The maximum amount of the adjustment so prescribed shall not produce revenue adjustments based upon the actual preceding twelve months period, greater than the difference between the purchased gas billed at the then existing rates and the purchased gas billed at the revised rate.

On and after the effective date of this rate schedule, if any increase or decrease is made in the rate at which Company's gas suppliers sell gas to Company, the unit charges of the aforesaid rate schedule shall be increased or decreased by a Purchased Gas Adjustment determined as follows:

In the event that the Company receives from its supplier a refund of amounts paid to such supplier in respect of a prior period, the Company will apply to the Commission for authority and upon receipt thereof make adjustments on the amounts charged to its customers under this provision, as follows:

INDUSTRIAL

No industrial customers will be added that are not under contract on January 1, 1972. Industrial customers presently served will not be permitted to add additional gas equipment or to utilize gas in current equipment in excess of contracted amounts. Replacement of existing equipment will be permitted with new equipment of equal or lesser Btu input capacity.

2. COMMERCIAL

No new commercial commitments to serve space heating and/or boiler loads will be made after January 1, 1972. Filed commitments will be honored for equipment in use by March 1, 1972. Applications filed prior to December 15, 1971 that contain commitments to serve equipment to be installed after March 1, will be honored if the installation of equipment is completed by September 1, 1972. Commercial base load will be accepted. Commercial base load is defined as connected commercial load used regularly during summer months. Commercial customers presently served will not be permitted to add additional gas space heating and/or boiler equipment. Replacement of existing space heating and/or boiler equipment will be permitted with new equipment of equal or lesser Btu input capacity.

3. RESIDENTIAL

There are no restrictions on residential service. All customers having an end use for gas of a strictly residential character will be considered as residential. This includes apartment houses and housing projects but would not include buildings housing transients such as hotels, motels and ED dormitories.

If the customer fails to appear at this meeting, the Company shall have the right to discontinue service to that customer until satisfactory corrective action has been taken. If, as a result of a meeting the violation cannot be reconciled, service to that customer shall be subject to termination upon 48 hours further written notice.
- 5. The Company will accept applications for service from potential customers and as gas supply becomes available, will accept new customers for service in the applicable supply areas. In accordance with Controlled Attachment Program shown on Tariff Sheet 23, customers will be accepted in chronological order based on the date and time of application, except that preference will first be given to those that can be served from the Company's existing gas system.

1. Commission's Rules and Regulations:

All gas service rendered by the Company shall be in accordance with the Kentucky Public Service Commission law and the acts, rules, regulations and forms which have been adopted by the Public Service Commission of Kentucky and all amendments thereto and modifications thereof which may be made by the Commission.

Company's Rules and Regulations:

In addition to the Rules and Regulations prescribed by the Commission, all gas service rendered shall, also, be in accordance with the following Rules and Regulations adopted by the Company, provided same do not conflict with those of the Public Service Commission.

3. Filing of Rates, Rules and Regulations:

A copy of all schedules of rates, rules and regulations under which gas service is rendered is on file for the public's benefit with the Public Service Commission of Kentucky and in the various offices of the Company.

4. Application for Service:

All applications for service shall be made on the Company's standard application or contract form which shall be signed by the customer, or his duly authorized agent, and accepted by the Company before any service is rendered.

A separate application or contract shall be made for each class of service at each separate location.

In cases where unusual construction or equipment expense is necessary to furnish the service, the Company may require a contract for a minimum period of one (1) yearing Service Commission

5. Owners Consent to Occupy:

In case the customer is not the owner of the premises or of the intervening property between the premises and the Company's service connection, it shall be the customer's responsibility to obtain from the property owner or owners the necessary consent to install and maintain in, on or over said premises all such piping and other equipment as are required or necessary for supplying gas service to the customer whether the piping and equipment be the property of the customer or the Company.

Security Deposits:

The Company may require from all customers as a guaranty or security a cash deposit equal to the estimated maximum consumption for a period of two months; minimum deposit shall be \$5.00. Such deposit less any unpaid amounts for service rendered the customer shall be returned upon the discontinuance of service.

Where the monthly bills are in excess of the deposit, or where the customer has delinquent bills, the Company may require the deposit to be increased, but such deposit shall not exceed the amount of two months' estimated maximum consumption. Interest will be paid at the rate of six per cent (6%) annually upon demand or upon return of the deposit for the period between the deposit date and the date service is discontinued. The original security deposit receipt should be presented when demand is made for payment of interest or refund of deposit.

No deposit shall be required of any receiver or trustee operating a business requiring utility service pulp derice a tomander of court.

The Company shall have the right of access to the customer's premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of installing, reading, inspecting, repairing or removing its meters, regu-

lators or other equipment used in connection with its supply of gas service or for the purpose of turning on or shutting off the gas supply when necessary and for all other proper purposes.

8. Company's Equipment and Installation:

The Company shall furnish, install and maintain at its expense the necessary service connection extending from its main to the customer's nearest curb or property line. The location of this service connection will be made at the discretion and judgment of the Company.

The Company will furnish, install and maintain at its expense the necessary meter, regulator and connections which will be located at or near the main, service connection, property line, near or in the building, at the discretion or judgment of the Company. Whenever practical, in the judgment of the Company, the location will be as near the supply main as possible and outside of buildings. Suitable site or location for the meter, regulator and connections shall be provided by the customer, and the title to this equipment shall remain in the Company, with the right to install, operate, maintain and remove same, and no charge shall be made by the customer for use of the premises as occupied or used. E.C. K. E.D. Public Service Commission

Sustomer's Equipment and Installation:

The customer shall furnish, install and natintal notes wire necessary customer's service line extending property line to the building or place of utilization of the gas.

The installation of the customer's service line shall be made in accordance with the requirement of the constituted authorities and the Company's specifications covering location, installation, kind and size of pipe, type of pipe coating or wrapping and method of connecting the joints of pipe.

9. Customer's Equipment and Installation: (continued)

The location shall be the point of easiest access to the Company from its facilities and the Company shall be consulted and its approval obtained before the installation is made.

In the installation of the service line the customer shall not install any tees or branch connection and must leave the trench open and pipe uncovered until it is examined by an inspector of the Company and shown to be free from any irregularity or defect. The customer shall not make any change in or interfere with his service line without the written consent of the Company.

In all cases where practical the customer's service line shall not be installed entering a building underground but shall be brought up out of the ground with a riser and entrance made to the building through the wall or foundation a minimum of six (6) inches above the ground.

The customer shall furnish, install and maintain at his expense the necessary housepiping, connections and appliances and it shall be the responsibility of the customer to install and maintain same in accordance with the requirements and specifications of all local, state and national codes and regulations applicable to his specific usage and occupancy.

All of the customer's service line, piping, connections and appliances shall be suitable for the purposes thereof and shall be maintained by the customer at his expense at all times in a good, safe and serviceable condition.

The Company shall not assume any responsibility and shall not be held liable in any way for the making of any periodic inspection of the customer's service line, piping, connections or appliances, or for the customer's failure to properly and safely install, operate and maintain same.

10. Metering:

The gas consumed shall be measured by a meter or meters to be installed by the Company upon the customer's premises at a point most accessible or convenient for the Company and all bills shall be calculated upon the registration of said meters or meter except as hereinafter provided. If more than one meter is installed for the same or different classes of service at different locations on the customer's premises, each meter shall be considered separately in calculating the amount of any bills. Meters include all measuring instruments and equipment.

On gas light installations, as approved by the Company, when used for outdoor lighting and the gas used in such installations is unmetered, monthly gas consumption will be calculated to be 2,000 cubic feet per month per mantle for upright mantles - and for each pair of inverted mantles.

On special models of gas lights where gas consumption is greater than those referred to above, the Company shall estimate the monthly consumption to the closest 100 cubic feet and bill customers that equal amount each month.

Such consumption shall be billed under the appropriate rate applicable to the customer.

11. Protection of Company's Property:

All meters, piping and other appliances and equipment furnished by and at the expense of the Company, which may at any time be in or on customer's premises shall, unless otherwise expressly provided herein, be and remain the property of the Company, and the customer shall protect such property from loss or damage, and no one who is not an agent of the Company shall be permitted to remove such properly to Eo D tamper with or damage same.

12. Exclusive Service:

Except in cases where the customer has a special contract with the Company for reserve or auxiliary service, no other fuel service shall be used by the customer on the same installation in conjunction with the Company's service connection, either by means of valves or any other connection.

The customer shall not sell the gas purchased from the Company to any other customer, company or person, and the customer shall not deliver gas purchased from the Company to any connection wherein said gas is to be used off of customer's premises or by persons over whom customer has no control.

Point of Delivery of Gas:

The point of delivery of gas supplied by the Company shall be at the point where the gas passes from the pipes of the Company's service connection into the customer's service line or pipe of the customer, or at the outlet of the meter, whichever is nearest the delivery main of the Company.

14. Customer's Liability:

The customer shall assume all responsibility for the gas service in or on the customer's premises at and from the point of delivery of gas and for all the piping, appliances and equipment used in connection therewith which are not the property of the Company, and will protect and save the Company harmless from all claims for injury or damage to persons or property occurring on the customer's premises or at and from the point of delivery of gas occasioned by such gas or gas service and equipment, except where said in jury por damage will be shown to have been caused solely by the innegicing engenne of the Company.

Continuous or Uniform Service:

The Company will endeavor to supply gas continuously and without interruption, however, the Company shall not be responsible in damages or otherwise for any failure to supply gas or for any interruptions of the supply when such a failure

15. Continuous or Uniform Service: (continued)

is without wilful fault or neglect on its part.

The Company cannot and does not guarantee either a suficient supply or an adequate or uniform pressure of the gas supplied and shall not be liable for any damage or loss resulting from inadequate or interrupted supply or from any pressure variations when such conditions are not due to wilful fault or neglect on its part.

16. Monthly Bills:

- (a) Bills for gas service will be rendered monthly unless otherwise specified. The term "month" for billing purposes shall mean the period between any two consecutive readings of the meter by the Company, such readings to be taken as near as practicable every thirty (30) days.
- (b) Bills are due upon rendition and shall be due and payable within a period not exceeding ten (10) days thereafter.
- (c) Service shall be subject to being discontinued if bills are not paid in full within twenty (20) days after mailing date of the original bill. If prior to discontinuance of service there is delivered to the utility or to its employee empowered to discontinue service a written certificate signed by a physician, a registered nurse or a public health officer that in the opinion of the certifier discontinuance of service will aggravate an existing illness on the affected premises, service shall not be discontinued until the affected resident can make other living arrangements or until ten (10) days elapse from the time of the utility's receipt of said certification whichever first occurs.
- (d) Failure to receive a bill does not Pelkiemprice a Commissionmer from these provisions.

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- (e) When the Company is unable to ready the meter a reasonable effort, or where the meter fails to Rolpe had to ARIFTShe customer will be billed on an estimated basis at the average

of three (3) immediately preceding months, or similar months of utilization, and the billing adjusted as necessary when the meter is read.

17. Measurement Base:

The rates of the Company are based upon gas delivered to the customer on a basis of four (4) ounces per square inch above an assumed atmospheric pressure of fourteen and four tenths (14.4) pounds per square inch, or fourteen and sixtyfive hundredths (14.65) pounds per square inch absolute pressure, at an assumed temperature of sixty (60) degrees Fahrenheit; provided, however, the Company reserves the right to correct as necessary the actual temperature to sixty (60) degrees F. basis.

All gas measured at pressures higher than the standard pressure for low pressure distribution systems shall be corrected to a pressure base of fourteen and sixty-five hundredths (14.65) pounds per square inch absolute.

Character of Service:

The Company will normally supply natural gas having a heating value of approximately one thousand (1,000) Btu per cubic foot and a specific gravity of approximately six tenths (0.6), however, when necessary to supplement the supply of natural gas, the Company reserves the right, at its discretion, to supply an interchangeable mixture of vapprized liquified petroleum gas and air, or a combination of same with natural gas.

19. Assignment of Contract:

The benefits and obligations of any service apprication or contract shall begin when the Company commences to supply gas service and shall inure to and be binding upon the successors and assigns, survivors and executors or administrators, as the case may be, of the original parties thereto,

respectively, for the full term thereof, provided, however, that no application, agreement or contract for service may be assigned or transferred without the written consent or approval of the Company.

When the gas supply has been disconnected for non-payment of bills or other violation of the Company's Rules and Regulations the service will not be restored at the same location, or connected at another location, for the same or related occupants under a different contract or name when it is evident the change of name is a subterfuge design to defraud or penalize the Company.

20. Renewal of Contract

If, upon the expiration of any service contract for a specified term, the customer continues to use the service, the contract (unless otherwise provided therein) will be automatically renewed and extended for successive periods of one year each, subject to termination at the end of any year upon thirty days written notice by either Party.

Customer's Discontinuance of Service:

Any customer desiring service discontinued or changed from one location to another shall give the Company three (3) . working days advance notice in person, by phone or in writing, provided such notice does not violate contractural obligations.

The customer shall be held responsible for all gas consumed until such notice is received by the Compan Cant the three D (3) working days time allowed to read the meter and ic serio ecommission final bill.

Company's Discontinuance of Service for Cause: & Reckmonc

The Company may refuse or discontinue service to an applicant or customer, after proper notice for failure to comply with its rules and regulations or state and municipal

rules and regulations; when a dangerous condition is found to exist on the customer's or applicant's premises; when a customer or applicant refuses or neglects to provide reasonable access to the premises; for fraudulent or illegal use of service; or for nonpayment of bills. If discontinuance is for nonpayment of bills, the customer shall be given at least ten (10) days written notice, separate from the original bill, and cut-off shall be effected not less than twenty-seven (27) days after the mailing date of the original bill unless, prior to discontinuance, a residential customer presents to the utility a written certificate, signed by a physician, registered nurse, or public health officer, that such discontinuance will aggravate an existing illness or infirmity on the affected premises, in which case discontinuance may be effected not less than thirty (30) days from the date the utility notifies the customer, in writing, of state and federal programs which may be available to aid in payment of bilis and the office to contact for such possible assistance.

When a dangerous condition is found to exist on the customer's or applicant's premises, the service shall be cut off without notice or refused, provided that the Company notify the customer or applicant immediately of the reasons for the discontinuance or refusal and the corrective action to be taken by the applicant or customer before service can be restored.

When a customer or applicant refuses or neglects to provide reasonable access to the premises for the purpose of installation, operation, meter reading, maintenance or removal of utility property the Company may discontinue or neftuse is ervice only after the customer or applicant shall have beening in mensiont least fifteen (15) days' written notice of such intention.

When the Company has discovered evidence that by fraudur lent or illegal means a customer has obtained unauthor well service or has diverted the service for unauthorized use or has obtained service without same being properly measured, the service to the customer may be discontinued without notice.

23. Reconnection Charge:

A reconnection charge will be made by the Company to cover the cost incurred in reconnecting the meter or service when (a) the customer's service has been disconnected for nonpayment of bills or for violation of the Commission's or Company's Rules or Regulations, and the customer has qualified for and requested the service to be reconnected or (b) the customer's service has been disconnected at his request and at any time subsequently within twelve (12) months is reconnected at the same or any other premises, in accordance with 807KAR 2:010, Section 10.

This Reconnection Charge to be made by the Company and paid by the customer before or at the time the service is reconnected shall be an amount as provided for in General Service Rate G-1 as approved by the Public Service Commission.

24. Refusal of Service:

The Company will not render service to any customer unless the customer's service line, housepiping, appliances and equipment are properly installed and in safe operating condition, or where the customer continually fails to comply with the Company's Rules and Regulations.

The Company will not furnish service to any applicant who owes the Company any past due bill or a delinquent account for service furnished either at the same or other location, until such indebtedness shall have been paid in full.

The Company reserves the right to refuse or to defer full service to an applicant where the existing mains are inadequate to serve the applicant's requirements without adversely affect ing the service to customers already connected and being carried.

25. Notice of Escaping Gas or Unsafe Conditions: NUV 1 9 1981

Immediate notice must be given by the customer to the content office or employees of the Company if any escaping gas or unsafe conditions are detected or any defects or improper installations are discovered in piping and equipment of either the Company or the customer which are on the customer's premises.

25. Notice of Escaping Gas or Unsafe Conditions: (continued)

No flames or lights are to be taken near any escape of gas and the gas must be shut-off at the meter cock or valve until the hazard is eliminated and the gas service is not to be turned on again except by a Company employee.

The Company will not be responsible or assume any liability for any injury, loss or damage which may arise from the carelessness or negligence of the customer or his agent or representatives.

Turning Off Gas Service and Restoring Same:

The gas service may be turned off at the meter when justified by the customer or his agent or any constituted authorities but no person, unless in the employ of the Gas Company or having permission from the Gas Company, shall turn the gas on or restore service.

Special Provisions - Large Volume Customers:

Industrial, Commercial or other Customers using large volumes of gas on a varying basis shall install and maintain at their expense adequate piping and suitable regulating and control equipment to provide reasonable and practical limitation of intermittance or fluctuation in the pressure, volume or flow of gas, and shall so regulate and control their operations and the use of gas hereunder so as not to interfere with gas service being furnished to them or to any other customers, or with the proper and accurate metering of gas at their or any other location.

28. Special Rules for Customers Served from Transmission Mains:

In addition to the Standard Rules and Requiations the following special Rules and Regulations shall apply to all D customers served directly from a high pressure transmission. main which is the property of the Company or one of its suppliers: NUV 1 9 1981

- 28. Special Rules for Customers Served from Transmission Mains:
- (a) All service connections to a high pressure transmission line shall be subject to the special requirements, consent and approval of the owner of said line. In case the connection is to a line not the property of the Company, proper approval must be obtained from both the owner and the Company.
- (b) A special form application and service contract or agreement shall be executed by the customer and approved and accepted by both the owner of the transmission line and the Company prior to the time the tap or connection is made. If the transmission line is owned by the Company only the approval and acceptance of the Company is necessary.
- (c) All meters, regulators, equipment and connections necessary to serve the customer from a high pressure transmission line shall be installed on the customer's premises at or as near the transmission line as is practical.
- (d) Suitable site or location for the equipment owned by the Company or the owner of the line shall be provided and furnished by the customer without any expense to the Company or owner of the line. The Company or owner of the line shall have the right of ingress, egress and regress to and from this location at any time without any expense or charges from the customer.
- (e) The customer's service line extending from the outlet of the meter shall be installed and maintained by the customer at his expense.
- (f) The customer shall notify the Company promptly of any leaks in the transmission line or equipment, also, of any hazards or damages to same.
- (g) Customers may be required to send in monthly meter readings to the Company on suitable forms provided to send in monthly meter provided to send in monthly meter company.

29. Curtailment Order

In cases of impairment of gas supply or partial or total interruptions and when it appears that the Company, is or will be, unable to supply the requirements of all of its customers in any system or segment thereof, the Company shall curtail gas service to its customers in the manner set forth herein:

1. Definitions

Residential - Service to customers for residential purposes including housing complexes and apartments.

Industrial - Service to customers engaged primarily in a process which creates or changes raw or unfinished materials into another form or product, including the generation of electric power for sale.

Commercial - Service to customers engaged primarily in the sale of goods or services including institutions and local and federal agencies for uses other than those involving manufacturing.

Summer Period - The seven consecutive monthly billing periods of April through October.

<u>Winter Period</u> - The five consecutive monthly billing periods of November through March.

Base Period Volumes - Monthly base period volumes shall be assigned to each customer in priorities 4, 5 and 6. These volumes shall be determined by the customer's consumption during the Base Period, April 1, 1972 through March 31, 1973, adjusted to normal temperatures where applicable, for force majeure conditions, and to annualize consumption in cases where service was initiated or abnormal conditions existed during the base period.

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Maximum Seasonal Volumes - Maximum Summer Period volumes shall be the assigned Base Period Volumes for the Summer Period; Maximum Winter Period Volumes shall be the assigned Base Period Volumes for the Winter Period.

Adjusted Seasonal Volumes - A customers maximum seasonal volumes as adjusted from time to time to reflect curtailment in accordance with the Company's priorities of curtailment.

2. Priorities of Curtailment

The Company may curtail or discontinue service in whole or in part on a daily, monthly or seasonal basis in any purchase zone in accordance with the following priorities, starting with Priority 6 and proceeding in descending numerical order.

Priority 1. Residential, and services essential to the public health where no alternate fuel exists.

Priority 2. Small commercials (less than 50 mcf per day).

Priority 3. Large commercials (over 50 mcf per day) not included under lower priorities.

Priority 4. Industrials served under General Service Rate G-1.

Priority 5. Customers served under Large Volume Rate G-2, other than boilers included in Priority 6. In curtailing for daily peak shaving purposes, customers historically on an interruptible rate shall be curtailed prior to customers historically on a high priority rate.

Priority 6. Boiler loads shall be curtafiled in Ethe Public Service Commission

(a). Boilers over 3,000 mcf per day.

Priority 6. (continued)

- (b). Boilers between 1,500 mcf and 3,000 mcf per day
- (c). Boilers between 300 mcf and 1,500 mcf per day

3. Penalties

If, at the end of any seasonal period, a Buyer exceeds its Adjusted Seasonal Volumes for that period, the Buyer shall pay a penalty of \$15 per mcf for all volumes taken in excess of 102% of its adjusted seasonal volume, such penalty to be in addition to the regular applicable rate but no such penalty shall be payable for any season in which the excess volume is less than 100 mcf. The Company, at its sole discretion, may reduce the Buyer's Adjusted Seasonal Volume in the succeeding seasonal period by an amount equal to the excess volume taken. The payment of penalty charges shall not be considered as giving any customer the right to take unauthorized volumes of gas, nor shall such penalty charges be considered as a substitute for any other remedy available to the Company.

4. Additional Curtailments

In addition to the above described monthly and seasonal curtailment provisions, the daily interruptible provisions contained in the gas tariffs of the Company, shall remain in full force and effect.

5. Discontinuance of Service

The Company shall have the right, after reasoned on notice to discontinue the gas supply of any cusus mention fails to comply with a valid curtailment order.

Distribution Main Extensions:

The Company will extend without charge its existing distribution mains one hundred (100) feet for any one customer provided the existing mains are of sufficient capacity to properly supply the additional customers and provided that the

customer contracts to use gas on a continuous basis for one (1) year or more, and, provided, the potential consumption and revenue will be of such amount and permanency as to warrant the capital expenditures involved and to make the investment economically feasible.

Whenever an extension exceeds one hundred (100) feet per customer, the Company will enter into an agreement with the customer or subscriber which will provide for such additional extension on a cost per foot basis, with the amount to be deposited by the customer or subscriber, and for a proportionate and equitable refund in the event other customers are connected to the extension within ten (10) years. Any further or lateral extension shall be treated as a new and separate extension. Refunds shall be made only after the customer has used gas service for a minimum continuous period of one (1) year. The Company reserves the right to determine the length of the extension and to specify the pipe size and location of the extension. All extensions will be made dependent on the economic feasibility of the extension. Title to all extensions covered by agreements shall be and remain in the Company and in no case shall the amount of the refunds exceed the original deposit.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as to prohibit the Company from making at its expense greater extensions to its distribution mains or the granting of more favorable terms than herein prescribed, should its judgment so dictate, provided like extensions are made for other customers, or subscribers, under similar conditions of commission

31. No Exception to Rules and Regulations:

No agent, representative or employee of the TCompany Shall make any promise, agreement or representation, not incorporated in or provided for by the Rules and Regulations of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky or of this Company and neither has any agent, representative or employee of the Company any right or power to amend, modify, alter or waive any of the

32. Rules and Regulations May Be Amended:

The Company reserves the right to amend or modify its Rules and Regulations or to adopt such additional Rules and Regulations as the Company deems necessary in the proper conduct of its business, subject to the approval of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky.

33. Supersede Previous Rules and Regulations:

These Rules and Regulations or Terms and Conditions of Service replace and supersede all previous Rules and regulations or Terms and Conditions under which the Company has previously supplied gas service.

34. Budget Payment Plan Availability:

The Company has a budget plan available for the convenience of its residential customers. The plan is designed to help equalize payment for gas service over a period of months, normally May through April. However, a residential customer may elect to enter the plan at any time during the year. On the last month of the budget payment period (April), appropriate adjustments shall be made relative to any difference in the customer's total payments and actual usage billing amounts. Any resultant overpayment shall be refunded on the April bill. Any resultant underpayment shall appear on the April bill and be due with the payment of such bill. The customer's account will be reviewed periodically and the monthly payment amount may be adjusted during the budget period.

To be accepted as a budget customer, the account balance must be paid in total before the customer is put on budget billing. It is understood that this budget billing plan will continue until the customer notifies the Companylic property or by telephone to discontinue the plan or the customer defaults in payment of such plan.
