SCHEDULE "SL" - STREET LIGHTING SERVICE

RATE
PER UNIT

APPLICABILITY

Applicable to towns and villages for street lighting.

BASE RATE PER LIGHT PER YEAR

For dusk to dawn lighting with lights mounted on existing wooden poles with bracket attachments and connected to existing overhead secondary circuits.

\$1.50 per lamp per month, not to exceed 200 watts.

ADDED CHARGES

For wooden poles required for street lights in addition to existing distribution line poles, a charge of \$3.00 per pole per year shall apply.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

1. Street-lighting equipment including lamps, fixtures, control and the necessary street-lighting circuits, transformers, and additional guys and fittings will be furnished and maintained by the cooperative.

2. Lamp replacements will be made by the cooperative without additional charge, except that any damage to lamps and luminaires resulting from vandalism shall be charged to consumer at cost as a separate item on the monthly bill for service. Outages should be promptly reported.

3. Service will be furnished for future additional lamps connected to existing overhead secondary circuits in accordance with the above charges.

4. This schedule applies to either multiple or series street lighting circuits. The consumer will determine the type of circuit.

SCHEDULE "SL" - STREET LIGHTING SERVICE

RATE
PER UNIT

FUEL COST ADJUSTMENT CHARGE

In case the rate under which Seller purchases power at wholesale is adjusted in accordance with a fuel cost adjustment provision in Seller's wholesale power contract, the foregoing energy charges shall be adjusted each month by the amount per KWhr of sales by the Seller equal to the dollar amount of the fuel clause adjustment in the Cooperative's wholesale power cost for the next preceding month.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

1. Charges for annual use will be billed monthly in twelve (12) equal installments. Charges for seasonal use will be billed monthly during the lighting season in equal installments.

2. The above charges are net, the gross being five (5) per cent higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within fifteen (15) days from the date of the bill, the gross charges shall apply. Delinquent accounts are subject to a collection fee of \$5.00 or disconnection of service.

of electric energy, but should supply fail or be uninterrupted through act of God, the public enemy, by accident, strikes, labor troubles, by action of the elements, or by any other cause beyond the reasonable control of the cooperative, the cooperative shall not be liable therefor.

6. RELOCATION OF LINES BY REQUEST OF MEMBERS

The cooperative's established lines will not be relocated unless the expense for moving and relocating is paid by the member, except in instances where it would be to the advantage of the cooperative to make such relocation.

7. SERVICES PERFORMED FOR MEMBERS

The cooperative's personnel is prohibited from making repairs or performing services to the members' equipment or property except in cases of emergency or to protect the public or member's person, or property. When such emergency services are performed the member shall be charged for such service at the rate of time and material.

Service Procedures

8. APPLICATION FOR SERVICE

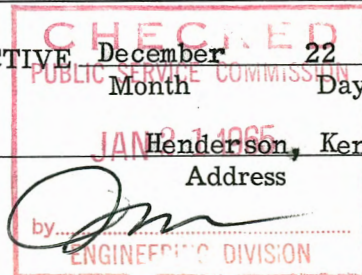
Each prospective member desiring electric service will be required to sign the cooperative's form "Application for Membership and for Electric Service" before service is supplied by the cooperative and provide the cooperative with necessary easements or right-of-way permits.

9. The cooperative will not connect any service until the required membership fee, plus any required deposits are paid. Requirements are as follows:

- (a) Industrial accounts will be handled on an individual basis.
- (b) Commercial accounts - the consumer will pay a \$5.00 membership fee plus a \$20.00 prepayment.
- (c) Farm, Non-farm, & Residential - it will be necessary that all members of this classification pay a \$5.00 membership fee. If in the event the property is owned by a person desiring service, no further deposit will

13. RECONNECTION CHARGES

The Cooperative will make no charge for connecting service to the member's premises for the initial installation of service, or to the member's premises if the service to be connected is replacing service which has been destroyed by fire. When service has been terminated, or service is transferred to a new member, the Cooperative's representative shall read the meter at such premises and secure the necessary application for service from the new occupant. A service charge of \$5.00 (five dollars) will be made to new occupant for the reconnecting or transferring of such service. Service charge will be due and payable at time of connection or transfer, or upon notice of said charge. No meters shall be installed or reinstalled after working hours unless in the judgment of the Manager there exists circumstances that will justify the additional expense. In these cases a service charge of \$10.00 (ten dollars) will apply.

14. RESALE OF POWER BY MEMBERS

All purchased electric service used on the premises of the member shall be supplied exclusively by the Cooperative and the member shall not directly or indirectly sell, sublet, or otherwise dispose of the electric service of any part thereof.

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15. SERVICE CHARGE

All service calls made by the Cooperative pertaining to the consumer's premises shall be charged at the rate of \$5.00 (five dollars) per call during normal working hours.

16. SERVICE CHARGE FOR TEMPORARY SERVICE

Consumer requiring temporary service may be required to pay all costs of connecting and disconnecting incidental to the supplying and removing of service. In addition to this a deposit will be required to cover estimated consumption of electricity. Both fees will be paid in advance. Any balance remaining at the end of the temporary service shall be refunded.

Consumers requiring temporary service for new construction are required to pay a \$10.00 (ten dollars) charge for 120/240 hookup. This is for 50 amp and under for a six months duration. This \$10.00 charge is in addition to any current

2. Developer or owner of subdivision (shall) or (may be required) to advance to the Company an amount equal to an "estimated average cost differential," if any, between the average or representative cost of underground distribution systems in residential subdivisions and of equivalent overhead distribution systems within the utility service areas. If the amount deposited exceeds the normal charge for underground extensions, the amount in excess shall be refunded. (Over a ten year period as provided in amended PSC Rule-1-X-3.)
3. The Company will construct underground distribution facilities in the subdivision adequate to render single phase 120/240 Volt service.
4. Three phase primary mains or feeders required within a subdivision to supply local distribution or to serve individual three phase loads may be overhead unless underground is required by governmental authorities or chosen by applicant, in either of which case the differential cost of underground shall be borne by the applicant.
5. Developer or successor in title shall grant a right-of-way satisfactory to the Company for the installation, operation, and maintenance of its underground facilities.
6. For all developments that do not meet the conditions set forth in paragraph 1 above, underground distribution will be installed provided an advance to the Company is made in the amount equal to the difference between the Company's estimated cost of underground facilities and overhead facilities, which it would otherwise provide.
7. Estimated cost differential per foot of conductor for residential service \$.20 .
Estimated cost differential per foot of conductor for primary service (if applicable) \$ 1.73 .

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23. HOUSE WIRING AND INSPECTION

Standards. All wiring of consumers' establishments must conform to cooperative requirements and accepted as exemplified by the requirements of the National Electric Code, and the Uniform Electric Code prepared by Kentucky Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation. Inspections of wiring installations will be made by an inspector certified by the Kentucky Certifying Agency.

Inspections. Inspections of all permanent wiring installations which have not previously had service should be required prior the energizing. If energization is made prior to inspection, Temporary Release Form shall be signed by the owner and wiring contractor.

Additions to the consumers' wiring should be inspected, and it shall be the consumer's responsibility to report such additions to the Cooperative.

Rural Electrification Administration. This rule does not apply where temporary service is desired during the construction of any permanent building and service is to be of a temporary nature only. Any additions or alterations to an original wiring job are subject to reinspection. The Cooperative has the right to disconnect any service that shows a dangerous or unsafe condition which could cause damage to its lines or equipment, but by any such inspection, or failure to inspect or reject any wiring job, shall not render the Cooperative liable or responsible for any loss or damage resulting from defects in the installation, wiring, or appliance, or from violation of Cooperative's rules, or from accidents which may occur upon consumers' premises. Before a reconnection is made of premises disconnected for reasons of unsafe wiring conditions, a reinspection certificate from the State Electric Bureau is required. The terms of the loan contract with REA state that "Borrower shall not serve any consumer through the system until the Borrower shall have furnished evidence satisfactory to the Administration that such consumer's premises have been properly wired."

Electric Bills

24. BILLING

Notices of amounts due and payable are sent out the first of the month, for service rendered for a thirty-day period ending the twenty-second of the preceding month. Current bills are considered delinquent if not paid by the fifteenth of the month. The Cooperative may at any time thereafter, on a five-day notice to the member, discontinue service. Should it become necessary for a representative of the Cooperative to call at the consumer's premises or other locations for the purpose of collecting a delinquent account, a charge of \$5.00 will be made to the member's account for the extra service rendered, due and payable at such time delinquent account is collected. If service is discontinued for non-payment, an additional charge of \$5.00 will be made for reconnecting service, due and payable at time of such reconnection.

When a check received in payment of a consumer account is returned unpaid by a bank for any reason, such account, together with all others owed by the consumer, shall be due and payable upon demand, and such consumer subject to discontinuance of service without further notice.

25. METER READING

All meters with demand devices are read by a representative of the Cooperative.
