

**RATE RS-1
RESIDENTIAL SERVICE**

AVAILABILITY

Available in communities indicated on Sheet No. 2 of this schedule, where secondary distribution lines are adjacent to the premises to be served.

APPLICABILITY

Applicable to electric service, other than three phase service, for all domestic purposes in private residences, and single-occupancy apartments. Residences where not more than two rooms are used for rental purposes will also be included. Where multi-occupancy buildings are served through one meter this Rate will be applied on a "per residence" or "per apartment" basis. Service to the halls, basement or other common use portions of an apartment building will not be supplied under this Rate.

Where a portion of a residence unit is used for purposes of a commercial or public character, the appropriate General Service Rate is applicable to all service; provided that if the wiring is so arranged that the service for residential purposes can be metered separately, this Rate will be applied to the residential service.

TYPE OF SERVICE

Alternating current 60 cycles, single phase at Company's standard secondary voltage.

NET MONTHLY BILL

Computed in accordance with the following charges:

First 30 kilowatt hours at 3.90¢ per kilowatt hour
Next 40 kilowatt hours at 3.00¢ per kilowatt hour
Next 130 kilowatt hours at 2.10¢ per kilowatt hour
Next 550 kilowatt hours at 2.00¢ per kilowatt hour
Additional kilowatt hours at 1.50¢ per kilowatt hour

Plus or minus an amount per Kwh equal to a pro rata portion of any charge or credit to Company's cost of power in the next preceding calendar month due to the application of the fuel adjustment clause in Company's purchase power agreement. The amount of charge or credit per Kwh will be determined by dividing the total fuel adjustment billed the Company by the Kwh sales in the applicable period.

Minimum:

\$1.00

When bills are rendered less frequently than monthly, the time related units such as energy blocks, minimum of other charges, will be billed in accordance with the number of billing months in the meter reading interval.

PAYMENT

The Net Monthly Bill is payable within fourteen (14) days from date. When not so paid, the Gross Monthly Bill, which is the Net Monthly Bill plus 3%, is due and payable.

TERM OF SERVICE

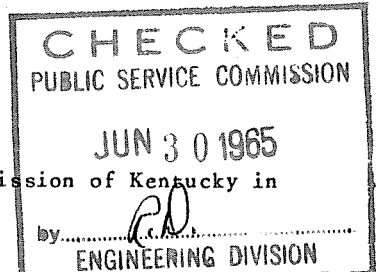
One (1) year, terminable thereafter on ten (10) days' written notice by either Customer or Company.

SERVICE REGULATIONS

The supplying of, and billing for, service and all conditions applying thereto, are subject to the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, and to Company's Service Regulations currently effective, as filed with the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, as provided by law.

RATE POL
PRIVATE OUTDOOR LIGHTING SERVICE

AVAILABILITY

Available in communities and unincorporated territory indicated on Sheet No. 2 of this schedule, where secondary distribution lines are adjacent to the premises to be served.

APPLICABILITY

Applicable to service for outdoor lighting on private property with Company-owned overhead lighting fixtures. Not applicable to service for lighting of dedicated or undedicated public thoroughfares.

TYPE OF SERVICE

All equipment will be installed, owned and maintained by the Company on rights-of-way provided by customer. Company will perform maintenance only during regular scheduled working hours and will endeavor to replace burned-out lamps within 48 hours after notification by customer. Company does not guarantee continuous lighting and shall not be liable to the customer or anyone else for any damage, loss or injury resulting from any interruption in such lighting due to any cause. All lamps will burn from dusk to dawn, approximately 4150 hours per annum.

NET MONTHLY BILL

For each lamp with luminaire and where needed, an upsweep arm not over six (6) feet in length, controlled automatically, where service is supplied from an existing pole and secondary facilities of the Company:

2500 Lumen Mercury.....\$3.25
6000 Lumen Mercury..... 4.50

Additional poles and spans of wires will be supplied at a charge of:

Each pole..... 1.00
Each span of wires..... .25

PAYMENT

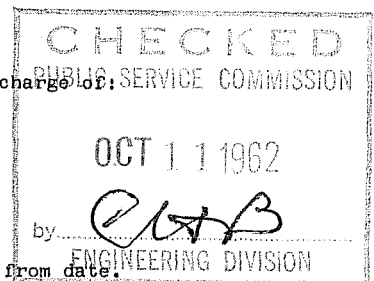
The Net Monthly bill is payable within fourteen (14) days from date. When not so paid, the Gross Monthly bill, which is the Net Monthly bill plus 5%, is due and payable.

TERM OF SERVICE

Two years, terminable thereafter in ten (10) days written notice by either Customer or Company.

SERVICE REGULATIONS

The supplying of, and billing for, service and all conditions applying thereto, are subject to the jurisdiction of The Public Service Commission of Kentucky, and to Company's Service Regulations currently effective, as filed with The Public Service Commission of Kentucky, as provided by law.



General Rules and Regulations for Gas Service

1. Application for Service.

Upon execution of an application, supplied by the Company, gas service will be furnished to the Customer at the rates and under the rules and regulations applying to the service for which application is made.

2. Equipment Furnished and Maintained by Customer—Permits.

All equipment in the premises, or connecting with the Company's service, furnished by the Customer, shall be suitable and adequate for the purpose thereof, and shall be maintained by the Customer at all times in conformity with all lawful requirements, and with the rules and regulations of the Company in force from time to time.

3. Installations by Customers—Inspection—Fees.

The piping and fittings for the conveyance of gas within any building after it has passed the meter, may be installed by any competent gas fitter employed by the customer or proprietor of the premises, subject, however, to the inspection and approval of the Company which requires an inspection and test of all pipe before being covered by plastering or flooring.

A written notice ordering inspection and test accompanied by a fee of \$1.50 must be left at the Company's office before pipes are covered with plaster or flooring. If upon investigation and test the pipe and fittings prove to be in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Company, a certificate to that effect will be given to the gas fitter which the owners should demand from the gas fitter. In case of a leak or an error, requiring a second inspection, an additional fee of \$1.50 will be charged.

4. Character of Construction—Tests.

All piping must be of copper, brass, steel or wrought iron. All T's—L's and crosses shall be of brass or malleable iron—and if iron, galvanized. No bushings are allowed, except adjacent to appliances and then only when controlled by valve or stop-cock on the live side. All the ways of all stop cocks shall be equal in area to the bore of the piping. No unions or running screws will be allowed. Instead use right and left couplings. Cement or anything of like nature is prohibited. Gas fitters are prohibited from using water for the purpose of testing or locating leaks in gas piping.

5. Character of Construction—Buildings.

No riser through which gas for any purpose is supplied to any building shall be of less size than 1 inch in diameter and all risers must be carried through interior partition and down into cellar not over two inches below joist, and shall be so located that required extensions to meter may avoid cellar openings. Risers carried up through a vestibule partition will not be approved. When run under ground pipe must be tarred or otherwise protected, subject to the approval of the Company, and be one size larger than specified in rules for house piping. Bracket outlets in halls and bath rooms must be 6 ft. 3 in. from floor and 5 ft. 6 in. in bed rooms.

6. Connections, etc.

Connections for meters must be made of iron pipe, or patented connections approved by the Company, the same size as house fittings with double swing joints at ceiling in line with outlet of meter and reduced at meter coupling. In no case shall the pipe between elbows forming swing joint, be more than 6 inches.

All such connections, including the service piping from the curb to the meter installed at the expense of the customer, shall be maintained at the expense of the customer.

All gas meters must be set on the front cellar wall of the building, the gas service pipe being brought in on a direct straight line from the gas main in the street to the meter location.

7. Traps—Drips.

All fittings and pipes must be securely fastened with straps, and be absolutely devoid of "traps". Under no circumstances will "drips" be allowed except where absolutely unavoidable, and, they must then be placed in positions easily accessible.

8. Limitation on Meter Outlets.

The supply of gas will be discontinued or will not be turned on for a customer in any flat building, apartment house, or other dwelling, in which the gas piping from the outlet of two or more meters shall be found to be connected to any single gas consuming appliance.
