and regulations of this Cooperative. Copies of these rules may be inspected by consumers at any time.
2. Each separate house or other living quarters occupied as a distinct household is considered a "Farm or Home" consumer.
3. Any business establishment such as a store, post office, garage, tavern, creamery, factory, etc., is considered a "Commercial" consumer.
4. Should a consumer have his home and business on the same premises and desire service through a single meter, he should be classified as a commercial consumer. Should the service be distinctly predominant as a farm and home service, the combined service may be classified as "Farm and Home" service.
5. A home, farm or commercial consumer having an individual motor capacity over 5 H.P., or several motors totaling over $7\frac{1}{2}$ H.P. capacity, but whose load requirements can usually be met by a transformer capacity of not over 25 KVA shall be classified as "Small Power".
6. Any consumer whose load requires more than 25 KVA of transformer capacity shall be classified as "Large Power".
7. Any public institution essentially non-profit in character shall be classified as "Schools, Churches, and Public Buildings".

B - SERVICE

1. Each consumer must sign an application for each meter installation and be bound by the terms thereof.
2. The Cooperative's authorized agents have access to consumer's premises at all reasonable times to install, read, inspect, repair, or remove any meters or equipment used to supply electricity.
3. When service is temporarily disconnected at the request of the consumer, a charge of \$2.00 is made before service is reconnected on the same premises.
4. Meter cards are mailed to the consumers on the 19th of each month, to be marked on the twenty-second and returned to the office. Bills are mailed by the first of the following month, and are considered delinquent if not paid on or before the 15th. A delinquent notice is mailed on all unpaid accounts. Five days after this notice is mailed, all unpaid accounts are turned over to the collector to be collected or disconnected. In all cases

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where a collection trip is necessary a \$2.00 collection fee will be added to the amount of the bill. If the bill is not paid at the time of collection service will be discontinued without further notice, and the amount in arrears, plus an additional \$2.00 reconnection charge, must be paid to the Cooperative before service is restored.

5. Energy sold to the consumer is solely for the use of the consumer on his own premises, and not to be resold by the consumer to any other person.

C - ELECTRIC BILLS

1. A prepayment or guarantee equal to twice the average monthly bill, or \$10.00 may be required of any consumer who is not a landowner, before service is supplied, if the Cooperative deems it necessary to insure payment for the service it will render. Upon termination of service this amount may be applied against any unpaid accounts of the consumer, and any balance remaining after payment of account shall be returned to the consumer. Large commercial or large power applicants shall be handled according to Large Power Rate Schedule.
2. Failure to receive a bill does not exempt a consumer from his obligation to pay Cooperative. Meter cards are marked by consumer. If meter card is not received an estimated bill is made out, based upon past consumption. Upon failure to send in a meter card for three consecutive months the Cooperative will send out a man to read meter and a \$2.00 charge will be made for this service.

D - METERS

1. The Cooperative installs all meters at its own expense. This includes all necessary measuring instruments.
2. If a consumer should require more than one meter, the consumer will receive a separate bill for each meter.
3. If a meter is read incorrectly, as soon as the correct reading has been determined, an appropriate adjustment will be made.
4. All new meters shall be checked for accuracy before installation. All meters in service shall be tested at least once in each eight year period. Any Consumer's meter shall be tested upon request, by signing a form requesting that the test be made. After the test has been made and if the meter is found to be not more than 2% slow or 2% fast the Cooperative shall collect \$2.00 from said consumer. If the meter is more than 2% slow or 2% fast an adjustment will be made to the consumer's bill for a period of sixty days and no charge will be made for testing the meter. All commercial meters shall be tested once every two years.
5. For any period that a meter is found to have failed to register, it shall be assumed that the demand established or electric energy delivered, as the case may be, during said period is the same as that of a period of operation to be agreed upon by the Cooperative and the consumer, during which such meter was in service and operating.

When the Cooperative has reasonable evidence that a consumer is obtaining all or part of his electricity by any method that interferes with the proper metering of service delivered to his equipment, the Cooperative can estimate and present a bill for unmetered service, and damages to equipment

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resulting from such interference. Such bill shall be due and payable immediately, subject to a service disconnection within 48 hours. When service is thus disconnected the consumer will be reconnected provided the consumer agrees to comply with reasonable requirements to protect Cooperative against further losses.

E - CONSUMER EQUIPMENT

1. Consumer's wiring, etc., must be approved by a certificate of the State Electric Inspection Bureau showing that the wiring fully complies with all of the rules and regulations of the National Electric Code of the National Board of Fire Underwriters and the Rural Electrification Administration. This rule shall not apply where temporary service is desired during the construction of any permanent building and service is to be of a temporary nature only. For this inspection service the Cooperative shall charge \$2.50 and each reinspection shall be \$2.50. Any additions or alterations to an original wiring job are subject to reinspection. The Cooperative has the right to disconnect any service that shows a dangerous or unsafe condition which could cause damage to its lines or equipment, but by any such inspection, or failure to inspect or reject any wiring job, shall not render the Cooperative liable or responsible for any loss or damage resulting from defects in the installation, wiring, or appliances, or from violation of Cooperative rules, or from accidents which may occur upon consumers' premises. Before a reconnection is made of premises disconnected for reasons of unsafe wiring conditions, a reinspection certificate from the State Electric Bureau is required. The terms of the loan contract with REA state that "Borrower shall not serve any consumer through the system until the Borrower shall have furnished evidence satisfactory to the Administration that such consumers' premises have been properly wired."
2. All electrical apparatus of consumers shall be so designed, installed and operated as not to interfere with the service of other consumers. Where such apparatus does not meet these requirements, service may be discontinued until consumer remedies conditions causing such interference.
3. Consumers desiring three phase service shall be subject to rate schedule "B" or "LP", whichever is applicable.
4. Consumer should notify Cooperative of any material changes proposed in his installation. Where material additions to the installation are desired, consumer should secure consent of Cooperative.

F - IN GENERAL

1. All inquiries concerning service or rate should be made directly to office of Cooperative.
2. No agent of the Cooperative can alter or make exceptions to any rates, rules or regulations incorporated in the contract or approved by the Cooperative and the REA. All changes must be made by the Board of Directors and notice thereof shall be given to the REA and every consumer.
3. These Rules and Regulations may be revised, amended, supplemented, or otherwise changed from time to time, without notice. Such changes, when effective, shall have the same force as the present Rules and Regulations. The Consumers shall be informed of any changes as soon as possible, after made.

In those cases where additional investment is required for three phase service, it will be rendered only after the following conditions are met.

The customer will give satisfactory assurance by means of a written agreement as to the character, amount, and duration of the business offered.

The customer will guarantee a minimum monthly bill for the three-phase service which will be computed on the basis of 1 1/2 percent of the additional investment, which includes the additional cost of transformers, necessary to make three-phase service available. The minimum bill will be effective for a period of three (3) years from the date on which service commences. After this period the regular monthly charge will be effective.

In no case will the minimum bill for three-phase service be less than the previously specified "Minimum Monthly Charge."

SPECIAL RULES:

Service under this schedule is limited to customers whose load requirements can be met by a transformer having a capacity not to exceed 25 KVA. Service under this schedule is not available to seasonal customers unless otherwise provided for.

Single phase power service is limited to a single motor not in excess of five horsepower (5 H.P.) capacity or a total connected motor load not in excess of seven and one-half horsepower (7 1/2 H.P.) motors having a rate capacity in excess of five horsepower (5 H.P.) must be three-phase.

The customer agrees to maintain a power factor of 80% at the time of his monthly maximum demand. The cooperative reserves the right to measure such power factor at any time. Should such measurements indicate that the power factor of the customer at the time of his maximum demand is less than 80%, the customer agrees, upon sixty (60) days' written notice to correct such power factor to 80%.

Motors having a rated capacity in excess of five horsepower (5 H.P.) must be three-phase.

Customers may connect incidental lighting to power circuits from the power meter, provided that the connected load and kilowatt-hour consumption of this incidental lighting shall not exceed 15% of the connected power load and kilowatt-hour consumption. Any transformer or regulating equipment which may be required for such lighting shall be furnished by the customer.

All wiring, pole lines, wires, and other electrical equipment beyond the metering point, exclusive of the service transformers and protective equipment, is considered the distribution system of the customer and shall be furnished and maintained by the customer.

If service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, a discount of ten (10%) shall apply to the bill and to the above minimum charge.
