WATER

Water is supplied to individual lots by means of a central system supplied from two wells located in the Subdivision. water system has been completed with the exception of the extension of water lines in front of certain of the lots located within the Subdivision. Water is presently available in front of each of the individual lots in Units 1, 1D, 2, 3, 4 and 101 and in front of some of the individual lots in Units 10, 11, 12 and 14. We will be the supplier of water for the central system. Our address is:

WE MAY CONSTRUCT WATER LINES TO EXTEND IN FRONT OF EACH OF THE LOTS IN UNITS 5 THROUGH 15 AND 102; HOWEVER, WE ARE NOT CONTRACTUALLY OBLIGATED TO CONSTRUCT WATER LINES IN FRONT OF THOSE LOTS. IF WE DO NOT BUILD THE WATER LINES, YOU MAY BE UNABLE TO USE YOUR ALSO, THE VALUE OF YOUR LOT MAY BE ADVERSELY YOU SHOULD CAREFULLY CONSIDER YOUR DECISION TO PURCHASE A LOT IF IT IS BASED ON THE POSSIBLE CONSTRUCTION OF FUTURE WATER LINES IN THE SUBDIVISION.

. A hydrological survey has been performed which indicates that the capacity of the central system is estimated to be sufficient to supply adequate water for the anticipated population of the Subdivision. We presently use private wells to supply water to lots located in the Subdivision. Two wells have been drilled to a depth of 125 feet and are estimated to be able to produce 600 gallons of water per minute. Should this method of providing water prove to be inadequate at any time in the future, we propose to make water available from the Kentucky River. Such use would be subject to the consent of the United States Corps of Engineers and approval by the Kentucky and Owen County Departments of Health.

The water from the two wells is periodically tested by the Kentucky Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Protection. The results have shown that the water from these wells presently meets the requisite standards for a public water supply. supply. JUN 2 8 1982

If we construct water lines to extend in front of each of those lots in Units 5 through 15 and 102, in front of which water lines have not yet been extended, we may pay the cost of laying those lines. However, we are not contractually obligated to do so. You will be required to pay for the cost of tying into the main line in front of your lot. At the present time, such cost is not expected to exceed \$150.00; however, the Developer reserves the right to alter such amount should the cost of tying into a main line increase or decrease. You will also be required to pay for the water pipe connecting the water meter box to a faucet.

You will be required to connect to the central water system when a residential structure is constructed on your lot. Lot owners will not be permitted to use other sources of water supply.

The central water system may at a date in the future be transferred by sale or gift to the Owner's Association for operation and upkeep. No plans have been formulated as to when or if such transfer may take place or whether such facility will be conveyed to the Owner's Association free and clear of any encumbrances.

The operation of the water system is currently regulated by the Kentucky Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Protection. This public authority periodically tests the water being supplied to your lot to be certain that it is potable. The rates charged for water usage are subject to the approval of the Kentucky Public Service Commission.
